Justification for Course Change to MHHS M201: Introduction to Health Studies and Medical Humanities (3 credit hours)

Course change: Designation of MHHS M201 to satisfy the one of the undergraduate Social

Science and Arts & Humanities Distribution Requirements

MHHS M201, Intro to Health Sciences and Medical Humanities is designed to expose students to the contributions of the liberal arts disciplines to understanding of health, illness and medicine. It is instructive not only for the knowledge base in health care and illness, but for the differing approaches of the humanities and social science disciplines in the School of Liberal Arts disciplines. The course was suggested by the Dean's Office as one way to reach students interested in medicine/health care practice and policies early in their academic careers in order to demonstrate the value of the liberal arts in understanding the broader issues that affect all consumers, providers, and managers of health services.

Students receive an introductory exposure to both social science and humanities disciplines, and learn about each through comparison among them. As such, this course should satisfy the distributional requirement in either Arts & Humanities or Social Science.

The course is organized around three to four health themes. For the initial Fall 2011 offering these are:

- Definition of Illness and Health
- Birth and Death
- Body and Self
- Health Care Access

Within the context of these themes, discipline-specific lectures from humanities and social science disciplines help to illustrate not only the issue or theme, but the contribution and perspective(s) of the different liberal arts disciplines. The following departments have faculty who have expressed interest and/or commitment to giving individual lectures to represent their respective disciplines:
