IUSD Some New Academic Directions – A Proposal

Indiana University embarked on some New Academic Directions following the President's State of the University address in 2010. The New Academic Directions report was approved by the Board of Trustees in April 2011 for programs at IUPUI and IU-B. During the year since, numerous faculty, deans, and others on campus have been working to consider and frame initiatives that follow from that report. The New Academic Directions report recommends, among other things, that the two IU campuses invest strategically in new and existing programs, and encourage innovative collaboration among academic units while seeking new sources of revenue and reducing costs where appropriate.

So what does this mean for IUSD? After listening, observing and learning about IUSD for 2 years, I believe it is time for our own version of some new IUSD Academic Directions. Consistent with our current Strategic plan, the proposals I will outline and present to the faculty will be to enhance the excellence in all academic programs by suggested changes in the DDS curriculum, promote research and scholarship, and operate more efficiently to reduce costs and enhance revenues. The planning premise-- which is sound--is borrowed from the IU New Academic Directions three key strategies:

- 1. IU must identify ways to distinguish Indiana University that are meaningful to highly talented students and faculty. (Specifically, we must be able to attract additional high-ability students and recruit and maintain top quality faculty. Our programs, and the IUSD "brand," must be exceptionally compelling.
 - 2. IU must create an operating environment that provides incentives for incremental

revenue enhancement. We must expand our revenue base.

3. *IU must improve operating efficiency*. We must continue to find ways to improve operating efficiency particularly through our clinical operation, without compromising the academic mission. (adapted from Final Report of New Academic Directions Committee pgs 8-9)

Guided by these proposals, and mindful of the IUSD Governance Structure, I will be asking the Faculty Council to become engaged in the discussion about these proposed changes and act prudently on behalf of IUSD.
