This showed a big improvement in regard for Business meetings. A good chairman really helps. It shows there is room for improvement in discussion groups. We thank those who replied for some very useful suggestions. All in all, most everybody who replied had a fair to good time. But what about the rest of you? Boy, could we be wrong. There's still time to send in your vote.

Those business meetings really made a hit. They were the best part of the Conference to a lot of people. The application of rules of order to help everyone have his say was a big part of it. How about trying that in your own J. A. company too.

Other "best" features were discussion groups, new friends, and dances. "Least" liked were food (who could eat in all that heat), discussion groups, business meetings, and just plain nothing at all. Some of the preferences show quite a difference of opinion, which is just what you'd normally expect. It suggests a program with more variation, more things going on at the same time so you can pick what you like best.

Elections went over pretty well. All but one person wants them, and 165 thought they were good, against 7 poor. Opinion was generally good about all phases of the election except the plurality vote that was in effect this year. There were 59 against it, many more than opposed any other feature. All are agreed on a wide range of standards that officers should fulfill. In this connection, all three of the old officers present did such fine jobs they've been asked to return next year as counselors.

Delegates favored J. A. company income taxes 160 to 47. 179 of you would like to be counselors, but only a few of you gave very sound qualifications.

Finally, you voted 174 to 30 that you could have come if the date were one week earlier. On that basis, we're planning future NAJAC's a week earlier, to avoid the crowded travel conditions on Labor Day weekend.

Those are the highlights. Thanks to all who replied.
