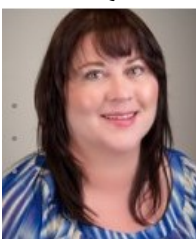
Visiting Clinical Assistant Professor. An important transition in focus for Professor Taylor, who has

served with excellence in the Department of Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs. As a Visiting Clinical Assistant Professor in the Department of Cariology, Operative Dentistry and Community Dentistry, her primary responsibilities will have a public health focus and involve Seal Indiana and safety net clinical rotations and other access to care programs. This will include marketing and public rela-

tions, onsite work and staff supervision, fiscal management and support of grant-writing for Seal Indiana. She will do the same for the safety net and other access to care programs, but also will have curricular development responsibilities that include didactic, clinical and other assignments related to supporting the Dental Public Health course for first year and third year dental students and the Oral Health Promotion Competency.

Joining the Department of Periodontics and Allied Dental Program, Division of Dental Hygiene, is Visiting Clinical Assistant Professor, **Michelle Quirke**.

Michelle has served as an adjunct faculty member providing instruction for Introduction to Dental



Hygiene and Dental Hygiene Clinical Practice 3 courses. At University College, she has been the Dental Hygiene Instructor for the Summer Bridge Program. At Trinity Clinic in Carmel, she has served as a dental hygienist and coordinator for the Children's Fluoride Clinic, and for the Louis Stokes Midwest Center of Excellence at the IU School of Education, she has been serving as an academic specialist and programming associate. In her new role, Professor Quirke will be responsible for teaching community dental hygiene, radiology, and the Summer Bridge Program dental hygiene and freshman experience course as well as providing didactic and clinical instruction and other related duties for the dental hygiene program. Adjunct Faculty News

Earlier this year we shared that all School of Dentistry faculty who are supervising dentists at IUSD are now required to enroll as a Medicaid provider. As we mentioned, this compulsory step has been one among several being taken by all Health Science Schools at IUPUI as IU strengthens compliance to meet the challenges and liabilities of an increasingly regulated medical industry. Beginning July 1, 2015, all adjunct clinical faculty will have Medicaid enrollment requirement language in their appointment letters. Although legislative and policy changes such as these can cause

unwanted burden, let us be quick to remind ourselves not to lose sight of the benefits, among which are how it reenergizes dialogue and analysis to create place and space for integrating more robust and culturally relevant technologies into IUSD's dental care and dental education programs. Moreover, it is important to continue to examine the possibilities and work to identify and eliminate operational inefficiencies. Our opportunity to provide critical and leading research that closes healthcare gaps restricting upward mobility for underrepresented and underserved

deepens. It allows us to be champions for interprofessional education (See CE opportunities about an HHS IPE webinar training on July 8. For more information see <http://www.hhs.gov/ash/initiatives/mcc>) and it positions IUSD for greater impact and increased worldwide recognition for excellence in patient care delivery. Preparing our students for the real world dental environment is one of the vital roles that our adjunct faculty perform daily.
