MEMBERS OF THE SUMIYA HOBO STUDY CLUB from southern Japan visited Indiana to take a special postgraduate course in Crown and Bridge being presented by the Department of Continuing Education at IUPUI School of Dentistry in cooperation with the Indiana University School of Dentistry Alumni Association on April 2-3, 1970.

The purpose of the association is to provide the dental student with a source of communication and representation at the national level. Projects will include student loans, community health centers for indigents, and programs pertaining to student life. SADA is not sponsored by the ADA, but the ADA will work closely with the new student group.

We would like to call to the attention of the faculty the variety of audiovisual equipment now available for use 72.5 hours per week. DR. CARL D. BELL, DIRECTOR OF THE INDIANA DENTAL HEALTH TASK FORCE PROJECT, recently summarized for the Newsletter the three main programs to be carried out:

1. A Dental Health Survey of the State of Indiana. A sample of 15,000 school children in 71 counties has already been selected for the survey, which will assess the prevalence of caries and the amount of restorative treatment already provided, periodontal status, fractured teeth, and orthodontic treatment needs.
2. Dental Manpower Planning. Data from the Dental Health Survey will be used to estimate the number of professional personnel required to meet the needs.
3. Community Pilot Projects. Selected communities will be given encouragement and assistance in the establishment of various preventive procedures.

Mr. David N. Gunn recently joined the Indiana Dental Health Task Force as Project Coordinator and Programmer. Mrs. Donna Dobbs is Mr. Gunn's secretary.
