Exceptionally well-qualified D1 Class of 2026

Welcome to the DDS Class of 2026! Our highly selective program accepted 103 students from 1,126 applicants, a selectivity of fewer than 10%. This class has 74 Indiana residents and 29 from out of state.

After holistic review of multiple factors and qualifications, our students' quantitative scores were higher than the national average: DAT academic average was 20.7 (national average is 19) and GPA was 3.6 (national average is 3.55).

30TH ANNIVERSARY OF RESEARCH DAY

Remembering Dr. Stookey

CENTER OF OUR UNIVERSE

In her first week as the newly inducted 19th president of Indiana University,
Dr. Pamela Whitten stated her vision: "At IU, students are the center
of our universe. Everything we do, every decision we make,
we're going to ask, how does this benefit students?"

At IU School of Dentistry, we are aligned with the president's guiding principle. As a dental educator and administrator, Dean Murdoch-Kinch's focus has long been the well-being and success of dental students. With an extensive background in student-centered education and innovation before becoming IUSD dean, she is creating a

culture of well-being to ensure our students, faculty, and staff are healthy – a necessary factor for academic and professional success. "Our people are the foundation of all of our strategic planning," Dean Murdoch-Kinch said. "Their well-being and professional success guide all of our decision making moving forward."

AN ANXIOUS GENERATION

The dean's initiative comes at a critical time. Even before the loss and disruptions caused by COVID-19, college counseling centers across the nation have been busting at the seams. As soon as counseling appointments open up, they are filled. In 2021, U.S. Surgeon General Dr. Vivek Murthy issued a public health advisory addressing what he termed the "youth mental health crisis" heightened by the pandemic.

Why is this generation so stressed and anxious? The data implicate excessive time on social media and streaming (and associated lack of physical activity, especially outdoors), climate change, the global pandemic, and financial debt.

At dental schools, a study published in the Journal of Dental Education showed DDS students are more anxious or depressed than their peers, with the exception of medical students, who are about equal. In the first multi-institutional study to investigate depression in U.S. dental schools, researchers found a high prevalence of major depressive symptoms among DDS students.² Tests and grades, limited time for relaxation, and extraordinary debt are among the risk factors. Dental students report higher levels of anxiety, depression, obsessive-compulsive disorders, and interpersonal sensitivity than the general population and age-matched students in other fields of study.³

"Dental school has always been a stressful experience that pushes students to their limits. After all, in four short years, a lay person is transformed into a doctor, ready for independent practice," Dean Murdoch-Kinch said. "The current generation in dental school and those who follow them are different from prior cohorts in many ways. Our students are extraordinary people – intelligent, compassionate, hardworking, sensitive, and idealistic. And yet the data show this age group is more anxious than previous generations. Many of us alumni also felt anxiety, depression, and even despair in dental school, but until the last 10 to 15 years, we didn't talk about it, and student support services were not a priority. Today there is much less stigma around mental health challenges. Our students know that support services exist that can help them cope

with day-to-day life and with the stressors of dental school, and they expect to avail themselves of these services."

The data also show there is an inverse relationship between depression and well-being, and that steps to improve student well-being led to significant drops in major depressive symptoms.¹ In this study in the Journal of Dental Education, the well-being model emphasizes five lifestyle variables: career meaning or purpose, social support and friendships, financial security, physical activity, and community belonging. At IUSD, we are addressing all of these areas in our services and programs for student academic and personal support.

STUDENT SUCCESS STARTS EARLY

The dental school experience begins before admission to dental school. For some, it begins in middle school and high school, where our dental school staff reach out to encourage and support a pipeline of students interested in STEM careers. Dean Murdoch-Kinch has charged our admissions team to create an evidence-based, holistic admissions process to select students best prepared to successfully complete dental school and provide compassionate, ethical, and highly skilled oral health care for all people. In the holistic admissions process, traditional admissions criteria and metrics are enhanced by a holistic review of the entirety of a student's record and past experiences. Recruiting, admitting, and matriculating the best talent is the goal; both cognitive and non-cognitive factors are taken into consideration.

During their first semester, in addition to foundational courses in head and neck anatomy and ethics and professionalism, we also provide training in study skills,

time management, and strategies for success in dental school. Each D1 meets with financial counselor Jason Webster to review their debt and create a budget.

As director of student wellness, I teach D1s sciencebased mind-body tools for stress management, such as conscious breathing practices, meditation, and yoga, which quiet the nervous system and activate the prefrontal cortex and higher centers of learning and comprehension.

The Office of Student Affairs and Admissions is committed to being a positive part of the students' universe at IUSD. The team has expanded recently to fulfill the vision of Dean Murdoch-Kinch to bolster student-centered learning and a sense of community. Among those new to IUSD is Associate Dean for Student Affairs and Admission, Dr. Sylvia Frazier-Bowers, who is also the chief diversity officer and professor in Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics. The intentional combination of a dean of student affairs and admissions, with the vantage point of inclusive practices, ensures that the entire team works in orchestration to create a welcoming experience for each student.

Dr. Joan Kowolik, director of admissions, and Stacy Brown, associate director, continue to enhance the IUSD admission experience through multiple information sessions and orientation opportunities for applicants and incoming students.

Dean Murdoch-Kinch has expanded the Office of Student Affairs and Admissions to meet the demands of our evolving universe. Dareen Generoso, the school's first case manager, has joined the team to provide student support through coaching and making referrals to address student needs around mental health and wellness. In his new role as assistant director of student services, Andrew Miller provides steadfast student support to IUSD student organizations, including serving as a connector for oncampus resources and knowledgeable liaison for schoolwide events and activities. Martha Marshall, director of student services, rounds out the Student Affairs team and advocates for all IUSD students. She works directly with faculty to identify students who may need other support and coaches and supports students returning to IUSD after an extended leave. Any student visiting the Student Services suite is met with greetings and can help themselves to a snack or hot beverage.

The entire student services team works in concert with the Office of Diversity, Equity, Inclusion, and Belonging (DEIB) to achieve a community centered around cocreation, where everyone has a voice. In fact, the Office of DEIB has become the center of belonging at the dental school. It is common for students to stop in for connection,

shared experiences, and networking. The team includes Jennifer Burnett, director; Sydney Reynoso, associate director; and Aijah Isaacs, program manager. Collectively, the DEIB team offers support through advocacy and maintaining a safe place for students, staff, and faculty.

GRASSROOTS STUDENT WELLNESS COALITION LEADS THE WAY

In developing IUSD's student wellness program, we determined that connection – peer to peer, teacher to learner, and alumni to learner – was one of the most important determinants in student well-being. Our goal has been to create numerous touchpoints for connection along the continuum of their training, especially through mentorship. The first level of mentoring we developed was student-to-student. During their first days of dental school, each D1 is matched with a "Dental Bud," a D2 or D3 who shows them the ropes of dental school life.

We also created a peer-to-peer support community the students named "Hoosier Helpers." About 25 self-selected D3s and D4s receive six hours of peer mentor training from IUPUI's Counseling and Psychological Services on topics such as suicide prevention, alcohol and other drugs, reflective listening, mental health referrals, and interpersonal violence prevention. On evenings before big lab projects are due for D1s and D2s, the Hoosier Helpers circulate through the labs and offer support. When the lab students are ready for a break, a spread of healthy food awaits them in the cantina, thanks to a \$5,000 grant from the Indiana Dental Association (IDA) Foundation.

The D₃ and D₄ Hoosier Helpers also wear nametags signifying they are Hoosier Helpers and available for D₁s and D₂s to approach for support.

IU-ASDA and the Student Wellness Coalition just launched clinic "houses," a large vertical mentoring endeavor in which clinic groups are divided into six houses, each with their own unique name and crest. On Oct. 13, 2022, the D1s were initiated into their houses during a fun and enthusiastic ceremony in the dental school courtyard (think Harry Potter and the sorting hat).

"Our goal here, as a community, is to never let anyone feel unsupported, as exams, projects, and patients start to overwhelm us," said D4 Parker Groom, wellness chair for IU-ASDA. "We want to make sure everyone feels like they belong, as imposter syndrome has affected each of us in some way or another. And we never want to let anyone fall through the cracks, because for some of us, life outside of school can be just as tough, if not more so, than what happens at school."

The second level of mentoring is the Faculty Guides program, led by the Office of Faculty Affairs. In this informal program, a faculty guide is a faculty member who serves as a friendly point of contact to mentor D1 students. They are an empathetic, supportive touchpoint for students to ask questions and share concerns, and they help make connections in school and the profession.

The third level of mentoring is by alumni. Under 2021-2022 President Steve Hollar, the IDA created "Mentor Me," in which IDA members reach out and mentor third- and fourth-year dental students via text. IDA members also show up at the Hoosier Helper mentoring events to share their experience, strength, and hope with dental students. Our goal is to expand mentoring through the United States and internationally, so our students can connect with IUSD alumni mentors wherever they plan to practice.

A BUILDING THAT SUPPORTS WELL-BEING

A number of building renovation projects are underway to support student well-being and professional success.

During the COVID pandemic, the dental school renovated three spaces on the fourth floor, turning them into wellness rooms. These private spaces support wellness in several ways: they are plumbed and furnished to serve as lactation rooms for mothers or as private prayer/meditation rooms for any student who needs quiet and rest.

Remember Clinics A, B, and C in the original third floor north building, with the beautiful floor-to-ceiling windows overlooking Michigan Street? That space has largely been vacated since the Fritts Clinical Center opened in 2018. Beginning in 2023, however, the dental school, with support from alumni and donors, will renovate the iconic space into a Student Commons, replete with modern, comfortable furniture and fixtures for students to eat, relax, and study together in the great room or in an adjacent multi-purpose conference room. Expected completion is 2025. (Please reach out to John Hoffman, assistant dean of development at johoffma@iu.edu if you would like to contribute to this exciting creation of a student commons.)

Until recently, other than a couple of vending machines in the basement, the dental school has been a food, and coffee, desert. Dean Murdoch-Kinch procured a "Farmer's Fridge," a vending machine full of healthy salads and snacks. However, that stop gap soon will be replaced by an on-site café. No longer will the IUSD community – nor our patients – need to go elsewhere to find food or beverages.

A HUMANISTIC ENVIRONMENT FOR ALL

Dean Murdoch-Kinch is focused beyond the well-being of students; the health of our faculty and staff also is paramount.

To help alleviate stress, I facilitate a weekly "Monday Mindfulness" drop-in session on Zoom for anyone at IU to relax and de-stress for 30 minutes over the lunch hour. On Thursdays after classes and clinic, we host a yoga class at the dental school. Mabel, the emotional support dog, visits every other week for hugs and petting.

"Many of us came out of COVID more or less traumatized," Dean Murdoch-Kinch said. "There was so much personal loss of family and friends, isolation, financial uncertainty, and major disruptions to our lives. We want to ensure our faculty and staff have the resources they need to heal personally and thrive professionally."

Dr. Anthony Palatta, a dentist, dental educator, certified executive coach, and consultant, has conducted a thorough focus-group based study of the climate of the dental school through the lens of "personal well-being at work." He is coaching faculty, staff, and students to create strategies that will build and sustain IUSD's culture of well-being. Dr. Palatta was chief learning officer at the American Dental Education Association and assistant dean for student affairs and academic support at New York University College of Dental Medicine.

"We are championing a humanistic learning environment to support the well-being of our students,

faculty, staff, and, ultimately, our patients," said Dean Murdoch-Kinch. "Our commitment to excellence in education, patient care, research, and service requires us to live our values. To be compassionate health care providers we must first be compassionate with ourselves. Providing tools to support the health and well-being of our oral health care workforce is essential for us to meet the needs of the public we serve as a profession."

IUSD LAUNCHES COMPREHENSIVE, INTERDISCIPLINARY TMJ INSTITUTE

Indiana University School of Dentistry has launched a new TMJ Institute on the IUPUI campus under the direction of Dr. Shaun Matthews. The first of its kind in the United States, the TMJ Institute is a multidisciplinary, collaborative clinic designed to support the management of patients with chronic or otherwise challenging conditions of the temporomandibular joint (TMJ).

First pioneered in Great Britain by
Dr. Matthews, this new concept
in collaborative TMJ patient care
integrates professionals from multiple
disciplines, including oral and
maxillofacial surgery (OMFS),
orofacial pain, physical therapy,
general dentistry, social work, and
psychiatry, as well as consultation
from orthodontics and prosthodontics.
This diversity of expertise allows
the institute to offer a customized,
interprofessional consensus to patient
care, Dr. Matthews said.

"We have created a true, multidisciplinary model that is both innovative and unique," he continued. "The IUSD TMJ Institute offers a 'one-stop shop' for patients referred to the Institute with intractable TMJ symptoms. The collaborative approach creates a better understanding of a patient's pathology and enables TMJ patients to feel more valued by playing an active role in their own treatment planning process."

The TMJ Institute expands beyond direct patient care by engaging in innovative research to ensure treatments are current and evidence based. These best practices and new developments inform student learning in the predoctoral DDS program, OMFS residency, and continuing education for dentists and other health care professionals.

A SPECTRUM OF TMJ TREATMENT OPTIONS

When designing a treatment plan, the collaborative team considers the spectrum of care, from non-surgical options, such as joint massage, orthotic appliances, and medical management; to minimally invasive procedures, such as arthrocentesis and arthroscopy; up to maximally invasive, including formal open joint procedures or jaw joint replacement surgery.

"As a surgeon, I recognize that surgical intervention should always

come at the end of the road, not the beginning," Dr. Matthews said. "A small cohort of patients who don't respond to non-surgical, conservative treatment may go on to have some form of surgery, but our goal is to start with the least invasive interventions first."

Patient JoAnn Sanders has experienced tremendous TMJ pain relief with non-surgical procedures, including therapeutic massage and wearing an orthotic bite splint device. The IndyGo bus driver said her jaw pain began at about age 16 after receiving an anesthetic block during dental treatment. She felt something tear during the procedure and experienced searing pain in her jaws. From that point on, she had limited jaw opening, a chronic earache without infection, and pain across the left side of her face. "My cousin pinched my cheeks once, and I just sobbed in pain," she said.

Her general dentist referred her

to the TMJ Institute, where she met the whole team in one visit. The treatment plan began with therapeutic soft tissue massage by physical therapist Deepak Savanur, who manipulated Sanders' jaw internally. Sanders performs the self-massage and other exercises at home. Dr. Jeff Steele, faculty in Comprehensive Care and General Dentistry, made an appliance to prevent jaw clenching at night. The Institute social worker, Shelby Funk, ensured Sanders' insurance would cover treatment.

After three months of treatment, Sanders' jaw opening increased from 30 to 37 millimeters. She can move her jaw an additional eight millimeters from left to right. She is pain free for the first time in almost 40 years.

"Shortly after I began treatment, I ate a steak at Texas Roadhouse," she said. "It's been a long time since I enjoyed a steak."

Patient Andre Waddell's treatment plan has been more extensive. After paying for orthodontics for three of his 10 children, Waddell felt it was time to care more for his own health. "I really emphasized oral health in my children because I had bad experiences with my teeth as a kid," Waddell said.

During periods of his youth, his

family experienced homelessness. Oral health and nutrition were low priorities. "We lived in Charleston, South Carolina, and the cheapest way to treat a kid on Medicaid was to pull their teeth," Waddell said. He estimates he had seven or eight teeth pulled, and that's when his jaw problems began.

"Every day I would wake up with a stiff jaw and pain that would radiate into my head, followed by ringing in my ears and jaw clicking," Waddell said. Despite the pain, Waddell earned bachelor's and master's degrees and is a managed care administrator in South Bend, Indiana. Today, his passion is helping indigent and underserved families who are dependent on social services.

Waddell's insurance policy led him to Dr. Matthews and the TMJ Institute. "I've spent a lot of years terribly anxious to go to the dentist, and I made my problems worse by avoiding care," he said. "I love the integrated team approach. I have to tell you, as a person of color, it was a big relief finding a dentist and surgeon who looked like me."

At his first visit, Waddell met with six interprofessional providers, who reviewed and discussed his case together and presented a treatment plan. The first step was orthodontic treatment with braces to correct an underbite and malocclusion. The

second step will be prosthodontics for the placement of dental implants. Finally, Dr. Matthews will perform jaw deformity surgery to break and realign his jaw to achieve the optimal bite. The comprehensive treatment plan will take about two years.

"My goals are to have no headaches and to be able to smile. A few months into treatment, I already feel better," he said. "I've spent three-quarters of my life tending to my children's needs. Thanks to Dr. Matthews and the TMJ Institute team, I can now take care of my own."

FACULTY AWARDED LARGE FEDERAL RESEARCH GRANTS

The National Institutes of Health and Health Resources and Services Administration have awarded IUSD faculty researchers major federal grants, providing millions of dollars of sustained funding for their research programs.

Dr. Thankam Thyvalikakath,

director of the IUSD and Regenstrief Institute Dental Informatics program and research scientist in the Center for Biomedical Informatics at Regenstrief Institute, was awarded a five-year R01 grant to develop and evaluate patient medical summaries from a health information exchange to improve dental care.

Dr. Angela Bruzzaniti, director of dental student research at IUSD, received a five-year R01 grant to study the effects of an enzyme named Pyk2 in controlling bone mass using specialized animal models and in vitro studies. Dr. Bruzzaniti will investigate whether inhibition of Pyk2 can both promote bone growth and prevent bone loss.

Dr. Hakan Turkkahraman, a full-time faculty member in the

Department of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics, is co-investigator of a five-year R01 grant to study the optimal dose of intermittent vibrational force superimposed on an orthodontic load system to create the best accelerative effects on a tooth's movement. He is collaborating with principal investigator Dr. Jie Chen from Purdue School of Engineering & Technology. The goal of this new technology, once validated, will allow the design of novel tools for orthodontists to significantly reduce treatment time and side effects.

Dr. Anubhuti Shukla, director of Community-Based Dental Education, was awarded a five-year Health Resources Service Administration grant to address oral health disparities for underserved populations that suffer most from oral health inequities in the

dental professional shortage areas in Indiana. She also recently received a two-year R21 NIH grant to study antiracism in community-based dental education and to train an oral health care workforce that can treat diverse communities, including people with disabilities.

The Health Resources Service Administration also awarded a fiveyear career development grant to **Dr.** Allison Scully, director of predoctoral pediatrics. Additionally, she received a community mini grant from Delta Dental Foundation to assist families who cannot pay for their child's dental treatment in the Pediatric Clinic and the 2021-2022 Jeffrey A. Dean/ American Board of Pediatric Dentistry Research Fellowship.

This was followed by the ADA's Norton Ross Award, which recognizes an individual who has made significant contributions in clinical investigations that have advanced the diagnosis, treatment, and/or prevention of craniofacial-oral-dental diseases.

A graduate of Case Western Reserve University School of Dentistry, Dr. Zunt completed her advanced training residency program and Master of Science in Oral Pathology at IUSD in 1980 and subsequently joined the faculty full time. Dr. Zunt is a fellow of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology and a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology. She was president of the American Academy of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology in 2009-2010 and president of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Radiology in 2019-2020.

A tenured professor, Dr. Zunt became chair of the Department of Oral Pathology, Medicine, and Radiology in 2002. Her research interests have focused on the oral manifestations of disease, oral cancer, and salivary gland dysfunction.

"Dr. Zunt has been a role model for aspiring women faculty and paved the way for others to assume leadership roles within the school and beyond," retired Professor Gail Williamson said. "A consummate educator, Dr. Zunt has made significant contributions to the department, school, and to her discipline, earning her emeritus status from Indiana University. It was a pleasure to work with her and witness her success."

While retiring from academic service, Dr. Zunt volunteers parttime in IUSD's Diagnostic Surgical Pathology Biopsy Service and the Dental Faculty Practice. "Dr. Zunt has been an exemplary leader throughout her more than 40year career at Indiana University, and a tireless, strong, resolute, compassionate, and generous advocate for faculty and staff in her department, her students, and the specialty of oral and maxillofacial pathology." said Dr. Paul Edwards, Dr. Zunt's successor as department chair.

Dr. Charles Willis Gish (DDS'49, MSD'60), professor emeritus, Preventive Dentistry, passed away on Jan. 24, 2022. Dr. Gish was highly regarded for his outstanding work in public health, academia, and clinical dental research.

Dr. Gish's accomplishments in public health were substantial and achieved through his tireless efforts

in several leadership roles, both as a faculty member and department chair at IUSD from the mid-1950s to 1987, and as the director of the Division of Dental Health of the Indiana State Board of Health for more than two decades. Dr. Gish was a proud alumnus and a generous supporter of IUSD. Lecture hall 114 is named after him in recognition of his great impact on the school.

"After receiving his DDS degree with honors in 1949, Dr. Gish began a distinguished career in public service that became a life dedicated to improving the oral health of the children of Indiana," said Dean Carol Anne Murdoch-Kinch.

Dr. Gish's clinical research brought him much acclaim. He participated in the early Crest studies, where his analysis was instrumental in developing a preventive dentifrice. Dr. Gish and a colleague later developed this product into a self-applied fluoride dentifrice in the late 1960s and early 1970s.

Under his guidance, Indiana became known for its robust water fluoridation programs. By the mid-1980s, 93 percent of all Indiana residents with public water had access to fluoridated water. He implemented school water fluoridation units in rural communities where community water fluoridation was not available. He also directed a mobile dental clinic that traveled the state to provide examinations and treatments to school-aged children.

Dr. Gish authored many articles published in regional, state, and national journals. He was the president of the Association of State and Territorial Dental Directors (ASTDD) and American Association of Public Health Dentists, now known as the American Association of Public Health Dentistry (AAPHD). He received numerous awards, including Outstanding Achievement Award from ASTDD, Distinguished Service Award from AAPHD, Tony and Mary Hulman Health Award for achievements in preventive medicine through the Indiana Public Health Foundation, Indiana Dental Association Maynard K. Hine Award, John W. Knutson Distinguished Service Award in Dental Public Health, and Sagamore of the Wabash from Indiana Governor Orr.

An avid mushroom hunter, Dr. Gish would freely tell you how to find morels but would jealously guard any information about where to find them.



Dr. Mark Kendra (DDS '82), an active member of the IUSD Board of Advisors and Alumni Association, died Dec. 28, 2021. A member of the fundraising committee for the new clinical building, Dr. Kendra was an early supporter to build the James J. Fritts,

DDS Clinical Care Center.

After dental school, Dr. Kendra started his practice in downtown Highland, Indiana, where his daughters, Drs. Marisa and Taylor Kendra, both 2015 DDS graduates, practice today.

"Dr. Kendra was a devoted alumnus of IU School of Dentistry," said John Hoffman, assistant dean of development. "His dedication to IUSD was shown in both word and deed. His service and input to our Alumni Board and Building Steering Committee were invaluable and greatly welcomed. He and his wife Sheryl's personal philanthropy to IUSD will always be appreciated."

Dr. Kendra is survived by his wife Sheryl (DH '81), daughters Marisa and Taylor, and son Austen.



Dr. Daniel Laskin (DDS'47), a legend in oral and maxillofacial surgery (OMFS), died Dec 8, 2021. Dr. Laskin was renowned worldwide for his academic pursuits in oral and maxillofacial surgery, especially for creating the modern understanding and

treatment of temporomandibular joint diseases. He authored numerous textbooks and made more than 900 contributions to scientific literature. He also gave countless lectures on oral and maxillofacial surgery internationally. His 30 years as editor-inchief of the Journal of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery advanced knowledge throughout the specialty.

After earning his DDS at IUSD in 1947, Dr. Laskin received a Master of Science degree from the University of Illinois Chicago College of Dentistry. From 1950 to 1983, he served in numerous teaching, research, and leadership positions at the University of Illinois Chicago, including as OMSF department chair. He then led the OMFS Department at Virginia Commonwealth University School of Dentistry from 1983 to 2002. Indiana University bestowed him with an honorary Doctor of Science Degree in 2001.

In 2007, a large gift from Dr. Laskin established the annual Dr. Daniel Laskin Professional Ethics Lectureship at IUSD, which

provides continuing education by highly regarded speakers on ethical practice in dentistry.

"Dr. Laskin's personal and professional lives were concordant, and together they inspired others to live and practice ethically," said Dr. Lawrence Garetto, IUSD professor emeritus and clinical ethicist. "There is no better legacy for the enduring, quiet celebrity of Daniel Laskin than the continuing impact of his professional commitment on those who will follow."

While Dr. Laskin made many important contributions to the field of dentistry in his multifaceted career, he said especially enjoyed his role as teacher. "If you leave a mark in the field, it's in the people you teach," he said. "They remember you and pass on the torch."

Dr. George Stookey (AB '57, MSD '62, PhD Preventive Dent'71), a global legend in the field of preventive dentistry and cariology, died on Jan. 5, 2022. He was 87.

Throughout Dr. Stookey's distinguished career, his innovation, creativity, scholastic achievements, and mentorship of junior researchers significantly

improved oral health across the globe and enhanced the scholarly mission and reputation of IUSD.

Dr. Stookey was born in Indiana and remained a Hoosier throughout his life. His early years on a farm prepared him for a disciplined and industrious life. Dr. Stookey received all his degrees from Indiana University. His career in dental research began at IU Bloomington in 1957. Freshly graduated from IU's baccalaureate chemistry program and in search of a summer job, he worked in the lab of Dr. Joseph Muhler, whose research with IU chemistry professors Drs. Harry Day and William Nebergall was on the cusp of developing the first successful stannous fluoride formula for caries prevention. This formula became the tooth decay preventing agent in Crest toothpaste. What began as fluoride analysis in Dr. Muhler's lab for \$1 an hour became a lifelong intellectual curiosity about fluoride and caries diagnostics.

During his academic career at IUSD, Dr. Stookey held 17 IU academic and administrative positions, including acting dean, executive associate dean, and associate dean of the school's research mission. In 1981, Dr. Stookey became director of IUSD's Oral Health Research Institute (OHRI) – IUSD's research facility created in 1968 with patent royalties from the sale of Crest toothpaste. Under his leadership, OHRI earned its reputation as a global innovator and leader in preventive dentistry research and oral health care product testing.

Over a six-decade career, Dr. Stookey produced more than 300 publications in professional journals, presented at more than 400 scientific meetings, garnered about \$20 million in grants and contracts, held 20 U.S. and foreign patents, and contributed to numerous textbooks and reference books. Mentoring, training, and inspiring the careers of many young academic researchers also defined Dr. Stookey's legacy.

"Dr. Stookey was a giant in the field of cariology," said Dr. Angeles Martínez Mier, IUSD associate dean of global engagement and chair of the Department of Public Health. "Many of his studies on caries prevention and fluoride metabolism were seminal. The team he led brought distinction to Indiana as one of the cariology powerhouses in the world. Yet, I believe his greatest legacy was the young scientists he mentored. Under his leadership, Indiana became a fertile environment for young talent. A quick glance at the leaders and groundbreakers in our field today shows how he identified and nurtured talent in those who trained under him. So many of us would not be where we are today were it not for the support and mentorship of Dr. George Stookey."

After retiring from the IU faculty in 2001, Dr. Stookey founded his own research company, Therametric Technologies, Inc., which develops new technologies for early detection of dental decay. Throughout his career, numerous prestigious national and international organizations recognized Dr. Stookey's innovations and achievements. In 2017, the American Dental Education Association recognized him with the William J. Gies Award, dentistry's preeminent recognition, for his innovation in dental education. In 2021, Indiana University bestowed Dr. Stookey with its Bicentennial Medal.

The purpose of life is to be useful, to be honorable, to be compassionate, to have it make some difference that you have lived and lived well.
