Request for Review of IUPUI's NCAA Certification Self Study

In September 2007 Chancellor Charles Bantz charged a steering committee of faculty, staff, students, and community representatives with the task of developing a self study that will enable IUPUI to maintain its certification by the NCAA Committee on Athletics Certification. All Division I athletics programs must undergo certification periodically. IUPUI received its initial certification for a full ten years in 1999. A peer review team will visit IUPUI September 24-26, 2008 to meet with a broad cross-section of the campus community and then provide recommendations to the NCAA Committee on Athletics Certification regarding IUPUI's certification.

The self study is being prepared by three subcommittees, each covering one of the required areas: Governance and Commitment to Rules Compliance, Academic Integrity, and Equity and Student-Athlete Well-Being. Drafts of the three sections of the self study will be available until April 9, 2008 at <http://planning.iupui.edu/587.html>. Master Plan Open House Sessions to be Held at IUPUI April 3

Help Plan the new IUPUI!!

IUPUI will host an open house April 3 to give students, faculty and staff an opportunity to engage in the early stages of creating a comprehensive Campus Master Plan to guide future campus growth and development.

Two sessions are scheduled in the IUPUI Campus Center in the stage area in the food court on April 3. One session will be held from 11:30 a.m. to 1:30 p.m. The second session will be held from 6 p.m. to 8 p.m. Master Plan open house sessions will be held on the Bloomington campus April 2.

Faculty, students and staff will be asked by facilitators to identify relevant issues including parking, vehicular and pedestrian circulation, buildings and facilities, open space and the surrounding community.

IU President Michael A. McRobbie announced the necessity of creating a master plan for IU Bloomington and IUPUI last fall. He said that in the coming years, the university would face decisions with respect to construction of new facilities and renovation and repurposing of existing structures. It would be essential, he said, that there be a single plan integrating the needs of the two campuses to enable the university to maximize collaborative possibilities and minimize duplicative efforts.

In January, David King, a nationally renowned architect with the leading architectural company SmithGroup/JJR of Washington, D.C., was chosen to serve as IU's master planner. As national specialists in campus planning, they will guide the planning effort with a diverse consultant team that includes infrastructure, transportation and space planners. SmithGroup and JJR's project portfolio includes work on more than 200 campuses worldwide.

The planning process, which will include a close working relationship with the cities of Bloomington and Indianapolis, is expected to take approximately 12 months to complete.

After plans for IU Bloomington and IUPUI are finished, King will begin work on updating master plans for IU's campuses in Gary, Kokomo, New Albany, Richmond and South Bend.
