Lawrence A. Mark, M.D., Ph.D.

Every issue of the Hackney-Norins Newsletter highlights an individual faculty member. This issue's spotlight is Lawrence A. Mark, M.D., Ph.D.

Dr. Lawrence A. Mark was born and raised in Indianapolis. After graduating from high school at North Central, he went to Indiana University in Bloomington, where he obtained a B.S. in Mathematics with Highest Graduating

1992. Distinctions in Following his graduation, he worked restoring Victorian homes in the Indianapolis area for about a year before taking a job as a research assistant in the laboratory of Dr. Iohn Critzer, cryobiologist working at Methodist. Working in a research lab sparked his interest in becoming a physician-scientist. Lawrence Mark was accepted into the very competitive M.D. - Ph.D. program here at I.U., and graduated with a Ph.D. in Medical Biophysics with minor in Biochemistry, September 2001, and his M.D. in May 2002. His Ph.D.

work was done in the laboratory of Dr. James Williams, and his Ph.D. dissertation was titled "Modeling of glomerular basement membrane as a charged fiber-matrix". He published papers in the *Journal of Colloid and Interface Science*, and *Biophysical Journal*, which are the leading journals in Biophysics. Dr. Mark became interested in putting his keen intellect to work as a dermatologist, and our program was very fortunate to recruit him as a resident in 2002.

During his residency Dr. Mark became interested in cutaneous lymphomas, and spent a month of elective time away to study at Northwestern University in Chicago. The Department was incredibly lucky to keep him here, and he joined

the faculty July 1, 2006. His first month as faculty he spent at Yale, working with famous CTCL experts Drs. Peter Heald and Richard Edelson.

Dr. Mark's passion is cutaneous lymphomas, and he currently has clinics specifically devoted to these challenging patients. This is certainly historic in the state of Indiana to have these specialized clinics. In the near future, he plans to set up a multidisciplinary clinic where he will work closely with radiation medical and oncologists to manage these patients.
