National Agriculture Week is March 18-24, 2007

American agriculture is responsible for providing the necessities of everyday life...food, fiber and fuel. To honor the hardworking people of the nation's agriculture industry, The Agriculture Council of America coordinates National Agriculture Day, sponsored by Archer Daniels Midland Company and John Deere.

The National FFA Organization is proud to support events in Washington, D.C. This year the organization will conduct a rally on Thursday, March 15, on the patio of the USDA Whitten Building to generate excitement about National Agriculture Day and increase awareness of agricultural issues. Attendees will include key members of Congress; industry leaders; FFA members from neighboring states including Maryland, Delaware, Virginia, West Virginia, New Jersey and Pennsylvania; and various trade associations. Members of 4-H, Agriculture Future of America (AFA) and Skills USA will also participate.

The focus of the rally is "The Future of Renewable Energy and Agriculture in America" and will kick off with welcome remarks at 3 p.m. from Beau Williamson, national FFA president, and comments from the Honorable Mike Johanns, United States Secretary of Agriculture. Other leaders from the United States Department of Energy and the Renewable Fuels Association have been invited to address this topic as well.

The National Agriculture Day Luncheon will be held March 15 at the National Press Club with veteran farm broadcaster Orion Samuelson as Master of Ceremonies. Shipping Cap for State Association Orders

State association orders for convention plaques, awards, medals and trophies will have freight charges "capped" at \$200 this year for orders exceeding \$1,500 in cumulative total. This freight cap provides a means for states to submit portions of a total convention order as needs are determined, as winners are selected, as recipients are identified or as state chapter awards are decided as opposed to

holding all awards for a large, single order closer to the convention date. By placing partial orders earlier, this allows for more engraving and production time, award processing and validation of ordered item receipt.

To qualify, all award orders must be shipped to the same address within three months prior to the state convention date. The only items eligible to qualify for this special offer are plaques, awards, medals and trophies.

On each state order, please note the following: "Part 1 of state convention order" or "Part 2...", etc. Rush award orders placed two weeks or less prior the convention date will be charged standard or expedited shipping and are not covered under the freight cap promotion. Paid Internships!

The U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) is looking for a few outstanding senior and graduate-level college and university students to work in their overseas offices to promote U.S. agricultural interests through the International Agricultural Internship

Program (IAIP) for summer 2007. Each semester (fall, spring and summer), the USDA's Foreign Agricultural Service (FAS), one of the four U.S. government foreign service agencies, places about 10 students in their overseas offices. These students have excellent analysis, marketing, writing, language and organizational skills and experience in international agricultural trade policy issues, commodity and market analysis and organizing trade events. The paid internships last 10-16 weeks. Eligible students must be U.S. citizens majoring in a business or science related agricultural field, such as agricultural economics, economics, finance, business or marketing, international studies or relations, law or in a biotechnology program. The fall 2007 application deadline is April 3, 2007 and the spring 2008 application deadline is Aug. 18, 2007.
