[M. Mosbey] Hi, I'm Mitch Mosbey, your host for the April 14th edition of IUPUI's The Spot.

Winning the women's platform at the NCAA Swimming and Diving Championships, sophomore, Chen Ni, became the first IUPUI athlete to win an NCAA championship in IUPUI athletics history. We spoke with diver Chen Ni about her accomplishment.

[C. Ni] At the beginning when I start my diving experience, my coach telling me you can be a good platform diver, I kind of, all the confidence because I'm not pretty sure. Can I do that, cause that too high? I see now, I'm afraid about heights.

In thinking about my dives, I go through my correction again, and I see the audience, kind of, not platform at all, as like a stage. Actually, for platform, especially for women platform, I always believe everyone, all divers who made top eight on finals, they all have a chance to win, but the point is if you do your good dive, like do your best, then you can win, so the point is that psychology, for my personal thinking, I think like psychology more than your technique at that time.

Currently, I work in the pervasive technology institutes advanced visualization lab, which was previously known as UITS. We, in the advanced visualization lab, are focusing on anything to do with visualization, whether it be really low level computing, taking data and turning it into a visualization up to doing stereoscopic video, where you're taking an event or creative activity or even sports and filming it in 3-D for the purposes of review later.

So, my advice for an undergrad is, you know, this is the time to build on your passion. This is the time to find your passion. This is the time to find yourself really, so you find out what you like and define that.

What excites you to the point where you're like almost physically affected by it? It's a good uneasy, and that's what my advice is, is to really find that passion because that's pretty much the key to get out of any stagnant environment that you have mentally.
