Foreword



This is the fifteenth volume of "Kiwani Activities" summarizing the officially reported activities of all the Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada during the year 1936. The compilation was made possible by utilizing the Official Monthly Reports recording activities as reported by the club secretaries.

At the close of 1936 there were 1,900 chartered clubs, according to the membership records as of December 31, 1936, and nearly all were carrying on civic and welfare programs.

The Objects of Kiwanis International have made possible the numerous activities recorded in this volume. These Objects are:

To give primacy to the human and spiritual rather than to the material values of life.

To encourage the daily living of the Golden Rule in all human relationships.

To promote the adoption and the application of higher social, business and professional standards.

To develop, by precept and example, a more intelligent, aggressive and serviceable citizenship.

To provide through Kiwanis clubs, a practical means to form enduring friendships, to render altruistic service, and to build better communities.

To co-operate in creating and maintaining that sound public opinion and high idealism which make possible the increase of righteousness, justice, patriotism, and good-will.

Suggestions for Your Own Club

KIWANIS ACTIVITIES is a summary of the community betterment and service activities of Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada. The book is compiled annually from the Official Monthly Reports submitted by clubs.

The activities indicate the many varied and practical applications of the ideals, and objectives of Kiwanis International, and suggest opportunities of similar service for other communities, institutions, groups and individuals.

The book is not an honor-roll of clubs. It has been compiled as a descriptive presentation of diversified service endeavors.

How to Use the Book

KIWANIS ACTIVITIES is suggestive of what can be done in all communities by active clubs. Every club, large or small, seeking suggestions for community service can find in this volume sources of information on every conceivable kind of activity.

The key which unlocks the treasure of this book for clubs is the index on the final pages. There appear over forty general divisions of activities, which direct the reader to pages of thousands of records of actual club work.

Clubs which have made surveys of their own communities and are planning new or additional service activities, can review the results of clubs in towns of somewhat the same type and population. Clubs seeking suggestions may be located in either agricultural or industrial areas, or in vicinities of both farming and manufacturing.

For a club in an agricultural region, the index will indicate hundreds of valuable activities in better town and country relations work, in city beautiful planning, health campaigns, conservation and general education. If a club functions in a community where all forms of general economic enterprise are in operation, a vast store-house of material is suggested by such index topics as health and sanitation, boys' and girls' work, improvement of civic conditions, aid to business and industry, and many others.

A careful study of KIWANIS ACTIVITIES by members will reveal to them many clubs of about the same size, in localities having similar opportunities and problems, engaged in active and varied service programs.

Every Kiwanian is urged to make a thorough inspection of KIWANIS ACTIVITIES to familiarize himself with the summary of service work of all the clubs in Kiwanis International.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD

The service rendered by all the Kiwanis clubs in the United States and Canada, on behalf of under-privileged children, consists in removing those physical, mental, moral and economic handicaps, which bar them from the full measure of citizenship.

The following shows the various kinds of activities accomplished during 1936 to aid the children under this major Kiwanis objective:

Physical

Albany, Ga. The Kiwanis clinic handled 150 new cases during 1936, together with care for 400 other patients. During the year there were 150 operations performed and many dental and eye corrections. Glasses, milk and fresh fruit were furnished to some 30 families and clothing was supplied to the needy.

Alhambra, Calif. There were 900 entries in our annual hobby and pet show. The total attendance was over 1,100. The club purchased bread and milk for poor children. Sent youngsters to a summer camp and purchased a wheel chair for crippled children.

Ashland, Ky. Some 300 magazines were sent each month to settlement schools in the eastern part of the state. Medical and surgical attention are available for under-privileged children in the schools and lunches are provided for the under-nourished.

Atlantic City, N. J. A clinic was established to care for 50 children with defective speech and hearing. Surveys were made in all the schools to find children needing help. Orthopedic appliances, health and dental examinations and clothing were available for needy children.

Auburn, Neb. Eight hundred children of the city and county schools were immunized against diphtheria.

Barberton, Ohio. A sight-o-meter was purchased for a public school sight-saving class. A clinic operates during the year for treating the eyes of all children. Poor youngsters in the community get this service free of charge.

Bastrop, La. Kiwanis is assisting a W. P. A. nursery school for under-privileged children. The removal of tonsils and the purchasing of glasses were part of our service program in 1936.

Battle Creek, Mich. An appropriation was made to assist in supplying instruction for children who are hard of hearing. Purchased a \$135.00 hearing instrument for a 12-year old girl. Fifty children were sent to a Salvation Army camp and a contribution was made to the Michigan District University Hospital project. Needy children were given eye examinations and glasses free.

Bay City, Tex. Some 400 children have received free dental care. Others needing eye examinations, glasses and tonsil surgery were given help.

Beattyville, Ky. A crippled children's clinic for four counties in this part of the state assisted 78 unfortunates, two of whom were adults. Hospitalization has been started for those who need surgical and other treatment.

Bellefonte, Pa. There have been 18 clinics, with a total of 83 examinations and treatments. The welfare of 37 children of this area is under club supervision.

Belleville, Ont. Kiwanis has taken over the sponsorship of the Victorian Order of Nurses' baby clinic. Medical and surgical service, clothing, eye examinations and orthopedic appliances for crippled children are all a part of Kiwanis aid for unfortunates. Over 100 children were sent to a summer camp.

Bethlehem, Pa. Kiwanians assist in tutoring backward children of the public schools. Glasses are also provided for under-privileged children.

Birmingham, Ala. Employment was found for a young man whose father, a Kiwanian, had died which made it necessary for the son to find work. Under-privileged boys enjoyed a camp vacation.

Blairsville, Pa. Forty-five children had their tonsils removed at a clinic. Transportation was furnished a child so she may attend high school. Needy school children are given whatever help is necessary so they can continue their studies.

Bloomington, Ind. A director was employed for a nutritional camp where under-nourished children received medical supervision.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Physical)—Cont.

- Bluefield, W. Va.** Thirty-five crippled youngsters attended a clinic and several have been placed in hospitals. Milk, glasses and orthopedic appliances were supplied free of charge. A deaf child was sent to a specialist who is giving the youngster successful treatments. Over 300 attended our second annual picnic for under-privileged children.
- Boscobel, Wis.** A survey was made to find all under-privileged children and learn of their individual needs. Doctor and dentist members of Kiwanis and the school nurse give these children daily attention. Warm meals are provided for 75 children.
- Buckley, Wash.** Health examinations were conducted for all children before the schools opened. The club promotes general orthopedic work for crippled children.
- Burbank, Calif.** Kiwanis sponsors a nursery for children under school age whose mothers must find employment. Dental and medical service, cod liver oil, clothing and toys are supplied for these youngsters.
- Burlington, Iowa.** In 1936 the club started its 13th year of providing milk for the under-privileged children of the city. Our 13th annual show, "Sawdust and Spangles," gave the club \$1,000.00 for its milk fund.
- Burns, Ore.** An effective program of immunization of school children against diphtheria was carried out in October. All school boards co-operated with Kiwanis in this protective health measure.
- Caldwell-West Essex, N. J.** A net profit of \$1,365.00 was secured with the play, "Kiwanis Kapers." Milk, glasses, a student loan fund and camp activities for boys and girls are all a part of our under-privileged child program.
- Cambridge, Ohio.** Funds were given to equip and maintain an opportunity school for children needing special attention. Medical care and hospitalization are provided for the needy.
- Carbon Hill, Ala.** Two seriously crippled girls have been placed in a clinic for orthopedic surgery. The club plans to keep two children in the clinic at all times.
- Casper, Wyo.** A nursery for children of pre-school age has been started. Only seven of these schools are allowed in the state. The institution is for children of parents on relief. A milk fund provides for under-nourished children. All needy cases are referred to Kiwanis and we provide clothing, glasses, dental service and other help for the unfortunates.
- Charleston, W. Va.** The club provides a free bed in a hospital, which gives under-privileged children a chance for surgical and medical service. Eighty-four children received tonsil and adenoid operations.
- Charlotte, N. C.** Kiwanis for the past 10 years has operated a pre-natal clinic, which gives service to hundreds of destitute mothers. This clinic also extends a helping hand in adjusting the illegitimate child's welfare and also that of its mother.
- Chattanooga, Tenn.** Funds were raised for the establishment of a clinic for the prevention of blindness.
- Cheboygan, Mich.** The entire club helped to sell Easter seals and the money is used to assist crippled children. Youngsters were sent to a summer camp and also entertained at a circus.
- Chester, Pa.** The club operates an eye clinic for hundreds of patients, pays the expenses of under-nourished children sent to camps and donates money to the Salvation Army fresh air fund. A survey was made to find children who cannot attend school and authorities will assign teachers to go to the homes of these youngsters.
- Chicago, Ill.** Three nights a week classes are held for young people who are deaf. The average attendance is 30. These are instructional classes and it is hoped that the club can secure positions for some of the students.
- Chippewa Falls, Wis.** Our dental clinic assists neglected children. Over 1,900 youngsters were examined during the year. All city school children have dental examinations and when parents cannot afford the necessary treatment the work is done free. The clinic was one of the first started in Wisconsin and many cities over the country have planned their clinics after the one located here.
- Clarksburg, W. Va.** A survey was made to find children with defective hearing. Children needing surgical help are sent to hospitals for aid.
- Commerce, Ga.** A total of 550 children had their teeth examined at a clinic. Diphtheria immunization work is carried on in all city schools. Subscriptions were purchased so the magazine Hygia could be secured for the school library.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Physical)—Cont.

- Conway, Ark.** A children's clinic brought 130 patients who needed help. Local doctors contributed their services. Kiwanis assistance was also given in maintaining a Negro health week.
- Cumberland, Md.** A hospital room was furnished at a cost of \$800.00 and will be available free of charge for all under-privileged children. Orthopedic treatments, milk, clothing and shoes were also purchased for youngsters. Fifty-seven boys and girls were sent to summer camps.
- Dallas, Tex.** Over 3,500 treatments were given at the dental clinic during 1936.
- Dawson, Ga.** Kiwanis was instrumental in securing a health officer for the county. Thirty-four children had their tonsils removed at a clinic.
- Delaware, Ohio.** All poor children needing glasses were provided with them at the expense of the club. Broken lenses and other repairs are also furnished through Kiwanis co-operation.
- Denver, Colo.** Text books are furnished for an opportunity school. A wheel chair was secured for an invalid boy. Kiwanis doctors and dentists care for needy cases and a fund is available for hospital care for the indigent.
- Dothan, Ala.** A clinic assisted 30 poor children.
- Dover, N. J.** A girl, who was in a bad environment, was found better surroundings where conditions will allow her to have a normal mental and moral development. Boys and girls were sent to summer camps. Glasses were provided for needy school children. A weekly dental clinic gives free service and the club supplies shoes, clothing and milk to the poor.
- Eagle Rock, Calif.** The club is assisting a number of young boys. One is being given a musical education and the others are given assistance so they have the advantage of a good environment. The boys have the opportunity of being week-end guests at the homes of the Kiwanians. Summer camp privileges are available for worthy youngsters. Purchased milk and Y. M. C. A. memberships.
- East Liverpool, Ohio.** A boy was sent to the Ohio School for the Blind.
- East Orange, N. J.** The club has a free bed for needy children at an orthopedic hospital. Birthday gifts are provided for a children's home and young people are sent to summer camps.
- El Paso, Tex.** Under-privileged children are provided with free medical and dental service. Street car tickets are given to these youngsters so they may visit the offices of doctors on regular schedule. Over 100 boys and girls were given delightful camp vacations in 1936. Over 15,000 meals were served to under-privileged school children. Funds were secured for this work by individual gifts and from penny jars distributed throughout the city.
- Evanston, Ill.** For four years the club has been sponsoring a crippled youngster in the home of the Evanston King's Daughters. Hospital care, orthopedic braces and shoes, clothing and transportation are provided for unfortunate children.
- Fairmont, W. Va.** There were 140 children during the year operated on for removal of tonsils and adenoids at the Kiwanis clinic.
- Fayetteville, N. C.** An orthopedic and a baby clinic are the two major activities of the club and both are well patronized. The baby health center gives instructions to mothers.
- Fergus Falls, Minn.** An orthopedic clinic was opened in September and attendance was approximately 200 crippled children. After examinations cases were recommended to a hospital where children receive free treatment.
- Fort Worth, Tex.** Glasses, milk and surgical attention are aids for needy children. All the children from orphanages were given free hair cuts. The co-operation of the barbers' union made this possible.
- Greensburg, Pa.** Donated food, clothing, milk, fuel, eye examinations and glasses at a cost of \$1,000.00.
- Greenville, S. C.** A youngster found as a street urchin has been the club's ward for the past two years. All Kiwanians are proud of this boy. He has a fine home and will grow up to be a good citizen. Arrangements are made with a hospital to provide funds for supplying food, medicine and other necessities for under-privileged children.
- Greenwood, S. C.** Equipment was purchased for a baby ward at a hospital. School books were supplied needy children.
- Hagerstown, Md.** Glasses, orthopedic appliances, milk, food and clothing were supplied to children in poor homes. The annual Kiwanis bazaar and hobby show gave us \$850.00 for our welfare work.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Physical)—Cont.

- Hampton, Va.** Monthly orthopedic clinics give examinations and treatments to those who are financially unable to pay for this service. A bazaar and carnival gave us \$2,407.59 for our work. Over 1,000 treatments have been given at the clinic during the past three years.
- Hattiesburg, Miss.** Children were sent to a Memphis clinic for treatment. The club has purchased orthopedic appliances for youngsters. A chair was supplied a child whose condition made it impossible to receive surgical benefits. One youngster was given a new brace. Twelve years ago this boy was given clinical rehabilitation.
- Hendersonville, N. C.** A county-wide clinic was held to find children needing medical and surgical attention. This relief program, the supplying of glasses and other aids was the assistance given under-privileged children during 1936.
- Henrietta, Tex.** Investigation was made of children in the schools who needed glasses so they could keep up in their studies. The club collected toys and had them repaired and repainted for Christmas distribution to poor children.
- Hollywood, Calif.** An investigation is being carried on to see whether a nursery for children of employed mothers was necessary in the community. A dental clinic is operated for the benefit of children at orphanages. Clothing, hospital care and free tonsil surgery by Kiwanis doctors was our welfare work during the year.
- Homestead, Pa.** A well-baby clinic is held for 40 youngsters every week. Cod liver oil and orthopedic braces are supplied free of charge. The club is now interested in securing a recreational center for the community.
- Hopewell, Va.** The annual bazaar gave us \$1,700.00 for our crippled children's work, which includes orthopedic and physiotherapy clinics.
- Hubbard, Ohio.** During the past 12 years, at an expenditure of approximately \$9,000.00, the club has aided over 1,000 children. The assistance included orthopedic, dental and surgical aid. Milk was supplied those with nutritional defects. Children suffering with tuberculosis, defective hearing and heart diseases are given constant attention.
- Jacksonville, Fla.** The club operates a 20-babies project and a foster-parent plan. Kiwanians act as Big Brothers for children who need supervision. Glasses, orthopedic appliances, food and clothing are provided. A third annual football game on January 1st secured funds for service activities. Valentines and birthday cards are sent to children in institutional homes.
- Janesville, Wis.** A profit of \$2,600.00 was realized from our annual show. The club operates a Kiwanis ward at the local hospital and an ultra violet ray machine was purchased this year.
- Jasper, Ala.** An annual clinic provided for over 50 examinations and 36 operations. The work was all done by local doctors and nurses. Food is supplied under-privileged children in the schools.
- Jefferson City, Mo.** A free clinic provided for a total evaluation of \$1,787.00 for medical, surgical and dental work. Children were immunized against diphtheria and typhoid. Forty-five pairs of glasses were supplied.
- Kansas City, Mo.** A child health center was open during the entire year. Visiting nurses make several hundred calls a month. The health center cares for 50 to 75 babies every 30 days. Children were taken to a Salvation Army fresh air camp and clothing was provided for the needy.
- Kirkland Lake, Ont.** The annual street carnival had as an objective \$6,000.00 for an under-privileged child fund. Milk is furnished under-nourished children.
- Lake View, Chicago.** Over 5,500 tickets were sold for the annual minstrel show. The Jahn School is supplied with special facilities for crippled children, as well as a dental activity and crippled children's rehabilitation service. Glasses, clothing and other aids for handicapped children are also provided.
- Lansdale, Pa.** The dental clinic for 1936 had a total number of 262 visits. This work has been successful for the past 10 years. Glasses are given to poor children.
- Lawrence, Kan.** Regular monthly orthopedic and mental hygiene clinics are held. Many patients constantly crowd the orthopedic clinic and the hygiene work also cares for many cases.
- Liverpool, N. S.** Over 400 children were given dental attention during the past year.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Physical)—Cont.

- Los Angeles, Calif.** For 15 years the club has sponsored the activities of the McKinley Home for Boys. These youngsters have a Key club and are taught vocational guidance, agriculture, general handicraft and athletics. Thirteen new sub-committees were formed and the members have personal contact programs with the boys of the home. A \$5,000.00 under-privileged child budget was used in welfare work. The Sunset Community Center is a recreational hall for under-privileged youngsters.
- Lyons, Ga.** A dental clinic cares for a total of 750 pupils and the club is also sponsoring a clinic for general physical assistance.
- Medford, Ore.** Over 135 children were treated in the clinic in 1936, which is operated by a county public health unit and expenses defrayed by Kiwanis.
- Meriden, Conn.** Good homes were found for five children whose living conditions were very unsatisfactory.
- Middlesboro, Ky.** Every Kiwanian is offering personal service to under-privileged children. One youngster was sent to Philadelphia to a specialist and 150 children attended a dental clinic. Assistance is given the Grace Nettleton Home in Tennessee.
- Middletown, Ohio.** A deaf and dumb clinic is in operation for 17 afflicted children. Seventy-two youngsters were sent to a fresh air camp.
- Milwaukee, Wis.** Kiwanis was instrumental in having the school board give special consideration for a crippled children's school. Camp expenses were paid for 36 under-privileged girls. A monthly appropriation is made for several students so they can complete their education. Orthopedic appliances were purchased for crippled youngsters. Glasses, medicine and clothing were secured for indigent children.
- Mission, San Francisco, Calif.** The club has spent \$2,000.00 in under-privileged child work and placed 22 persons in employment during the year.
- Monett, Mo.** Four blind children were taken to a school in St. Louis. Another was sent to a Colorado hospital for osteomyelitis treatment. Eighty-eight persons were treated at an eye clinic and others were supplied with glasses. Children needing orthopedic and other surgical attention were sent to various hospitals. Transportation is provided for all children between their homes, hospitals and clinics.
- Montgomery, Ala.** The club is promoting financial assistance for a special school for children suffering with deafness. Children handicapped by illness or in need of physical care are sent to a fresh air camp.
- Montreal, P. Q.** The club gives assistance to the Weredale Boys' Home, St. Patrick's Orphanage, Italian Orphanage, School for Crippled Children, The Province of Quebec Society for Crippled Children, the Montreal Children's Hospital and the Griffintown club. Hospital and orthopedic treatments, clothing, hymn books and toys are provided for unfortunate children. At Christmas time 3,000 cards were mailed to youngsters. Wholesome entertainment was provided throughout the entire year.
- Montrose-La Crescenta, Calif.** Food, clothing and medicine were distributed so unfortunate children could receive good care. One hundred boys and girls were sent to camps.
- Nanticoke, Pa.** The Committee on Under-Privileged Child is active at all times and works with a full-time nurse. All convalescent crippled children are visited regularly and at a clinic 117 children were examined and many are receiving surgical treatment.
- Newark, N. J.** A clinic is held for children with faulty or impeded speech and a staff of experienced teachers, nurses and physicians are in attendance. It is hoped that with instruction these youngsters can overcome their afflictions. A dental clinic provides free service for indigent youngsters and glasses are supplied those needing this help. Over 1,000 books were collected and distributed to children's hospitals and orphan asylums. Toys were repaired and sent to under-privileged boys and girls. At Thanksgiving time, holiday packages were sent to all youngsters in nurseries and orphanages.
- New Liskeard, Ont.** Twelve crippled children are receiving attention and free surgical treatment is available for those needing tonsil operations. Food, milk and clothing are distributed among the needy. The annual carnival netted \$1,900.00 for welfare work. Seventy-six boys and girls attended a summer camp.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Physical)—Cont.

- Newport News, Va.** Monthly clinics are held for child welfare work. The club is seeking a good location for building a summer camp. Helped in observing the annual birthday party for President Franklin D. Roosevelt.
- New Westminster, B. C.** The Child Welfare Committee is active in caring for emergency cases where boys and girls require medical attention. Books and glasses were provided so children may be better equipped for their school work.
- North Baltimore, Md.** The Committee on Under-Privileged Child has purchased equipment and appliances for a crippled children's hospital. A day nursery is maintained to care for small children whose mothers are employed. No charge is made for those mothers unable to pay for the service. Two homeless youths were placed in a dormitory and found employment. The children from the Protestant and Catholic orphanages and other institutions were given a picnic. A youngster was sent to a health camp.
- North St. Louis, Mo.** Because many children cannot be confirmed into their church faiths, as they do not have good clothing, the club is supplying wearing apparel and other aid. Milk and breakfast cereals are purchased for children. The club made a contribution for the Salvation Army. Dental attention is available for those who need this service.
- Norton, Va.** A contribution was given to the Parent-Teachers' Association for furnishing hot lunches and milk to under-privileged children. Fifty-three youngsters received attention at our free tonsil clinics. The second annual rhododendron festival was held in June, with a parade, stage and baby shows, water carnival, country store, food display, industrial exhibit, demonstration of old-fashioned loom weaving, exhibits of antiques, etc.
- Oil City, Pa.** A community exposition, with displays by merchants and automobile dealers, was held in September. Space was sold to exhibitors and there was a nominal admission charge. Approximately \$400.00 was cleared for welfare work.
- Orange, Mass.** During the past 10 years, the club has spent \$5,000.00 in welfare work. A contribution was given for fresh air camp activities.
- Owen Sound, Ont.** Over 40 children received attention at a tonsil clinic.
- Oxford, Miss.** A survey was made for children in our county schools who need glasses. These are furnished by our club.
- Oxford, N. C.** We gave a series of amateur hour programs which proved to be successful. The money received was turned over to the under-privileged child fund. We purchased a pair of braces for a child who was afflicted with infantile paralysis, the result of an epidemic which swept our state. A milk fund is supported by amateur hour programs.
- Painesville, Ohio.** We are undertaking to support an eye, ear, nose, throat clinic for all children in our community. Dental attention is also available.
- Petersburg, Va.** During 1936 there were 825 in attendance at our clinic. All of them received health examinations. The health nurse made 4,209 home visits. The club furnishes milk, clothing, shoes, glasses, orthopedic appliances and drugs. A carnival and bazaar was successful and gave the club \$4,000.00 for its work among crippled children.
- Pharr, Tex.** Our Kiwanis weekly clinic cared for 1,500 children during 1936.
- Pineville, Ky.** Each member of our club is assigned an under-privileged child for the year. These children are selected by the school superintendent with the assistance of the health nurse and director of a children's bureau. Seventy-five children were examined by one of our Kiwanians. Members of our club furnished transportation to and from the clinic.
- Ponca City, Okla.** We sponsored four clinics for the children of our community. The children examined were scheduled in groups for various operations and corrective treatments throughout the year.
- Poplar Bluff, Mo.** Held a crippled children's clinic in the county court house. Fifty-three children were examined by an orthopedic surgeon with doctor members of our club assisting. Fifteen children were given special treatments, and 11 others were sent to hospitals throughout Missouri for correction of physical defects.
- Port Arthur-Fort William, Ont.** The annual report of our Under-Privileged Child Committee shows \$497.00 was spent throughout the year for clothing, glasses, appliances, medical service, and Christmas cheer. One boy, 16 years of age, who had a leg amputated, was supplied an artificial one.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Physical)—Cont.

- Richmond, Ind.** Through our Child Welfare Committee we have assisted the Salvation Army in carrying on a baby clinic. Fifty dollars was voted to the support of this clinic. The money was obtained through a Kiwanis style show.
- Riverside, Detroit, Mich.** Our club physicians performed six tonsil and two eye operations. The club paid \$110.00 as a hospital fee. We also contributed \$550.00 for the building of a Kiwanis cottage at the Salvation Army children's fresh air camp.
- Rogers Park, Chicago.** We have purchased necessary equipment used in the instruction of children afflicted with deafness. Classes for these deaf mutes have been started and about 12 pupils are taking instructions.
- St. Thomas, Ont.** We continue to transport crippled children to and from hospitals each week. Approximately 50 children are treated at our clinic every year.
- Salina, Kan.** We have been instrumental in securing the services of a specialist who holds regular weekly meetings for children with impaired speech.
- Salisbury, N. C.** More than 104 crippled children have been treated at the orthopedic hospital through the efforts of our club.
- San Fernando, Calif.** We are contributing \$15.00 each month to the McKinley Home for Boys.
- Sanford, Fla.** We realized \$165.00 from a movie which was given through the courtesy of one of our members, a theater manager. This money was used for our under-privileged child fund.
- San Francisco, Calif.** Assistance is given the Neighborhood Association Hospital. This organization submits a monthly clinic report showing the total number of children treated, the number examined by doctors, cases admitted to the hospital, cases referred to other clinics, and the number of neighborhood calls made by nurses.
- Sanger, Calif.** We purchased eye glasses for children whose parents are unable to furnish them.
- Santa Rosa, Calif.** Our club provided dental work for a young college man who was compelled to give up his studies due to diseased teeth.
- Shreveport, La.** We have pledged our support to assist a society for crippled children.
- South Bend, Ind.** Our activity is the Kiwanis Sunshine room. We furnished orthopedic appliances, glasses and three pairs of crutches.
- South Portland, Me.** The sum of \$804.00 was received from the "Kiwanis Kapers" and was used for the under-privileged child fund. This assisted us to complete hospital care and treatment for 44 children. Tubercular tests were given children and milk was supplied the needy.
- South Side, St. Louis, Mo.** The club continues to furnish clothing, car fare, milk, food, school supplies and coal for unfortunate children and their families. Employment was found for mothers who needed assistance. The Missouri Society for Crippled Children is given our help.
- Southwest St. Louis, Mo.** We have purchased 25 radio ear phone sets which were presented to the Koch Tubercular Institution.
- Spartanburg, S. C.** In our annual diphtheria campaign 2,000 children were inoculated against this disease. This immunization work was started about five years ago. At that time there were 15 deaths reported, yet during 1935 but one resulted. This is a very outstanding accomplishment.
- Springfield, Ill.** We held our annual newspaper sale which gave us \$615.00. This sum was used for an ice fund for babies of under-privileged families.
- Springfield, Ohio.** We are giving financial and personal support to a defective speech clinic. We have purchased an extensive amount of equipment for this clinic.
- Taft, Calif.** All civic and other organizations were asked for their co-operation to make President Roosevelt's birthday ball a success. This affair gave us \$250.00 for infantile paralysis assistance in our community.
- Topeka, Kan.** One girl's testimony is the best way of expressing our successful under-privileged child activities. "I am very grateful for my glasses. I can see much better now! I am not so nervous. I can see plainly many things I could hardly see before!"
- Tulsa, Okla.** We have just spent \$450.00 in purchasing eye refraction and other eye testing equipment to be used in a hospital where needy patients receive aid.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Physical)—Cont.

- Vienna, Ill.** We were instrumental in having arrangements made for the county nurse to visit all schools and make a thorough health inspection. The nurse works under the direction of the county superintendent of schools, who arranged for each school district to assist in defraying part of the expense.
- War, W. Va.** With the co-operation of the Parent-Teachers' Association we were able to support a clinic where 33 pre-school children have been given diphtheria inoculations.
- Washington, D. C.** We donated \$500.00 to a children's hospital to assist in defraying the expenses of new x-ray equipment. We spent \$200.00 to assist a crippled child taking special treatment. This child, if not given these treatments, would have been crippled for life.
- Waterbury, Conn.** During 1936, 530 treatments were given at our infantile paralysis clinic. The total expenditure was \$350.00.
- West Palm Beach, Fla.** The club continues to operate three clinics. The medical and surgical clinic in 1936 cared for 303 cases at a cost of \$1,405.21; the eye, ear, nose and throat clinic, 485 cases at \$1,015.69; and the dental clinic 6,664 cases, costing \$4,281.90. Eighty-three children were given glasses. A summer camp is maintained for boys and girls. The 11th annual under-privileged child benefit show gave the club \$10,000.00 for its welfare work. Stars from stage, radio and screen took part in the entertainment.
- West Point, Va.** We furnished eye glasses for 40 children. One hundred dollars was given to continue the support of one of our under-privileged girls in a hospital. Another \$100.00 was given a county nurse. An entertainment gave us \$750.00 for the under-privileged child fund.
- Wichita, Kan.** Assistance was given for an immunization campaign, which reached 25,000 children.
- Winnipeg, Man.** Four thousand children were examined and 10 per cent were found to be partially deaf, but assistance was available. We donated \$25.00 to a needy boy afflicted with tuberculosis.
- Woodbury, N. J.** Our seventh annual theater party was given with two evening performances and a special children's matinee. Twenty-three thousand persons attended the performances. We realized \$411.00 for our under-privileged child fund which aids our dental clinic. Over 1,700 tonsilectomies have been given to children.

The following clubs, while offering various forms of service to the under-privileged, were engaged in securing surgical treatment and hospital care for children, organizing eye, ear, nose, throat, dental and orthopedic clinics, giving aid to the deaf and the blind, supervising the President's birthday ball, and purchasing equipment for hospitals and schools for crippled and sub-normal children:

- Alamosa, Colo.** We are continuing our activity collecting magazines to be furnished to rural schools.
- Alexandria, Va.** Approximately 480 under-privileged children have been given free trips to motion picture theaters. We are continuing our summer camp activities.
- Algona, Iowa.** The city playground supervisor was given funds to purchase new bathing suits for poor children.
- Allentown, Pa.** We furnish 100 boys and girls with memberships in the Y. M. C. A. and Y. W. C. A.
- Amarillo, Tex.** We supply shoes and milk to under-privileged children. Turkeys and 1,800 pounds of potatoes were provided for an orphanage.
- Americus, Ga.** Contributed \$25.00 to be used to purchase school books for children.
- Ann Arbor, Mich.** Members of the 4-H clubs co-operated in an annual sale which realized \$2,100.00 for welfare work. Kiwanians act as Big Brothers to delinquent boys and girls.
- Atlanta, Ga.** We are building a cottage in the North Georgia mountains to be used as a boys' camp. This cottage accommodates 24 boys and is completely equipped with furniture, blankets, etc., at an approximate cost of \$1,000.00. We have also undertaken to send two 17-year old orphan boys to the Young Harris College of Georgia, at a cost of \$45.00 per month. These two brothers were badly under-nourished and in a severe anemic condition. It is our hope that they will greatly improve their physical condition while attending school.
- Bartlesville, Okla.** We have a fund for taking care of needy news boys. We furnish shoes, socks, sweaters, underwear and other necessities including medical and dental aid.
- Boise, Idaho.** Co-operated with school authorities for purchasing supplies and clothing for children. We have also arranged employment so boys might pay their board.
- Bradenton, Fla.** We are financing through special subscription, to the extent of \$10,000.00, a tourist camp. The proceeds are to be used for our under-privileged child activities.
- Bridgeport, Conn.** A delegation went to the Undercliffe Sanatorium to present scout equipment to the boys, who are afflicted with tuberculosis.
- Bridgeton, N. J.** We are supplying clothing and shoes to poor children enabling them to continue attending school.
- Calgary, Alta.** Members were assigned to the annual \$7,000.00 drive for funds for the Woods Christian Home.
- Cedartown, Ga.** We voted to continue an appropriation to keep one boy and one girl in high school. Clothing, books and tuition are provided.
- Charlottesville, Va.** We formed a Comrade Club among our members who are to look after the youngsters at a children's home. We installed playground equipment at a cost of \$500.00 for these children. Our club is also undertaking the responsibility for financing two boys sent to the Blue Ridge Industrial School.
- Chatham, Ont.** We supplied shoes, clothing, eye glasses, school books, milk and cod liver oil to a group of children whose families are unable to provide these necessities.
- Cle Elum, Wash.** The boy scout troop co-operated with us in the collection and distribution of over a ton of material such as clothing, magazines and other items for children in our community and in the rural districts.
- Crawfordsville, Ind.** Members were assigned to boys in need. Each Kiwanian contacted his boy, purchased the necessary articles of clothing and supplies that were needed. Checks are made on attendance at school in an attempt to inspire better school work and create a desire to make good in later life.
- Davenport, Iowa.** We are furnishing flowers each week to children in the various hospitals.
- Elizabeth City, N. C.** Appropriated \$60.00 toward paying the salary of a director in a summer recreational program.
- El Segundo, Calif.** We took up a special collection for a blind girl to purchase food for her dog.

- Englewood, Chicago.** Milk is being supplied to 16 children of the Parker Deaf Oral school. Weekly swimming lessons are furnished to 50 boys at a crippled children's school. Three of our members serve on a board of a juvenile home. Built and presented a large ping-pong table to the Protestant Child Haven.
- Escondido, Calif.** We are assisting in the operation of a store set up for a blind boy. We also bought him a Seeing Eye dog. He is endeavoring to make himself self-supporting.
- Eugene, Ore.** Support is being given for a nursery for pre-school children of women who are forced to work. We are making available transportation to and from the school for these children.
- Eureka, Calif.** We secured 25 copies of Boys Life magazine for distribution to boys in the county hospital.
- Eureka, Ill.** We financed lessons in voice for a crippled boy.
- Florence, Ala.** Rehabilitating a family consisting of the mother and six children. One member let them have a house, rent free, the club furnished clothing, food and purchased school books. We raised \$190.00 to continue this service and are planning ways to supplement this amount.
- Freeport, N. Y.** We purchased a piano to be given to a blind boy who is musically inclined.
- Highland Park, Calif.** Our club voted to take a life membership in the California Children's Home Society.
- Hillsboro, Ill.** School books are provided for boys and girls who otherwise would be unable to attend school.
- Hillsdale, Mich.** We have opened an office which schedules odd jobs for young people of school age.
- Jonesboro, Ark.** Through the cooperation of other civic clubs and the mayor of our city, school books, clothing and food were furnished for approximately 340 under-privileged children, of which 150 have never been to school.
- Little Rock, Ark.** We installed book-shelves in the Arkansas Children's Home at a cost of \$100.00. Members of the club gave 1,000 books. Our goal is for 2,500 additional. The W. P. A. improvement to the Kiwanis camp at a cost of \$20,000.00 was started. This includes 14 bunk houses, a swimming pool, bathing house, emergency hospital, and caretaker's cottage.
- Mansfield, Ohio.** We have just completed an addition to a playground, purchased gymnasium equipment and built a wading pool for the children of our Friendly Settlement House.
- Morristown, Tenn.** Books and school supplies, were purchased for boys who would not accept them as gifts. They preferred to work for members to pay for these.
- Muscatine, Iowa.** We assisted a mother and her two children, who were deserted by the father, in obtaining a satisfactory dwelling place. Sufficient aid from the county was sought. The two children were sadly neglected before we took them under our guidance.
- Neillsville, Wis.** Found a home and gave financial assistance to a crippled girl attending high school.
- Newark, Ohio.** Doctors examined 75 children, prospects for our health camp. We provided a wading pool at a cost of \$340.00 for the camp.
- Oroville, Calif.** Providing shoes and other necessities for children attending school. Medical care is available for poor families.
- Owosso, Mich.** Clothing was provided for a blind youth. Also gave three other children glasses.
- Palmdale, Calif.** Furnished medical attention for sick and needy children. We were instrumental in providing a home for a needy orphan boy.
- Pasco Wash.** Seven tonsil operations were performed by Kiwanis doctors. We are continuing our efforts in providing an employment service for the less fortunate high school students.
- Pauls Valley, Okla.** A survey was made for children who are without necessary clothing and supplies for attending school. These were purchased.
- Rochester, N. Y.** The Joy Car took over 6,000 children and 850 adults from 35 institutions to parks and lakes for recreation.
- St. Lawrence, Montreal, P. Q.** We cooperated with other service clubs in promoting the Colleen Moore doll house exhibit. The net proceeds of \$5,567.07 was divided equally among four institutions, each benefiting to the extent of \$1,391.75.

- Santa Barbara, Calif.** We paid the expenses for several boys attending a Y. M. C. A. summer camp.
- Santa Monica, Calif.** Contributed \$50.00 to a summer camp for under-privileged boys and girls. We also undertook building a balcony to the day nursery at a cost of \$500.00. A blind girl was assisted in purchasing a Seeing Eye dog.
- Sault Ste. Marie, Mich.** Collected books, magazines, phonograph records and toys for children quarantined with scarlet fever.
- Savannah, Ga.** We completely renovated the Kiwanis sunshine unit building at an approximate cost of \$200.00.
- Sioux City, Iowa.** Each Sunday morning we furnish a rose for the room of every child in all of our city hospitals.
- Smithfield, N. C.** Staged our third annual merchants' exposition and automobile show which netted about \$1,000.00 profit. Proceeds were used to further our activities with under-privileged children.
- Snoqualmie, Wash.** The father of a 13-year old girl asked us to assist in finding a home for her. The father had been pronounced mentally incompetent and the mother refused to take care of her daughter. A splendid home was obtained for the child.
- South Euclid, Ohio.** We sponsored a minstrel show, the cast made up of 76 people mostly high school students, who were very eager to cooperate in staging this entertainment for the benefit of under-privileged children. This show enabled us to clear \$300.00.
- South Gate-Walnut Park, Calif.** We sent 78 boys and girls to a Salvation Army camp. Fifty boys also had a week's outing at a summer camp. Two girls from poor families were placed in permanent positions.
- South Pasadena, Calif.** We are caring for a boy by paying his room and board so he could continue his high school education.
- South Tacoma, Wash.** Tools and lumber were bought to equip a work room at an orphanage. Cloth for girls' sewing classes was also supplied.
- Texarkana, Tex.** Secured the cooperation of the W. P. A. administrator in our territory to assist in furnishing various equipment for our children's nursery. Members of our club also responded most generously.
- Toronto, Ont.** We supplied two modern sewing machines to an infants' home to enable a sewing circle to make more clothing for the children. Furnished drawing material and instructions for a young crippled boy.
- Trinidad, Colo.** A sum of \$350.00 was used as a milk fund.
- Tujunga, Calif.** A Thanksgiving dinner was given for 135 under-privileged children.
- West Toronto, Ont.** Our model home exhibit closed with a profit of \$2,500.00. Our annual hockey game gave us \$1,500.00 which was divided between the Riverdale and West Toronto clubs, and is to be used exclusively for the under-privileged children's fund.
- Wichita Falls, Tex.** Plans for the building of a new unit to the \$35,000.00 day nursery erected in 1925, was definitely decided upon and fund raising started. The new unit calls for a contract of about \$10,000.00.

Health Centers, Children's Hospitals, Day Nurseries and Camps

- Altoona, Pa.** From a list of 200 names, 50 under-nourished boys were selected to be sent to our children's health farm owned and operated by our club. These boys were cared for at this farm for a six-weeks' period under expert supervision.
- Ashtabula, Ohio.** The Griswold Preventorium cared for 49 children throughout the season. We have made extensive alterations and improvements at this camp which has enabled us to operate for about \$200.00 less than in previous years.
- Bloomington, Ill.** Ninety under-nourished children selected by our city health department were sent to the Kiwanis health camp for three weeks. These children are given the benefit of good food, plenty of milk and cod liver oil. They also had recreational instruction.
- Brantford, Ont.** We conducted an under-privileged children's camp. One hundred and seventy-two girls were given two-weeks' holiday. The total cost to operate the camp was \$1,433.81.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Gen. Assistance)—Cont.

- Brockton, Mass.** We sent 13 under-privileged children to a health camp for an eight-weeks' period at a cost of \$97.50 per week.
- Coeur d'Alene, Idaho.** The Kiwanis health camp entertained 45 children for a period of six weeks. Twenty-two of them took swimming lessons and 11 passed the Red Cross examination. Every child received a physical check-up by Kiwanis doctors and dentists. During the year, \$300.00 was spent in improvements for this camp.
- Flint, Mich.** Contributions for necessary equipment were made by our members to continue the operation of our health camp which accommodates 100 children.
- Geneva, Ohio.** We continued to combine our efforts with the Ashtabula and Conneaut Kiwanis clubs in the support of the Griswold Preventorium which is a fresh air camp for under-privileged children.
- Girard, Ohio.** We united our efforts with the Niles and Warren clubs in operating a fresh air camp. Thirty-six children were sent to this camp under the supervision of competent nurses.
- Greenville, Miss.** We provided \$360.00 to send 60 under-privileged girls to a camp in the Ozark mountains.
- Greenville, Ohio.** Thirty under-privileged boys were sent to our summer camp. During the first three-weeks' stay there was an average gain in weight of three and one-half pounds per boy. To continue the support of this camp, \$700.00 was raised by selling tickets on an automobile.
- Hackensack, N. J.** Over \$450.00 was collected during the year to continue the work at our summer camp. Thirty-one boys and girls were sent to camp.
- Huntingdon, Pa.** Thirty-two under-privileged boys were given a six-weeks' camp vacation. These boys were selected from poor homes in various parts of the county. They range in age from 8 to 12 years. The cost for this camp was \$1,200.00.
- Jersey City, N. J.** We selected 100 boys from a list of 800 applicants for a month's vacation at one of our local summer camps. This work cost approximately \$2,200.00.
- Kalamazoo, Mich.** Five hundred children were sent to our vacation camp for a two-weeks' outing. All these children were under 12 years of age.
- Lock Haven, Pa.** Our committee on building is in charge of the new \$20,000.00 health camp which is being constructed for under-privileged children.
- Niles, Ohio.** At our fresh air camp, 16 boys had a total gain in weight of three pounds each. The 20 girls averaged a gain of four and one-half pounds. Our camp will be operated for an eight-weeks' period this year.
- Norfolk, Va.** Our Kiwanis summer camp had a very successful season. After eight weeks it was reported that 90 children had been in attendance.
- Oshawa, Ont.** Three hundred boys from surrounding communities were given a week's vacation at a summer camp.
- Ottawa, Ont.** We are working on plans to build an addition to our summer camp to accommodate 50 additional needy mothers and their children.
- Peterborough, Ont.** Kiwanis doctors examined 137 children, the first group to be sent to our health camp. All children are sent to camp for periods from two to nine weeks, according to the special needs of the child. We supplied food, transportation, nurses and cooks for the camp.
- Pittsfield, Mass.** Our Kiwanis health camp gave 50 girls a two-months' vacation. Doctors of our club made periodical check-ups on these children.
- Portsmouth, Va.** The 11th consecutive year of operation of our fresh air farm for children was held in 1936. Boys and girls in alternate groups were sent to this camp. It was necessary to make many improvements this year, such as new showers, pumping equipment and improvements and repairs on the buildings.
- Ravenswood, Chicago.** We have undertaken the construction of a camp building at a site near Chicago. Carpenters were hired to erect the frame-work while our members assisted in completing the job. The larger portion of the material required for the construction of this camp was donated either by club members or their friends. The total estimated value is \$1,500.00.
- Reading, Pa.** Kiwanians transported 66 boys and girls to the Kiwanis preventorium. All children attending are tuberculosis contact cases and examinations were made by the physicians of the club.
- St. Paul, Minn.** One hundred and twenty-seven girls and 61 boys were given a 10-days' outing at our Kiwanis camp.

THE UNDER-PRIVILEGED CHILD (Gen. Assistance)—Cont.

- San Jose, Calif.** We purchased a radio for the isolation ward at the county hospital.
- Sarasota, Fla.** We spent \$200.00 for general repairs at a Kiwanis camp. Twenty-eight members went to the camp and painted all four main buildings, while another group paid for the paint.
- South St. Paul, Minn.** We sponsored two amateur programs to raise funds for our summer camp. Through this effort the sum of \$300.00 was secured.
- Southwest Detroit, Mich.** We donated \$50.00 to a children's hospital at Ann Arbor, and purchased a chair for a crippled child.
- Spokane, Wash.** One hundred and sixteen under-nourished boys and girls from the Pensioned Mothers' Homes attended the Kiwanis Health Center. The average gain in weight per child was three and one-tenth pounds. Club doctors determined the children who most needed this camp recreation. Free medical, surgical and optical examinations were given all the children. Doctors made weekly visits to inspect the camp. Voluntary subscriptions of \$2,485.00 were pledged for this activity.
- Troy, Ohio.** Our camp investment is \$4,512.00. During the 1936 season the camp was occupied by the Girl Scouts, Sunday school groups, 4-H clubs and others.
- Wenatchee, Wash.** Extensive building and improvements to our camp were made to the extent of \$1,000.00. This will greatly improve the facilities for the boys and girls who visit this camp each season.
- Windsor, Ont.** Two hundred girls were taken to our summer camp for two-week vacations. Trained supervision was provided. The camp is owned and operated by the club at a cost of approximately \$1,700.00

DEVELOPMENT OF BETTER TOWN AND COUNTRY RELATIONS

Kiwanis strives "To promote the spirit of mutual understanding between the farmer and the city man by encouraging an appreciation of their common aims and purposes." The accomplishments in furthering the development of better town and country relations, during 1936, shows varied activities of real value. The results for the past year were as follows:

General

- Aberdeen, Wash.** We combined our efforts with other influential men of our county in an effort to continue the office of the county agent. We also participated actively in preparation for the Washington State Grange convention. For the rental of the State Armory and to provide chairs and benches for this convention \$400.00 was raised. We also gave support to the 4-H fair which was held in our community.
- Abilene, Tex.** Combined our forces with the Chamber of Commerce in sponsoring a livestock and poultry show, and a sale for seven vocational agricultural classes. We sent out many letters to prospective buyers of these products. We held large rural meetings. The home demonstration club served the meal in family style to the entire 96 who were present. This afforded a better relationship between the farm and the city groups.
- Ahoskie, N. C.** We had a special farmers' night meeting and each member invited a farmer as his guest. The county agent was the guest speaker. A great interest was shown by all who attended.
- Alamosa, Colo.** Twenty-seven of our club members drove to a near-by town which is in the center of our agricultural district, to attend a dinner. Eighteen farmers were guests at this meeting. Our past president presented a proposal to secure a fire truck to serve the outlying agricultural district.
- Albert Lea, Minn.** Arrangements were made for a large farmers' meeting to be held in our high school gymnasium. Three thousand letters were sent out to leading farmers of the community.
- Americus, Ga.** We made up a purse of \$25.00 as first prize for any student in the county writing the best paper on soil erosion control.
- Ames, Iowa.** We held a special meeting to which the farmers were invited. The program predicted the outlook for 1937 in connection with prices of meats, poultry, eggs, butter, etc.
- Amsterdam, N. Y.** We held the annual farmers' night meeting in the rural section. Each Kiwanis was a guest of a farmer. As a novel get-acquainted idea there was an exchange of merchandise, each Kiwanian bringing something made in the city and each farmer brought some produce from his farm. This promotes good fellowship and friendly feeling between the rural and community sections.
- Anaconda, Mont.** Plans have been completed for a joint meeting with a farmers' union. This occasion was a dinner-dance, and created better fellowship.
- Arcadia, Fla.** We are cooperating with our farmers endeavoring to establish a better market for their produce. The agricultural committee is planning a county fair. Our county has just formed a poultry association under the guidance of one of our Kiwanians, who is the county agent.
- Arkansas City, Kan.** Our agricultural committee helped three farmers locate good teams for spring work. We also financed two farmers so they might purchase some pigs and another farmer was financed for getting a stallion.
- Asheville, N. C.** A special farmers' meeting was held and 10 outstanding farmers were our guests. The speaker was a state extension dairyman.
- Auburn, Neb.** We had as guests at one of our club meetings 25 farmers who took part in a pasture contest. The guest speaker was a professor from our state university. We had a joint meeting with the 4-H club boys and girls of the county. This meeting has done a lot to bring about a more friendly feeling.
- Bangor, Mich.** Our club has placed a large market bulletin next to the newspaper office. On this space are the listings of fruit and produce, quantity available and price, and the name of the grower. The purpose of this board is to acquaint the produce truck buyer of what produce is available, as our city is a center for buyers of fruit and vegetables. The farmer is also helped to dispose of his products.

- Bangor, Pa.** The club gave a banquet to 90 farmers and their wives. Special favors were given to each farmer's wife. Attendance is increasing each year at this meeting.
- Baxley, Ga.** We are cooperating with the farm agent in interesting farmers in planting of large acreages in cucumbers.
- Beacon, N. Y.** We invited Grange members to hear a program arranged by our agricultural committee. There were special talks arranged by the agronomist and livestock specialist of our state agricultural college.
- Bellaire, Ohio.** Held a meeting to which 25 farmers were invited as our guests. A program was arranged with a talking picture on "Feed Management of Dairy Cows."
- Bend, Ore.** We invited five leading farmers for a meeting when we had the manager of our creamery present. Business men subscribed enough stock to start a creamery for our county, which is in the heart of a dairy section. This is a very successful creamery and of considerable advantage for our dairymen.
- Birmingham, Ala.** Upon recommendation of our agricultural committee the board voted to contribute \$25.00 to be used in a better rural house campaign.
- Bloomington, Ill.** At a meeting for farmers we had as our guest speaker a professor from the University of Illinois. He presented an interesting illustrated lecture on diseases common to man and animal.
- Bowling Green, Ohio.** We brought 162 farmers from the surrounding community to a smoker. A novelty program was held with wrestling matches and gambling devices for which bogus money was used. A police raid was arranged as a climax. The farmer winning the most money during the evening was given a used automobile.
- Caldwell-West Essex, N. J.** At an agricultural meeting a moving picture film by the U. S. Department of Agriculture, "The Realm of the Honey Bee," was shown. The guest speaker was from a state bee association.
- Canton, Ohio.** Our club brought the secretary of the National Grange Association to address a joint meeting with 45 farmers. The subject for discussion was general farm conditions.
- Carmi, Ill.** Our club sponsored the fifth annual rooster day. We paid 11 cents a pound. There were a host of attractions sponsored by our city such as jack-pot draw of \$50.00 in cash, dare-devil thrills, band concert, boy and girl scout drills, etc.
- Charleston, Mo.** We held a special farmers' meeting. The International Harvester Company furnished a sound picture showing the planting and harvesting of soy beans.
- Cheyenne, Okla.** We entertained 10 farmers at one of our meetings and after listening to our regular program we invited them to make short talks.
- Clarion, Pa.** We entertained our capon club. The boys brought a capon display. Several of the boys' fathers accompanied them to this meeting. This gave us a closer contact with the farmer and his children.
- Columbiana, Ohio.** Eighteen agriculturists, mostly fruit growers, attended a farmers' night meeting. The speaker was a state horticulturist and a noted Grange lecturer, who described the various opportunities for selective crop raising throughout Ohio. This meeting was very effective in cementing rural and urban fellowship.
- Decatur, Ala.** A general country store was conducted from which the sum of \$882.07 was raised. The funds provided hitching yards and rest-rooms on each side of our city for convenience of farmers who come to trade.
- Devils Lake, N. D.** We promoted a seed clinic for the purpose of displaying good samples of grain adapted to our lake region. A seed school to study and discuss the proper type of seeds and various varieties was held.
- Greensburg, Ind.** On the verge of a milk war, the club being interested in the welfare of our community invited the various dairymen and milk retailers to meet with us. We had as a speaker an attorney of the Indiana Milk Control Board to explain the milk control law. This meeting developed into a legal hearing which was instrumental in bringing about a satisfactory solution to this milk problem.
- Greenville, Ky.** Our agricultural committee has secured and planted 200 acres of strawberries which next year will yield to the farmers approximately \$25,000.00.

- Helper, Utah.** We sponsored an exhibit showing farms, one before and another after improvement. This exhibit was arranged showing actual conditions on an unimproved farm with gully washes, forest fires, poor crops, etc. The other, the same farm with modern improvements, soil erosion control, reforestation, pasture lands, etc.
- Marengo, Ill.** We sponsored a farm products show. Every farmer was privileged to exhibit vegetables, eggs, grains and fruits with prizes donated by the merchants.
- Miles City, Mont.** We held our annual fall farmer frolic and entertained a large gathering. It was estimated that 1,600 were in attendance. The frolic started in the evening with a supper and entertainment, followed by dancing. During the evening prizes were given to the oldest farm couple present, the most recently married couple, the farmer coming the longest distance to attend, and the largest number of one family present.
- North Manchester, Ind.** We entertained 50 farmers with a poultry program.
- Oklahoma City, Okla.** One of our members visited various farms preparing for a farm and town meeting. The purpose of the meeting is to get better acquainted with the farmers and their problems.
- Ontario, Ore.** Every year we invite the farm women from all parts of our county to go to our summer camp at a nearby lake. This gives a real vacation for the women who are confined to their hard tasks. We furnish the Kiwanis camp site and the wives each pay a small sum for expenses. They have nothing to do but rest and swim, or to do what they please.
- Perry, Fla.** Our agricultural committee promoted a general farm tour of the county. The plan was for viewing the farms, looking over the cattle and crops and making a general survey. Farmers as well as the county agent accompanied us on this tour. Lunch was served at farm homes.
- Pierre, S. D.** The annual convention of the Iroquois Federation had attendance from all towns within 100 miles radius. A breakfast conference was held and in the afternoon there were games and sports. The evening was given over to a banquet, a program and dance.
- Providence, Ky.** The agricultural committee was responsible for having several carloads of lime brought into the county to be used on various farms.
- Racine, Wis.** We held a joint meeting with farmers. The speaker, a president of a creamery, spoke on better cooperation between the farmer and city men. The farmers furnished prizes to all Kiwanians. A farmers' banquet is held annually.
- Rutherfordton, N. C.** Our 10th farmers' night anniversary celebration was held to create a greater interest in the farmer and an incentive for men to improve their farms. Prizes were given for the highest yield in wheat per acre, per five acres and per farm. Similar awards were for cotton, corn and potatoes, and for the best record in poultry raising and meat production.
- Sanford, Fla.** Provided a motion picture showing the manner of inspection, sale and delivery and citrus fruits throughout the great market centers. Emphasis was placed on selection, quality and pack of fruit. All farmers invited were citrus growers.
- Shreveport, La.** Kiwanis is assisting a young farmer in renting land and by advancing funds for his work.
- Tampa, Fla.** The agricultural committee had the agent in charge of the United States experimental station prepare a number of statistics showing the increase or decrease in the production of Florida crops during the past 15 years, with recommendations for the future.
- Tonkawa, Okla.** Held a joint meeting with the Good-Will Grange. This is the best means for establishing a closer relationship with the farmers of our community.
- Victoria-Kenbridge, Va.** A special meeting was held at a farmer's home with 15 farmers as guests.
- Wabash, Ind.** Cooperated with representative farmers in promoting the annual colt show which is a very outstanding event for this section. Thousands of outside visitors are attracted to this show.

4-H Club Work

- Albany, N. Y.** We entertained 60 4-H club boys. Five spoke of their accomplishments and the prizes won at the New York state fair. Three of our 4-H boys rated second in the entire state as a judging team for all classes of livestock. Seven of the highest scoring boys were awarded a trip to the New York state agricultural college.
- Alva, Okla.** We had two of our 4-H club boys, who had been representatives at the state fair, give our club a demonstration of a terracing machine.
- Ann Arbor, Mich.** We entertained our 4-H club at a picnic held on the beach. There were 500 in attendance. A picnic lunch was served and the Kiwanians acted as waiters. The club furnished the coffee, lemonade and ice cream. Games and contests were held during the afternoon and free swimming was offered to the boys and girls.
- Anniston, Ala.** We cooperated in entertaining 400 4-H club members of surrounding counties who enjoyed entertainment at a picture show, and visits to a newspaper and Coca Cola plants.
- Antigo, Wis.** We entertained the high school forestry class and Future Farmers of America.
- Ardmore, Okla.** The agricultural committee conducted a calf and poultry show for the 4-H clubs of the county. This was the first show of its kind held here for the past three years.
- Astoria, Ore.** We have organized a 4-H boys' building club to assist those interested in woodwork and carpentry. We made a cash donation to assist in securing supplies necessary for the work.
- Athens, Tex.** We purchased eight pigs to be distributed to our 4-H club boys.
- Auburn, N. Y.** Two of our outstanding 4-H club boys were sent on a three-day forestry tour in the Adirondack mountains where the state forest preserves are located.
- Austin, Minn.** Every member of our club visits a boy or girl who is raising livestock. Approximately 35 Kiwanians have already made their visits to encourage these youngsters in their 4-H activities.
- Baltimore, Md.** We held our annual meeting for the 4-H boys of our county. In attendance were 28 Kiwanians, 31 guests and 50 boys.
- Barrie, Ont.** The 4-H boys exhibited hogs at the county fair. The government judges commented on the outstanding quality produced. The boys are endeavoring to stimulate greater interest and a better quality of bacon hogs in the county.

- Denison, Iowa.** Our club was invited to hold a meeting at a nearby CCC camp. This was arranged between the captain of the camp and our agricultural committee. The 4-H club from the surrounding communities were also invited. Our 4-H club boys put on an interesting demonstration on "Winter Feeding of Birds."
- Flint, Mich.** We sponsored a meeting with the county 4-H club boys and presented three of them with registered calves.
- Florence, S. C.** Our agricultural committee purchased 15 pigs and loaned them to boys of the 4-H club. The money used for the purchasing of these pigs will be paid back by the boys from the profits they receive from these pigs.
- Georgetown, Del.** We sponsored the raising of 600 baby chicks by a class of Future Farmers of America. Extensive records were kept on the amount of food, on growth, mortality percentage, etc. We guaranteed all expenses incident to the raising of these chicks. Members of our club contacted restaurants, hotels and markets to get buyers for 4-H club fat stock sold at a sale. We have also started a plan for placing city boys on farms throughout the summer months.

Fairs, Shows and Demonstrations

- Alice, Tex.** We assisted in promoting a cotton carnival. This was staged with a very impressive ceremony of the coronation of a cotton queen. The results were so successful that plans are now being made for a bigger and better carnival next year.
- Amarillo, Tex.** Held our annual program to which all farmers in this vicinity and the exhibitors at the state fair were invited as guests, and 275 persons attended. A box luncheon was served and special entertainment provided. All guests were given tickets for the races that followed.
- Anderson, Ind.** Committees were organized who arranged the annual 4-H fair. This fair gives the boys and girls of the county an opportunity to exhibit projects of gardens, livestock, home economics and leadership activities.
- Ashland, Va.** Our club furnished free all the iced tea, lemonade and cake for the homecoming crowd at the Patrick Henry bi-centennial. The farmers and others of the entire county were our guests. This bi-centennial attracted approximately 15,000 people, and was the largest spectacle ever known in this county. A pageant was staged which was essentially of historical value from our community standpoint. The United States Government gave us approximately \$10,000.00 to aid in this festival. The people of the county bought stock of nearly an equal amount.
- Center, Colo.** Our agricultural committee has been making plans for a potato show and fair, and \$600.00 was raised by the community to put on a two-day show. Special radio programs and entertainments were planned for this event.
- French Lick, Ind.** Held our second annual farmers' fall festival. Various displays of farm products including 4-H exhibits proved an excellent means for stimulating an interest among farmers. It also creates a desire for producing more and better products and livestock. There were various educational and commercial exhibits displayed by merchants.
- Greencastle, Ind.** Our club had full charge of the 4-H club fair. A large shed for the exhibit of cattle was built by our members.
- Greenfield, Mass.** We were instrumental in bringing the convention of the Massachusetts Agricultural Fair Association to our community.
- Hopkinsville, Ky.** We united our efforts with other service clubs in sponsoring a county agricultural fair.
- Hot Springs, Ark.** The club members all cooperated in the preparations of five fairs held in our county.
- La Jolla, Calif.** A special committee attended the corner stone ceremony of the new county fair grounds.
- Lexington, N. C.** Kiwanians have secured exhibits in the various schools for the divisional county fair.
- Manassas, Va.** A loving cup was presented to our Kiwanis Club for the best float displayed in a dairy festival.
- Manchester, Ga.** Our club advanced a plan for a community shed to be constructed for aiding the smaller fruit growers in our vicinity.
- Marianna, Fla.** We have outlined methods for obtaining a livestock show for the purpose of bettering the quality of cattle in our county.
- Moose Jaw, Sask.** We furnished a shield to the winning team of girls in a livestock judging class which participated at the Moose Jaw fair.
- North Fort Worth, Tex.** Our club sponsored the ceremonies at the stock show in North Fort Worth. Invitations were sent to the old timers of this community.

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE

- Ada, Okla.** Kiwanians spoke to high school students, explaining the educational training necessary for their business and professional pursuits. Vocational guidance books were purchased for the public library.
- Amarillo, Tex.** The Committee on Vocational Guidance has enlisted the aid of members who will attend meetings of students at the high school and college. These groups wish to discuss vocational training. A loan fund helps worthy students.
- Arlington, Va.** Forty prominent business and professional men gave vocational talks to over 1,000 young people.
- Atlanta, Ga.** A series of vocational guidance broadcasts, which included interviews with graduate students, was popular with our listeners. These broadcasts were given every Friday afternoon and the committee provides copies of the talks of these broadcasts. Kiwanians sponsor and advise young people in their vocational choice. A \$150.00 scholarship was awarded a young lady attending business school, where she will receive a complete secretarial course.
- Aurora, Ill.** Three high schools, with over 750 boys enrolled, heard vocational addresses on 28 different business and professional undertakings.
- Bedford, Ind.** Prizes were awarded to the members of the graduating classes writing the best essays on their vocational interests.
- Bend, Ore.** A 72-hour automobile course is conducted evenings by one of our members. The course is presented by lecture and actual demonstration work. Vocational assistance is available for the young people of our community.
- Berlin, N. H.** A vocational counsellor was brought to the city to assist young people in deciding on vocational interests.
- Bloomington, Ill.** Co-operation in vocational guidance is given the local schools. Some 255 high school students secured applications for definite vocational information and training.
- Boonville, Mo.** A nationally known vocational guidance expert was brought to the city to lecture to students, parents and teachers.
- Cedartown, Ga.** Addresses are given by Kiwanians on their vocational pursuits and the club is willing at all times to assist boys and girls with their problems.
- Champaign-Urbana, Ill.** Opportunity is now available for adults to attend night school to learn store management and general shop practices. Conferences are arranged so high school seniors may interview men whose businesses represent the vocational interests of these students. Permanent and temporary positions were found for a number of young people.
- Clarksburg, W. Va.** Four hundred senior high school students were interviewed and the club assists these young people in choosing their occupations.
- Clatskanie, Ore.** A vocational conference on "Choosing a Vocation," factory visits and the awarding of scholarships and personal interviews were all part of the vocational guidance program.
- Compton, Calif.** Interviews are available for all students who wish to confer with Kiwanians about their vocational interests. Vocational guidance material is published so that everyone might benefit from Kiwanis vocational guidance.
- Dallas, Tex.** Constructive work is under way with the newsboys of the city. Kiwanians contact these young people and interest them in the various business and professional occupations.
- Decatur, Ill.** Radio broadcasts on vocational guidance, the furnishing of typewriters, and interviews on air conditioning and retailing, and co-operation in a youth extension program was the work of the club during 1936.
- Duncan, Okla.** Each Kiwanian has prepared a lecture on his business or profession. This work will be placed in book form and available for the entire community. Boys and girls took an active interest in working in local stores. Business men are called to co-operate in assisting the young people to find their vocational interests.
- Elmhurst, Ill.** A vocational program was attended by over 1,400 students. These lectures reviewed the different vocations, scope of work, opportunities in each field, approximate salary range, advantages and disadvantages, preparation needed and best schools available. Students wishing personal interviews have the opportunity of contacting Kiwanians.

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE—Cont.

- Elmira, N. Y.** A Kiwanis book shelf has been established at the public library. Volumes on vocational guidance are available for boys and girls of the community who are interested in obtaining information and assistance in determining their future vocation.
- El Segundo, Calif.** A Key club has been organized for under-privileged boys. Each youth has a Kiwanis sponsor. A scholarship fund is available for those in need. Vocational service is available for all the young people.
- Euclid, Ohio.** Group conferences and individual interviews are part of our program for high school students who wish vocational advice. Young people are given the opportunity of going on industrial tours.
- Greencastle, Ind.** Encouragement and assistance is being given a group of boys who are entering their vocational lines. Kiwanians counsel these young people so they might have the benefit of experience.
- Harlan, Ky.** Over 300 aptitude tests and 500 questionnaires concerning vocational interests started the club's 1936 vocational program. One hundred high school students interviewed business and professional men regarding vocational responsibilities.
- Harrisburg, Ill.** A vocational library is being organized with information concerned with commerce, manufacturing, aviation and other travel transportation, domestic occupations, furniture making, meat packing, etc. A permanent record is being kept on eighth grade graduates and in this way the club can study what progress is being made by the young people. The Committee on Vocational Guidance offers lectures and personal interviews.
- Harrisburg, Pa.** The Committee on Vocational Guidance contacts June graduates and assists them in vocational guidance.
- Henrietta, Tex.** The club offered to the superintendent of schools a teacher on vocational guidance. A Kiwanian, Rev. Paul J. Merrill, taught a class of 30 boys and girls. Many of his pupils were placed with merchants and bankers so they might have part-time work and gain business experience. These young people changed positions frequently so they might find work for which they were best suited.
- Huntington Park, Calif.** Vocational guidance day was held with an attendance of over 1,100 boys. Conferences were divided into 24 vocational groups so lecture work might be conducted. Classes met to study insurance and other business subjects for which students declared a preference.
- Jackson, Ky.** Our vocational endeavors makes it possible to find employment and give instruction to about 50 young men and women between the ages of 18 and 25. Kiwanians spoke at a vocational guidance teachers' institute.
- Jackson, Miss.** Complete vocational guidance service is available for all high school students. A full series of vocational lectures and interviews was held at a nearby C. C. C. camp. The 185 young men participated and received a lot of help. Personal interviews can be arranged for any young man in the community who wishes information on such subjects as aviation, law, medicine, secretarial work and general business.
- Jersey City, N. J.** Each month there is a vocational broadcast held under the auspices of the club Committee on Vocational Guidance. These contain information on insurance, printing, property management, dentistry, public utilities, welfare work, religious teaching, architecture, etc.
- Joliet, Ill.** The Committee on Vocational Guidance conducted a total of 1,114 interviews during 1936 and was successful in finding employment for 41 girls and 56 boys. The majority of these jobs are permanent.
- Kansas City, Kan.** Thirty Kiwanians and other business men, skilled in the various vocational fields, lectured on vocational subjects to the classes in the high school and junior college.
- Lakeland, Fla.** Kiwanis has taken over the sponsorship of a vocational school opened by educational authorities. The school has an enrollment of about 130, who are interested in machine shop practice, wood working, drawing, domestic science and business courses. Vocational lectures by Kiwanians are held at the high school.
- Lewistown, Mont.** Over 50 students were placed in part-time employment. A series of vocational guidance articles were written for the local newspaper. A survey was made of business establishments to find out how many young people could be placed in stores and offices for vocational experience.

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE—Cont.

- Lexington, N. C.** A \$6,000.00 N. Y. A. appropriation was distributed among the county schools. A vocational program and industrial survey were part of the 1936 program. Business men give splendid co-operation in finding a place for young people who wish to further their vocational interests.
- Los Angeles, Calif.** High school seniors and members of the Key club at the McKinley Home receive vocational guidance assistance. Vocational guidance day found 1,000 boys hearing lectures on some chosen business or profession. Forty prominent men in the city co-operated to make this conference a success.
- Mendota, Ill.** A general survey was made to find all available positions for the youths of our community. There were conferences and interviews for senior high school boys. Visits were made to factories and prizes were offered for the best career books written by a senior.
- Miami, Fla.** Thirty-three vocational conferences were conducted for 1,850 high school students. After each speaker had presented his subject a round-table discussion followed. Vocational speakers were also engaged for all high schools.
- Middlesboro, Ky.** Prizes were given to the students writing the best letters on why they had chosen certain vocations.
- Milwaukee, Wis.** Kiwanians in group discussions and personal interviews offered vocational guidance service to all young people. The club has recommended to the school board that a full-time vocational guidance instructor be appointed.
- Missouri Valley, Iowa.** A merit award system was started for high school seniors. Those who are outstanding in their work have the opportunity of receiving scholarships. Through club efforts, a course on vocational guidance has been added in the local high school.
- Moberly, Mo.** Lectures on journalism, law and medicine were available for the boys and girls of our community.
- Monroe, La.** Over 100 meetings were held to discuss vocational problems for high school students. These meetings were presided over by business and professional men. Vocational books are being added to school libraries.
- Morgantown, W. Va.** The Committee on Vocational Guidance is in charge of three Key clubs, which hold meetings to discuss vocational problems. Arrangements were made to purchase a set of books on vocational guidance.
- Okanogan, Wash.** An employment bureau was operated during school months so worthy boys and girls could secure part-time jobs. We have a comprehensive program in vocational guidance for helping our young people.
- Olean, N. Y.** The Committee on Vocational Guidance works with 150 boys of a nearby C. C. C. camp, helping them to choose vocations for which they are best qualified.
- Olympia, Wash.** The record of vocational work for the year has been as follows: Total number of permanent and temporary jobs 313; 33 occupational talks to over 500 junior and senior students; purchased subscriptions to vocational magazines distributed to students and libraries; and 28 conferences to assist seniors in choosing their college courses or to discuss their entry into business.
- Phoenix, Ariz.** Business and professional men arranged to attend 110 conferences for students who desired vocational information. The entire club takes an active part in this work.
- Pineville, Ky.** A survey compiled information as to the education, occupation and address of all graduates of the high school since 1927. This is to help boys and girls of the community get the best business advantages and assist them in securing positions.
- Quincy, Ill.** A professional counsellor spent a week in the community working with students needing vocational guidance. This individual was brought to the community under the auspices of the Kiwanis club.
- Radford, Va.** Employment was found for 12 worthy young men.
- Rayville, La.** A general course in vocational guidance is being taught all high school students. Members assist in giving vocational and professional talks. The club works in co-operation with school authorities in this activity.
- Roswell, N. M.** A series of textbooks on vocational subjects were added to the libraries of the high school and New Mexico Military Institute.

VOCATIONAL GUIDANCE—Cont.

- Rutherford-South Bergen, N. J.** A Key club is interested in art, sewing, manual training and oratorical and composition contests. The school authorities are in sympathy with this movement. Early in 1936 a similar club was organized for girls, which was the first of its kind in New Jersey. Kiwanians visit the clubs and speak on business and professional requirements.
- St. Petersburg, Fla.** With financial assistance, 24 young women completed a beauty culture course at a vocational school. Young men in high school and college have the privilege of personally contacting the various business and professional men of the club to secure vocational direction.
- Salem, Ore.** Four hundred students are being given assistance in vocational guidance. The problems incidental to law, medicine, aviation, forestry, nursing, accounting, banking and insurance are covered thoroughly by experienced representatives.
- Salt Lake City, Utah.** The club believes individual guidance is the more effective and therefore boys are helped with their school work and given assistance and advice by Kiwanians. Intensive vocational guidance is given 2,000 boys and girls of the high schools.
- Seattle, Wash.** Members of the Committee on Vocational Guidance have been assigned to individual schools for which they are responsible. Talks are given by Kiwanians on all the important business and professional pursuits.
- Spokane Valley, Wash.** Loans were made to a young man to take a course in dairying and to a young woman so she could complete her journalism. Both now have good positions.
- Steelton, Pa.** Speakers were provided for 840 pupils who wished to have information on how to develop their vocational interests.
- Tillamook, Ore.** A youth, who lost all his fingers in an accident, is receiving Kiwanis help in his rehabilitation problem. A vocational guidance conference was held for all the high school students of the county. A regular lecture course on various vocations was conducted in the schools.
- Utica, N. Y.** Our vocational guidance members are helping high school students to plan their future careers. Visits were made to industrial plants and business houses. Vocational films were used in the schools.
- Valley City, N. D.** A vocational essay contest, the purchase of vocational books and interviews by business and professional members, were the high-lights of a vocational program.
- Vancouver, B. C.** Over 2,500 students attended vocational conferences, which discussed employment and careers. The club has available pamphlets on various vocations, which are distributed to young people.
- Washington, D. C.** Vocational guidance broadcasts were scheduled during the entire year. These talks discussed the professions and general business topics. Thousands of copies of the talks were distributed to those hearing the broadcasts and requesting information.
- Waterloo, Iowa.** A series of occupational group conferences were held in 1936, with a counsellor service for those seeking employment and other help. Kiwanians took part in lecturing on their business interests.
- Westminster, Md.** Articles were published on "Vocational Guidance," "How Parents Can Help in Vocational Guidance." These were distributed to those desiring information.
- Woodlawn, Chicago.** The club continues its junior executives' study group. Members act as counsellors for the high schools and technical schools. Advisory service for adults who have become unemployed or seek new professions and trades is also available.
- Yakima, Wash.** Held a find-yourself campaign to aid boys in selecting work for which they are best fitted. Speakers are provided for general school assemblies to speak on vocational guidance.

The following clubs had business and professional men give vocational guidance talks and lectures at schools, conducted group vocational meetings, opened employment bureaus and secured positions, sponsored mechanic and art clubs, granted personal interviews and provided counsel, gave radio talks on vocational guidance, sponsored Key clubs, provided vocational literature for schools and libraries, held find yourself campaigns, developed aptitude tests and used questionnaires in determining vocational needs and desires:

EDUCATIONAL WORK

Many activities were undertaken by Kiwanis clubs during the past twelve months. Educational assistance was given students, schools, faculties and authorities.

- Allentown, Pa.** Six prizes and medals were presented at the annual commencement of the high school to those who excelled during their four years in athletics, dramatics and English.
- Amarillo, Tex.** Assisted honor students in securing their caps and gowns for graduation time. The entire club is interested in the school budget system, general expenses and board of education work. Meetings are given over to discussions of school affairs.
- Asbury Park, N. J.** During the past 10 years, over 180 honor students have been presented with Kiwanis Builds Forever pins. Our efforts have raised the scholastic standing 20 per cent, according to school authorities. The students have what is known as a Kiwanis honor society.
- Asheboro, N. C.** The club sponsored a lyceum course. An essay and history contest was conducted for children in the city and county schools.
- Ashland, Ky.** Magazines are collected and sent to the settlement schools in the eastern part of the state. This is practically all the literature which these schools receive.
- Atlanta, Ga.** The club offers an annual scholarship and pays the tuition for several young people attending college.
- Atlantic City, N. J.** The graduating class of 477 young people and their parents were entertained. This is an annual custom. The club awards a medal to the outstanding student in social studies and citizenship. A typewriter was awarded to the leading student in the commercial course.
- Barbourville, Ky.** A county spelling bee was sponsored for the rural schools.
- Batavia, N. Y.** Three students have been awarded scholarships and all have begun their correspondence courses.
- Battle Creek, Mich.** A contest in extemporaneous speaking, with prizes for the winners, was a valuable activity of the club.
- Billings, Mont.** A tour of local industrial plants was held for all honor students in the rural schools. They were guests of the club and wrote essays on their observations. Kiwanians awarded prizes to the winners.
- Bourne, Mass.** Entertainment was provided for the graduating classes of the grammar schools. Sponsored an essay contest and held an amateur night with 49 acts, which raised \$100.00 for educational endeavors.
- Brockton, Mass.** Dictionaries were awarded to all contestants in a spelling bee and the winners were given special prizes. Students were entertained at our meetings.
- Canonsburg, Pa.** Kiwanis sponsored a clean speech club in the community and received over 1,000 pledges.
- Carbon Hill, Ala.** The club is working to introduce vocational agriculture and home economics as part of the high school curriculum.
- Casper, Wyo.** An extemporaneous speaking contest, a series of one-act plays and debates were the 1936 educational activities of the club.
- Chattanooga, Tenn.** A share-your-books campaign brought in over 5,000 volumes and magazines, which were classified and supplied to various educational institutions in the city and county.
- Cheyenne, Okla.** A citizenship medal was offered the high school student having the best record. Entertained all honor students and teachers of the county and city schools. Talented children appear at club meetings to give readings and musical selections.
- Cincinnati, Ohio.** A number of meetings were held with officials so two correctional schools might be kept open. The Committee on Public Affairs studied a proposed tax levy for the purpose of improving school buildings and the erection of new ones.
- Columbus, Miss.** Two scholarships are maintained at the Mississippi State College for Women. Since its organization Kiwanis has helped over 20 girls.
- Columbus, Ohio.** A fund was available to pay the tuitions for worthy boys and girls enrolled in the summer schools. The pupils were chosen by officials on the basis of qualification in industry, dependability, courage and character.
- Coraopolis, Pa.** All Kiwanians contributed to a fund used in defraying expenses for sending high school debating teams to Oklahoma City to compete in a national tournament.

- East Dearborn, Mich.** To interest the youth in local problems, an annual civic planning essay contest is held. The contest provides for recognizing the contributions made by these young people.
- El Reno, Okla.** Students selected by the faculty attend Kiwanis meetings for six-week periods so they may become acquainted with the objectives of our service club.
- Glendora, Calif.** Conducted an essay contest on world peace for over 400 students. An essay contest on fire prevention was held with the co-operation of the United States Forestry Service. Students appeared before the club and spoke on topics taken from *The Kiwanis Magazine*.
- Greenville, Ky.** A citizenship cup is offered to the best citizen graduating from the high school. Each organization in our city has a rating form and this is used to grade students who are eligible for the cup.
- Hamilton, Ohio.** Fifty-two worthy students were given help and correspondence courses. The students selected were those deprived of education through no fault of their own.
- Hamilton, Ont.** A student who has been under Kiwanis guidance for some years completed his final university year, graduating with a degree of Bachelor of Science. His winning a medal and scholarship permits him to return to take additional work. The cost of his university course has been paid by the club, which feels gratified by the wonderful results produced by this young man.
- Henrietta, Tex.** A trophy cup is used for the rural schools in a challenging effort to raise educational standards. Boys and girls are invited to attend club meetings. They are awarded a small amount of money in recognition of their good school work.
- Jackson, Ky.** Over 3,000 children from 75 county schools attended the third annual school fair. Each Kiwanian does his part in making this fair a success. Over 600 young people entered the various contests.
- Lancaster, Calif.** The club is interested in stimulating an adult educational program.
- Lindsay, Ont.** A cooking school was organized and women were given the opportunity to hear talks on cooking and home economics. Hundreds of prizes, donated by merchants, were distributed.
- Marion, Ohio.** Young people are selected from the senior high schools of the city to attend Kiwanis functions.
- Maryville-Alcoa, Tenn.** The club awards a \$150.00 scholarship, which allows a young person to become enrolled in a correspondence course. The debating team appeared before the club to discuss limiting the powers of the supreme court.
- Mason City, Iowa.** Held the 10th annual luncheon for the high school and junior college honor students. Honor student requirements are that semester grades in all subjects must be 90 or above and over 180 students received such excellent ratings.
- Massillon, Ohio.** A scholarship foundation was created to make it possible to raise funds for helping exceptional students who have no financial means to attend college.
- Meade, Kan.** Young men just out of high school, who work for Kiwanians, attend our weekly meetings to become familiar with Kiwanis and civic club work.
- Medicine Hat, Alta.** Thirty-three schools, within a radius of 25 miles, were visited and supplied with candy and athletic equipment. These rural school visitations keep us in close touch with educational projects. School books were purchased for pupils whose parents were too poor to buy these necessities.
- Milwaukee, Wis.** Edmund Lewandowski, who was awarded a Kiwanis scholarship for art study, has received national recognition for his paintings, according to the Downtown Gallery of New York. He is one of 15 young Americans whose work is expected to have permanent value. Monthly checks are sent to youngsters who have been given scholarships.
- Minnesota-Dakotas Kiwanis District.** The Kiwanis Foundation has made a total of 23 loans in the past three years, amounting to \$3,742.21. Of this number, 12 have already been repaid in full, totaling \$2,238.43.
- Paterson, N. J.** Kiwanis assistance was given in conducting a series of forum lectures.
- Pendleton, Ore.** During the year Kiwanians helped to sponsor dances and entertainment for high school students. The club had a reception for all the school teachers.

- Peninsula-Portland, Ore.** Funds were raised to award scholarships and Kiwanis is interested in a movement for securing university extension classes in the Peninsula area.
- Richmond, Ind.** The annual county spelling contest was held for all grades from the sixth to the twelfth. Prizes were purchased for the winners in each grade contest. A citizenship essay contest was also part of our educational program.
- St. John, N. B.** Kiwanis observed Canadian Education Week and invited school authorities to attend the meeting.
- Salt Lake City, Utah.** Observed American Education Week and National Book Week. Awarded trophies to the winners in an R. O. T. C. program. Over 1,000 cadets took part in the competition. All three Salt Lake City high schools received national honors for their R. O. T. C. work.
- Sidney, Mont.** The annual industrial tour for rural honor students was held. The young people from all the county and rural communities visited the industrial plants and attended a Kiwanis program. Expenses were paid to send delegates to a state high school meeting.
- Sistersville, W. Va.** Prizes are offered for school pupils who present the best essays on "The Value of a Kiwanis Club to Its Community."
- Valley City, N. D.** Each year county and city school declamation and spelling contests are held. Medals are provided for the victors. The eighth annual play contest found every one of the 20 high schools outside of Valley City competing. Over 115 students took part. The contest was divided into two divisions, dramatic and humorous.
- Williamson, W. Va.** The county school board dismissed 60 experienced teachers. Indignation was high, charging high-handed politics! A ruling by the board of education declared that native teachers would be given preference over others, regardless of ability. The club took an active part in getting this serious situation straightened out. Ability and qualification are given first consideration in hiring teachers. Twenty-five of the 60 dismissed instructors were rehired.
- Willows, Calif.** An annual custom is to honor the college students who are home on vacations. Fourteen Kiwanians assisted in conducting a forum which consists of lectures and music.

- Aberdeen, Wash.** Our club investigated the registration status of each member, their wives and friends to make sure all were registered and eligible to vote at an election. During election day everyone was contacted to ascertain whether or not they had voted.
- Ambler, Pa.** We celebrated Constitution Week by having special speakers at our club meeting. The various issues of the two political parties were discussed before the national election.
- Asheville, N. C.** A non-partisan discussion was held in reference to the five constitutional amendments affecting North Carolina.
- Ashtabula, Ohio.** A citizenship class was conducted at the Chamber of Commerce. Our Kiwanis club offered transportation to those who cared to go to the county seat upon completion of this course.
- Atchison, Kan.** All candidates for office in the county were guests of our club. The 33 candidates present were asked questions about civic and county problems. This proved a very interesting meeting.
- Bend, Ore.** We have been conducting meetings every two weeks for the purpose of preparing 40 of our people for citizenship.
- Berkeley, Calif.** Our Kiwanis club served as host for a city-wide meeting at which the Wheeler Award Medal was presented for outstanding citizenship. This award is made every two years. Constitution Day was celebrated at our regular noon day meeting.

- Glendale, Calif.** One of our members conducted a class in leadership and citizenship for 60 young people of our community who voted for the first time. Another member established and maintained a students' forum one night a week for the discussion of citizenship and political problems.
- Grand Forks, N. D.** Arranged a public recognition dinner for Kiwanian W. P. Davies who is the editor of our daily paper, and has completed his 40th year in the newspaper work.
- Gulfport, Miss.** We cooperated with other clubs in holding a joint civic luncheon in honor of the re-election of our mayor and commissioners.
- Harrisburg, Ill.** Held an inter-club meeting with a nearby Kiwanis club celebrating Constitution Week. - Long Beach, Calif.** We are sponsoring a series of lecture and discussion courses which are being given under the auspices of the high school. These lectures are open to the public. Questions are open for discussion.
- Marion, Ohio.** Our club cooperated with the Junior Chamber of Commerce in a "Get Out the Vote" campaign.
- Milwaukee, Wis.** We distributed vote reminder cards to our membership. We also arranged to have Kiwanis vote reminders placed in all city streetcars.
- Moberly, Mo.** Our Public Relations Committee has been assigned the last meeting of each month for a round table discussion of local, state and national problems. Prominent speakers take part during these meetings.
- New Orleans, La.** We are planning to conduct a series of lectures for high school students on the subject of citizenship.
- Ocean Beach, Calif.** George Stephan, president of the La Jolla club, a retired attorney, gave a talk on the proposed 24 state amendments.

County commissioners have agreed to choose all election officials from this list. Several Kiwanians served as special deputies at polling places.
- Topeka, Kan.** Kiwanians were on the official committee to notify Governor Alfred M. Landon of his nomination as Republican candidate for President. Over 100,000 people attended this occasion.
- Wausau, Wis.** To stimulate voting on November 3, 1936, our club distributed get-out-the-vote material on election day.

AID TO BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY

Many civic improvements, aimed to better general conditions in business and industry, were accomplished during 1936. They are classified here as improvements of a general nature, fairs, expositions, new markets, new industries, new hotels, and aviation.

Improvements of a General Nature

- Abilene, Tex.** Cooperated with the Chamber of Commerce in supporting a Made in Abilene Day. A carnival displayed all items manufactured by industries in our community.
- Albany, N. Y.** Cooperated with the city in celebrating the 250th anniversary. The charter was presented in 1686. Kiwanis was the only service organization entering a float in the parade.
- Big Stone Gap, Va.** Cooperated with business and professional men of our town who have put into operation, idle industrial plants. This will help solve the problem of unemployment in our community and expand business in general.
- Caldwell, Idaho.** Started a movement to redeem 100 lots that had been sold for taxes. Also starting a program for the construction of moderately priced homes. This program will develop approximately 50 new dwellings in our community, thereby giving employment to the idle trades industry.
- Caldwell-West Essex, N. J.** Started a novel idea for promoting industry by issuing a \$5.00 check from the club and circulating it through the membership. The idea back of this was to see what could be accomplished with \$5.00 in our community. An accurate account of the bills being paid with this check was kept.
- Elma, Wash.** The Business Standards committee worked on a plan for promoting good-will between employer and employe where industrial strife was brewing. We assisted in the peaceful settlement of these disputes.
- Englewood, Chicago.** We are trying to promote better business standards by giving publicity to complaints where there are sharp promotional practices employed.
- Eugene, Ore.** We are working hard to interest a flax plant in locating in our town. The plant is now under construction and this will add another industry to our community.

- Everett, Wash. We assisted in getting the desired number of votes at a special election for securing consent of the taxpayers to install an addition to the city water system. This will increase the water supply to one of the pulp mills and also increase the supply for all other mills.
- Falmouth, Mass. We are working to establish a board of trade in our city, and have solicited the cooperation of other local organizations for this development.
- Fennimore, Wis. We supported a three-day cooking school. This was attended by rural as well as city people. A style show and merchants' display were two features. This helped to stimulate better business.
- Fort Myers, Fla. We are cooperating with the local merchants in protecting them against fraudulent advertising and soliciting schemes.
- Fort Worth, Tex. We completed a plan for reserving parking space for out-of-town visitors attending our centennial. We believe this gave them a feeling they were welcome and that we were looking after their personal interests.
- Galveston, Tex. We are cooperating with other civic organizations for securing a new causeway constructed across Galveston Bay to connect Galveston Island with the mainland, thereby bringing more business to our community.
- Glenside, Pa. Assistance is given our high school in preparing information on community history. This is to be printed and will be available for distribution to attract tourists and bring additional business to our community.
- Grafton, W. Va. We are cooperating with the board of trade planning a merchants' picnic which will create a friendly feeling between the business and professional men.
- Greensburg, Ind. To celebrate National Insurance Week we secured our state insurance commissioner as a speaker. Twenty men and women guests who are interested in the insurance field were present.
- Harrisburg, Ill. Securing the aid of the state highway department for the preparation of a map of the southern Illinois counties showing the national forest units. These maps are to indicate various state highways leading into the forests and disclosing the historical points of interest along the way. We believe this will be a great aid to better business.
- Harvey, Ill. Secured the cooperation of all local business men in promoting a bargain day sale. Special publicity was given throughout the entire surrounding community.
- Hiawatha, Kan. In celebrating national railroad week, 20 of our members were guests at a nearby Kiwanis club where several railroad officials were present. A general inspection trip was made through the Rock Island railroad shops.
- Holdenville, Okla. Visited a Kiwanis club and invited as our guests local business men. This helped to create good-will.
- Holidaysburg, Pa. Special invitations were sent to the Kiwanis clubs in our district inviting them to meet with us during Centennial Week. The response was very gratifying. The total attendance at the centennial was 125,000 during one week. This was the largest celebration ever held in our community.
- Idaho Falls, Idaho. In celebrating railroad week we had as our guest speaker the local railroad agent.
- Jersey City, N. J. We combined our efforts with other local organizations to retain a large industry which had threatened to close and move elsewhere.
- Joliet, Ill. Our members have been working with a committee promoting a county centennial celebration. A huge pageant was held with an audience of 5,000 people. We feel that this was very worth-while as many foreign people were in the audience and the pageant promoted good citizenship.
- Kent, Wash. One of our members serving on the Public Affairs Committee has volunteered to record all jobs and jobs wanted in order to bring employer and employe together. This has greatly aided business as well as social life in our community.
- Kirksville, Mo. The club president and members of the Chamber of Commerce, retail merchants and Rotarians were invited to St. Louis, Mo., to attend a banquet given by the International Shoe Company. Civic clubs from 32 towns in which factories are located were in attendance.
- La Grange, Ill. Called on all merchants and professional men to discuss their advertising so it would not be misleading and conformed to the ethics of their professions.

AID TO BUSINESS AND INDUSTRY—Cont.

- Lexington, N. C.** Our Public Affairs Committee is working with the management of local plants that are idle. These plants may again be placed in operation and re-employ the people of our community.
- Madisonville, Ky.** A meeting of 15 non-member merchants was held to promote a trade-at-home campaign. This campaign was publicized through the newspapers and we have four special trade days during the year. Our newspaper printed a special eight-page supplement promoting this trade-at-home movement.
- Manasquan, N. J.** Water traffic is still growing and the facilities to handle this increase are rather inadequate. We are cooperating with the Manasquan River Protective Association to work out plans for improving this condition.
- Marlboro, Mass.** We are largely responsible for fostering the advancement of the Chamber of Commerce campaign for industrial recovery by obtaining the cooperation of the large industries which have contemplated upon closing their plants, throwing 2,400 people out of employment. Six hundred jobs were retained and before five months had elapsed 1,300 more were recovered.
- McAllen, Tex.** As our community is visited each winter by a great number of trailer car tourists we have promoted monthly programs to be presented for the entertainment of these people. The programs consist of musical numbers and travelogue talks on interesting historical places in our valley, where tourists might like to visit. The Chamber of Commerce is assisting us in this work.
- Merced, Calif.** We have cooperated with other service clubs and the Chamber of Commerce in establishing a welcome stranger register. Each visitor who registers is sent a special letter of welcome.
- Meridian, Miss.** We have joined with other civic clubs in making good-will visits to 16 nearby trade towns. This is a combined effort to stimulate better trade relations.
- Monte Vista, Colo.** Our town has a new bank. Complaints were received on the charges and methods of the new bank. We combined our efforts with other service organizations to hold a general meeting, invite the bank president to be our guest speaker. There were 125 in attendance and we enjoyed a very educational talk which outlined banking functions. The results were a friendlier attitude and a better understanding.
- North Oakland, Calif.** Two attorneys, members of our club, drafted a resolution protesting against the continuance of the longshoremen's strike. This was the first resolution that appeared in the local press. The club secretary appealed to President Roosevelt, Secretary of Labor Perkins, Senators Johnson and McAdoo, and Congressman Carter asking their cooperation to bring about arbitration in this strike.
- North Wilkesboro, N. C.** In order to stimulate more interest in our community, we are promoting a plan to have printed a better grade of picture postal cards. These are placed on sale in drug stores and hotels.
- Okeene, Okla.** For the observance of Golden Rule Week we secured the cooperation of several ministers who agreed to preach on the Golden Rule.
- Omak, Wash.** Club members contributed a great deal of help for the settlement of a mill strike.
- Oshkosh, Wis.** We are very much interested in advertising Winnebago land as a tourist center. A white bass festival was featured on May 15 and fishermen from Wisconsin and Illinois, and sports writers from metropolitan newspapers, were in attendance.
- Roseland, Chicago.** We are working with local service clubs for developing better business standards for our community.
- Smithfield, Utah.** We are cooperating with the city council in promoting an anti-peddling ordinance, thereby making any unlicensed solicitor guilty of a misdemeanor. This assists citizens to combat high-pressured salesmen.
- South Gate-Walnut Park, Calif.** Our business development committee has arranged a booklet for distribution telling reasons for living and doing business in South Gate.
- Thomasville, Ga.** We organized a young men's group to be known as the Kirov club. This organization meets weekly under a constitution and by-laws similar to Kiwanis, with special objectives adapted to the personnel of the membership. The club is composed of young business men not yet eligible for membership in Kiwanis.

Tyler, Tex. For the celebration of Golden Rule Week, special speakers were furnished to all schools. We also had announcements in all churches, placards were placed in the windows of business houses, and stickers furnished for automobiles, calling special attention to the Golden Rule Week.

Wabash, Ind. A special program entertained the executives of the General Tire and Rubber Company, which is a new industry coming to our city.

Warrenton, Ga. Our town being without a moving picture house, we are working on a plan for a new building to be constructed so this type of entertainment can be started.

Ypsilanti, Mich. The major portion of the work for the Ypsilanti pageant was done by Kiwanians.

BOYS' WORK

- Amarillo, Tex.** Boys paroled from the juvenile courts are turned over to Kiwanis Big Brothers, who assist them in their problems and seek the right kind of companionship for them.
- Arcadia, Fla.** Members of the Knot Hole club are given the opportunity of witnessing all the spring-training baseball games. Four hundred boys are members of this group.
- Arkansas City, Kan.** Employment was found for young men so they could be taken off relief rolls.
- Atlanta, Ga.** Kiwanians give assistance to young people paroled from the juvenile courts. The club operates Hillside Cottages for 86 boys and girls. Youngsters were sent to a summer camp and others were helped in their educational pursuits.
- Bangor, Mich.** A survey was made to find boys in the community who had lost their fathers. Kiwanians befriended these boys who need companionship and experience of older men.
- Bartlesville, Okla.** A newsboys' club meets twice a week under Kiwanis supervision. General welfare work is conducted for all these boys.
- Bellefontaine, Ohio.** Each member is assigned Big Brother duty. Problem boys from the courts are turned over to these Kiwanians.
- Butler, Pa.** Fifteen boys are receiving character building instruction. Those who get in trouble with the law are given aid and supervision.
- Canton, Ill.** The entire club membership is taking an active part in the organization of a boys' club to promote healthier and more law abiding young people. Instruction is given in government, citizenship and patriotism.
- Casper, Wyo.** Arrangements are made whereby delinquent boys and girls in the courts are turned over to our Committee on Boys and Girls Work. The club assumes the responsibility for the future of these delinquents.
- Chatham, Ont.** A Kiwanis Big Brother is appointed to each youth who needs personal supervision. A boys' club meets once a week for physical training, games and other supervised recreation. Several boys were placed on farms after their release from police court. One hundred boys were entertained at the Kiwanis camp.
- Cheyenne, Wyo.** Physical examinations and medical care are given the children at the Wyoming Home-Finding Society. All cases which arise in the juvenile court are given Kiwanis attention.
- Chicago Heights, Ill.** A Kiwanis manual training room has been equipped with tools and electric motors. This activity is a valuable one and a large number of children take advantage of experienced instruction.
- Clearfield, Pa.** The Committee on Boys and Girls Work is cooperating with the Huntington Industrial School of Correction. When boys are released from the institution attempts are made to secure jobs for them.
- Colorado Springs, Colo.** Over 350 boys from the poorer sections of the city are enrolled in a young people's club. Each youth is provided with clothing, shoes and other necessities. The youngsters are taught cabinet making and radio mechanics. Part-time employment is found for some of the boys. Shoe repairing outfits are provided by Kiwanians and the youths repair their own shoes.
- Columbus, Ohio.** Kiwanis took an active part in an annual charity drive and helped raise \$30000.00 which is used to buy fuel, clothing and food for those in need.
- Creston, Iowa.** A bird house building contest is open for all children. The club furnishes the prizes and the object is to encourage hobbies and an interest in nature. Another interesting contest is the preparation of notebooks on housekeeping.
- Dallas, Tex.** During the past six years the Kiwanis-newsboys' camp at White Rock has entertained thousands of young people. Kiwanis is sponsoring a club for young men, with membership limited to those between the ages of 20 and 30. It is hoped that this group will continue their service club work by becoming Kiwanians when they are old enough.
- DeLand, Fla.** A youngster being held in jail was placed in a better detention institution until a home could be found for him.
- Eagle Rock, Calif.** Cooperation was given to clean up a bad gang of young men hanging around street corners. Assisted boys to find employment. Held conferences with senior high school youths. Secured juvenile court releases for several offenders and found better environment for boys and girls who needed proper social supervision. A family relations' conference was arranged and a large number of the community attended.

BOYS' WORK—Cont.

- East Los Angeles, Calif. Keeping in close contact with the police department it was possible to give assistance to 200 under-privileged boys. These youths are given constructive talks, encouraged in handicraft work and given the privilege of using the Y. M. C. A.
- El Dorado, Ark. Finished up the year's work with organizing 1,000 boys in a Knot Hole Gang, which receives Kiwanis supervision and leadership.
- Galveston, Tex. A Knot Hole Gang, with 1,000 members, attends all the baseball games. Kiwanis works with juvenile court cases, which are recommended by the judge for personal supervision.
- Harrisburg, Ill. Members of the Committee on Boys' and Girls' Work act as probation officers and make investigations in cases of delinquency.
- Harrisburg, Pa. Sixty under-privileged boys meet under Kiwanis supervision once each week at the Y. M. C. A. The time is devoted to swimming and sports and a period for devotions, entertainment and refreshments is available. A position was found for a 21-year-old boy who was to be sentenced to a penal institution. Seventy-two under-privileged boys were sent to a summer camp.
- Houston, Tex. The club operates a Knot Hole Gang, with over 2,000 members. Attendance at ball games by these young people totaled 39,840. A fund assists worthy youngsters in purchasing bicycles, which enables them to secure employment.
- Huntington Park, Calif. The club employs a young college graduate to work with all the young people in the territory who are wards of the court. The boys' club is very cosmopolitan, including Mexicans, Russians, Italians and Americans. Needy youngsters were sent to a camp and Kiwanians give cooperation to all Y. M. C. A. endeavors.
- Hynes-Clearwater-Hollydale, Calif. An annual event is boys' night, which is an important social function and the program is planned by groups of young people. A fathers' and sons' banquet was also held in 1936.
- Jackson, Ky. The National Youth Administration was assisted by the club with 70 boys and girls enrolled in two work projects. The girls do the sewing, make baskets and complete other handicraft work, while the boys manufacture furniture. The furniture is used for an opportunity room at the city school. The girls furnished over 500 articles of clothing which were distributed to needy families.
- Jackson, Miss. All children under the jurisdiction of the juvenile council, who need to go to the Mississippi Industrial Training School, are investigated and assisted. The club is working in Big Brother work and at a Kiwanis-Y. M. C. A. boys' camp. Sixty youths took training in health and character building.
- Jacksonville, Fla. Twelve members are sponsoring Little Brothers and the club is also interested in supervising the education and welfare of two boys at the University of Florida.
- Kansas City, Mo. The Red Seal club has a membership of 150 boys. They study music, and all are interested in gymnasium, basketball, scouting, etc.
- Kirkland Lake, Ont. An appropriation of \$1,500.00 was given to start a school of hobbies for older boys. Supervision is given by talented citizens. Kiwanians attend sessions of the juvenile court so young people can be given advice and help.
- Lakewood, N. J. A factory employing youths was inspected to make sure working conditions were suitable. The club later got positions in this factory for a number of boys.
- Lawrence, Kan. A manual training school is sponsored for young people of junior high school age. Pupils pay a \$1.00 enrollment fee. The school is popular because many young people can produce any project they desire, instead of following the outlined routine required in a regular school course.
- Little Rock, Ark. The P. W. A. has a \$20,000.00 project for improving the Kiwanis boys' camp. The camp is one of the largest in this section of the country.
- London, Ont. The Dynamo League, an organization for young men between the ages of 17 and 25 who are unemployed and some of whom are very discouraged, was given financial aid and other assistance by Kiwanis. Efforts are to build up morale and then to try to find suitable employment. The group meets three times a week at the Y. M. C. A. and has classes in gymnasium, boxing, wrestling and swimming. A suitable speaker is obtained each week to present subjects of interest. Interviews

are arranged for these young men with business and professional leaders. Forty-five boys are enrolled in the Ki-Y club. These boys are supplied with shoes, clothing, text books, milk, etc.

- Los Angeles, Calif.** Twenty-four Kiwanians took 51 boys into their homes during the holidays. It is hoped that in the future all the 260 boys in the McKinley Home will have such home atmosphere.
- Mason City, Iowa.** On annual apple day we sold an entire car-load of the fruit. The street sale was carried on by wives and daughters of Kiwanians. Memberships in the Y. M. C. A. are purchased for our boys' club. Each of these boys has the opportunity of interviewing a Big Brother Kiwanian. Over 500 articles were exhibited by 165 boys at the 10th annual hobby show. The club observed a sons' and daughters' day.
- Moberly, Mo.** Kiwanians try to find homes for boys whose court records leave reasonable assurance that they will make good citizens. First offenders who might be sent to reform school are paroled and given every possible help.
- Montclair, N. J.** Financial help was given to send youths to a national Hi-Y congress. Kiwanis sponsored a city-wide youth program.
- Montreal, P. Q.** Assistance was given to a farm training school for boys where cattle, hog and chicken raising, vegetable and flower growing and dairying are carried on. A \$500.00 contribution was given to this institute and prizes were used to promote agricultural competition. Boys were sent to a summer camp. Shoes, clothing, magazines, etc., were donated to boys and girls' industrials schools.
- Nashville, Tenn.** A start has been made to fill a library at the state training and agricultural school for boys. Education Week was observed and Kiwanis was responsible for sponsoring Boys' Day in Citizenship. Camp vacations were available for young people.
- New York, N. Y.** The fifth annual boys' camp reunion was held with over 400 in attendance. Over 300 boys were sent to summer camp.
- North Baltimore, Md.** Good homes were found for five unfortunate boys who needed the proper Christian environment. Sixty young people attended our fathers' and sons' night.
- North Fort Worth, Tex.** Our boys' club has a membership of 830. Medical aid, clothing, shoes, food, milk and entertainment were provided for these youngsters. Band instruments were also purchased. Sewing classes were organized early in 1936.
- Northwest Detroit, Mich.** The main objective of the year was a citizenship club and Kiwanians agreed to act as Big Brothers for boys. Educational trips, hobby activities, shop craft, athletics and summer camp vacations are advantages available for the group. Worthy boys are also awarded scholarships.
- Oakland, Calif.** Boys returning from reform school are placed under Kiwanis supervision. Young people who have lost their fathers attend get-together meetings with Kiwanians. Employment, clothing and paternal guidance are available for these young people.
- Old York Road, Pa.** The fourth annual model airplane meet for high schools in this district was held in May. A trophy cup was the prize which went to the winning club, which possesses it for a year. Permanent possession of the cup goes to the group winning it three years in succession.
- Oshawa, Ont.** Three hundred under-privileged boys were sent to a summer camp.
- Pendleton, Ore.** There were 250 bird houses entered in a building contest conducted for the children of all the grade schools and junior high schools. The merchants and business men offered 82 prizes. Winners were judged according to various grades and types of houses. Later the houses were located in the park trees.
- Plymouth, Mich.** Kiwanis has sponsored a movement, in cooperation with the police department, to hold weekly meetings when a group of problem boys are entertained. Average attendance is about 25.
- Prince Albert, Sask.** About 120 boys are trained in citizenship and handicraft work. The boys are divided into age groups in what is known as the Monarch club.
- Pueblo Colo.** Jobs were secured for worthy youngsters. Small loans were made for educational purposes. Several boys paroled from the courts to Kiwanians have proven themselves worthy of another chance.

BOYS' WORK—Cont.

Puyallup, Wash. Sons' and daughters' day was celebrated at one of our weekly meetings. The young people filled all the club offices and a fine talk on "What Kiwanis Means to Us," by one of the boys, was a delightful feature.

Racine, Wis. The Big Brother movement has developed extensively and assistance is given in the municipal court for supervision of young people on parole. As soon as an individual is paroled he is assigned to a Kiwanian. All delinquents received free dental and medical care.

Radford, Va. Youth Week was observed with an essay contest, an address on education, a fine musical program and special sermons in the churches.

Ravenswood, Chicago. Ten youths, between the ages of 15 and 18, were arrested for robbery. Three Kiwanians visited the court and consulted the judge and prosecuting attorney. Six boys were given probation. Boys were sent to a summer camp and a donation was made for a work fund at the Y. M. C. A.

Riverdale, Toronto, Ont. Kiwanians are giving attention to 75 boys so they receive proper home environment and parental care. Trained leaders instruct them in handicraft work, swimming, baseball and general physical training. Employment was found for a number of boys and the Kiwanis camp gave vacations to 63 youths. Receipts from a hockey game totaled \$5,441.00 and this money is used for boys work.

St. Joseph, Mo. The Juvenile Adjustment Committee cooperates with county probation officers. The boys and girls receive dental, medical and optical service, are provided with clothing and an effort is made to secure employment for them. Twenty boys have been assigned to Kiwanians who look after their welfare. Character building is the outstanding objective of this activity.

Salem, Va. Boys are assigned to Kiwanians who act as Big Brothers and are responsible for these young people becoming better citizens. Those selected are delinquents and a full case history of each youngster is supplied his sponsor.

San Antonio, Tex. Registration fees were paid for six boys attending the Southwest Texas Older Boys' Christian conference. Seven youths were sent to a summer camp.

Scranton, Pa. Camp Kiwanis completed its ninth annual season in 1936. The cost of operation was approximately \$1,400.00. There were 174 boys entertained. A clinic is being conducted for the boys' club to give youths proper medical and dental attention.

Spokane, Wash. Our Big Brother work continues to be directed by five sub-committees. There is free medical and dental assistance, vocational help and supervision of school work. Y. M. C. A. memberships were secured for 40 Little Brothers. When these youngsters pass the age of 16 they are organized into the Fraternity of Keys which cares for their needs and problems. Merit pins are provided for those who can qualify to earn them. A summer picnic and Christmas party are provided for all the Little Brothers and gifts awarded to each.

Timmings, Ont. A net profit of \$3,500.00 was secured from a street carnival. The Committee on Juvenile Delinquency works with the police magistrate and the Juvenile court for the purpose of studying delinquency and giving aid to children. Seventy-five boys were sent to Camp Kiwanis. The total cost of the camp, including buildings and administration was approximately \$2,000.00.

Toronto, Ont. Eight thousand boys, members of the Knot Hole Gang, were given tickets to attend baseball meetings. The club has vocational classes in radio, carpentry, brick and masonry work, printing and photography. The boys' K Club is used annually by some 35,000 youths. A bugle band, orchestra and a number of harmonica bands are all successful. In April the new Gerrard K Club was opened in the Moss Park area of the city. Camp Kiwanis entertained 439 youths in 1936. In October the club completed a 15-year lease with the city of Toronto for the use of the Trinity College buildings, which are to be rehabilitated at the cost of \$35,000.00. This will make it possible to care for 1,500 boys engaged in vocational work, athletics, music and other entertainment.

White Plains, N. Y. An old building was repaired and is being used for the Rangers, a boys' club. Materials have been purchased for handicraft activities. All youths are sent to a summer camp.

BOYS' WORK—Cont.

Wilmington, N. C. The Brigade Boys' club conducts educational, recreational, vocational and physical programs for 425 under-privileged boys. A four-story building is equipped to carry on all this work. In June, Wilmington Kiwanians completed 15 years of service in boys' work. Four other civic clubs assist in this activity.

The following clubs were interested in sponsoring boys' clubs, Knot Hole gangs, older boys' conferences, Youth Week, Big Brother activities and juvenile court assistance, promoting boys' weeks, camp welfare, newsboy clubs, camps for transients, educational tours, lectures and scholarships; directing pet, bird-house, airplane and glider contests, marble tournaments, stamp clubs, spelling bees and hobby shows; purchasing Y. M. C. A. memberships and clothing for unfortunate youngsters, sponsoring gymnasium classes and athletic games, handicraft and art classes and holding father and son banquets:

- Albert Lea, Minn.** The high school basketball team was entertained.
- Alice, Tex.** Together with a business-men's association, we promoted enthusiasm to increase attendance at the high school football games. The record attendance was 2,000 people.
- Allentown, Pa.** To stimulate greater enthusiasm for the Thanksgiving high school football game we gave a banquet. The high school band was present.
- Alliance, Ohio.** We promote an annual grade school field and track meet. Ribbon prizes and silver trophies are given to the winners.
- Altadena, Calif.** Our committee had copies of the Kiwanias code of sportsmanship presented to various schools, boy scout troops and the boys' and girls' aid society.
- Ambler, Pa.** We opened the junior baseball league season with seven teams averaging in age from 10 to 15 years. The schedule calls for three games to be played each week. At the close of the season 14 boys were entertained at a dinner and special program. Presented each boy with a sweater.
- Anaconda, Mont.** We organized a juvenile football club and donated nine footballs at a cost of \$65.00. Two leagues were formed and at the close of the season we entertained the two winning teams.
- Anaheim, Calif.** We organized a baseball team for the neighborhood boys, who were rewarded at the close of the season by a trip to the mountains.
- Arcadia, Fla.** We formed a special committee to secure funds to purchase a reconditioned school bus used for transporting the football team for out-of-town games. This required approximately \$200.00.
- Arkansas City, Kan.** We presented the Kiwanis boys' baseball team with \$25.00 to purchase the necessary supplies for the season.
- Asbury Park, N. J.** Donated \$10.00 toward the purchasing of honor emblems for the high school basketball team.
- Athens, Ga.** We financed a sand lot baseball league. This project kept approximately 75 boys busy and off the streets.
- Atlantic City, N. J.** We supplied material for a new club house for the junior baseball players. The house is equipped with showers and an examination room. Labor was furnished by the W. P. A. There were about 300 boys who participated in our baseball league. Six boys who showed outstanding spirit in sportsmanship throughout the season were presented with watches.
- Belleville, Ont.** We are promoting a juvenile hockey league with some 200 boys participating. Arrangements were made through the boys' work committee to have several city streets blocked off during the winter months where children could coast in safety.
- Bluefield, W. Va.** We took the initiative in a movement to provide lights at the municipal stadium thereby making night baseball and other sports possible.
- Bremen, Ind.** The high school basketball team was entertained by us at a banquet. A trophy was presented to the captain of the team for being the outstanding player of the season.
- Buckley, Wash.** We entertained the members of the high school football squad, having as a speaker the sports editor of our city newspaper. We also had as a guest speaker, one of the All-American guards from the University of Washington.

- Campbell, Calif.** Organized a baseball team composed of the younger residents of our vicinity to play in a night softball competitive league. The purpose was to promote a better spirit in the community and to keep the younger generation off the streets.
- Canoga Park-Reseda, Calif.** We created a fund for the hospitalization of members of the football team who incurred injuries while playing.
- Central Cape Cod, Mass.** A basketball contest was sponsored with three high schools in our city. Trophies were presented to the winning team.
- Chappaqua, N. Y.** A trophy was purchased and presented to the winning high school football team. The purpose was to prevent the destruction of goal posts after the championship game and to stimulate better sportsmanship.
- Chatham, Ont.** We were instrumental in the promotion of a junior ball team. One of our members was elected manager.

- Hendersonville, N. C.** We were instrumental in the erection of new bleachers for the high school field.
- Kellogg, Idaho.** Over 200 boys took part in the annual Kiwanis track meet, which is for boys from the first to the sixth grades.
- Kingstree, S. C.** We assisted in promoting a fund of \$500.00 to help in the purchase of a fence and for the erection of a new grand stand for the athletic field.
- Las Cruces, N. M.** A soft ball game played by Kiwanis and another service club drew a large crowd. Proceeds of the game amounting to \$75.00 was turned over to the high school athletic fund.

- Albany, Ore.** We conducted a kite flying contest. Liberal prizes were offered for the most outstanding types of kites.
- Alexandria, Ind.** A new \$500.00 wading pool was officially dedicated and presented to our city. The funds were raised through our club. Entertained our members and their families at an outdoor picnic when plans were made for sponsoring and building a municipal bathing pool to cost approximately \$40,000.00.
- Amarillo, Tex.** Six thousand children attended a 4,400 Easter egg hunt. A large program was planned and the children were divided into three groups, those under seven years of age, over seven years, and another group for older boys and girls. Numerous prizes were given to those collecting the largest number of eggs.
- Amsterdam, N. Y.** We held our Hallowe'en parade in which 2,000 children participated. All Kiwanians acted as police during this parade. Eighty prizes were given for those wearing the most appropriate costumes. The purpose of this gathering was to keep the children from performing mischief. Our police department received no calls in any of the districts.
- Anaconda, Mont.** We assisted in sponsoring the first annual Montana championship motorboat regatta. The cooperation of the champion outdoor motorboat drivers from California was secured. They participated in this regatta to make it attractive for the surrounding communities.
- Ann Arbor, Mich.** A pet and hobby show attracted 500 children. There was a total attendance of approximately 2,000, paying an admission fee of four cents for children and ten cents for adults. We have now undertaken to employ a director for our summer playground program at a cost of \$200.00.
- Aurora, Ill.** We put on a learn to swim campaign at the Y. M. C. A. This was open to all school children. Over 1,400 attended and 67 of the older children passed the Red Cross beginners' test.
- Belleville, Ont.** Our Kiwanis playground was officially opened after our having spent \$4,000.00 on new buildings and equipment. Some 18,000 children used our playgrounds during the season.
- Caldwell, Idaho.** Our Committee on Boys and Girls Work interviewed the city council and school board and obtained an appropriation of \$300.00 for an athletic supervisor. Established three playgrounds for the younger boys and girls of our community.
- Galesburg, Ill.** Constructed a log cabin. It was turned over to our city for the use of the boys and girls of the county. Groups use this cabin for social gatherings.
- Geneva, Ohio.** We held a kite flying contest which was divided into four divisions, prizes given in each, for the greatest flying distance, highest angle flyers, best workmanship and for box kites.
- Iron Mountain, Mich.** We are again sponsoring the Kiwanis ski club. A large tournament was scheduled for the Iron Mountain region.

- Kirkland Lake, Ont.** Support the annual children's dog derby. After the dog races, the general public is invited to attend a comic parade, ice races, and an inter-school hockey match.
- Lake Wales, Fla.** Over 1,500 eggs were used in the annual Easter egg hunt which is held in our city park for the little tots.
- Lancaster, Pa.** Our club voted to donate \$100.00 to continue the operation of five playgrounds which were about to be closed due to the lack of funds.
- Laramie, Wyo.** We have completed the construction of three merry-go-rounds which were given to the various playgrounds.
- Los Angeles, Calif.** This is our fifth year for continuing the sponsorship of the Sunset Community Center which is a recreational aid for boys and girls in the poorer sections of the city. We have continued since 1933 to carry the expenses of the director's salary, \$125.00 per month, and an additional \$25.00 a month for operating expenses. There is an enrollment of approximately 686 boys and girls participating in various crafts and athletic activities.
- Mendota, Ill.** Our club is instrumental in promoting a project for a recreational room which will cost approximately \$50,000.00. We have secured the cooperation of the W. P. A. to furnish the labor for doing this work.
- Nanticoke, Pa.** City officials roped off certain paved streets three nights a week to permit children to play in safety.
- Nashville, Tenn.** We purchased 25 bathing suits for children who use our Kiwanis swimming pool.
- Orange, Mass.** A water carnival was held for our county. The outstanding events were swimming races, water sports, canoe tilting, motorboat racing, band concert, log rolling, and a display of floats and fireworks. The estimated attendance was four thousand.
- Pembroke, Ont.** Our club provided a swimming instructor for one of the bathing beaches. Hundreds of children took advantage of free swimming lessons.
- Pontiac, Mich.** We completed and presented to our city two spray pools for the children. These were placed in different parts of town.
- Quincy, Ill.** We are supporting the construction of a rifle range. The cost of the project is estimated between \$10,000.00 and \$12,000.00. Our club has underwritten this amount, and are organizing a rifle club.
- Sunbury, Pa.** Classes have been organized at the public playground where children are being taught to make baskets, beaded bags, whisk brooms, etc. This project assists in occupying the minds of children during the summer vacation.
- Vermont, Ill.** Children whose parents do not own automobiles are taken by members in their cars for short rides and visits to places of interest.
- Xenia, Ohio.** Kiwanis is aiding and raising money for our playgrounds. In 1928 we raised \$20,000.00 to build the playground park. We secured \$950.00 in 1936.

IMPROVEMENT OF CIVIC CONDITIONS

- Arcadia, Fla.** A special committee was appointed to aid the city in collecting taxes so funds might be secured for street repairs and other improvements.
- Camden, N. J.** Kiwanians were placed on a citizens' committee to direct a refinancing of our community's bonded indebtedness so a lower rate of interest might be scheduled.
- Canajoharie, N. Y.** The club worked with city authorities and other agencies to secure adequate parking space in the business section.
- Chattanooga, Tenn.** A special committee of Kiwanians was appointed to rid the community of gambling devices. A resolution was passed urging the city commission to pass an ordinance prohibiting lotteries.
- Clarion, Pa.** An annual affair is to entertain the members of the town council. This governing body looks to the Kiwanis club for suggestions and guidance in its civic responsibilities. New stop lights were secured this year.

- Lockland, Ohio.** Kiwanians worked for a county tax levy so adequate care could be given to the aged and dependents in this territory. Pamphlets concerning the tax levy were circulated among all residents.
- Los Angeles, Calif.** The Committee on Public Affairs constantly studies all tax matters, problems of municipal government, light and power rates, election duties, etc., and recommends to the membership the conclusions reached on all these propositions. All matters in local, state and national affairs are thoroughly discussed by the club. Opposition to the repeal of a state sales tax was advocated.
- Marion, Ohio.** After study, Kiwanis endorsed and urged the passage of two special tax levies providing for better police and fire protection and setting up of a W.P.A. program.
- Mobile, Ala.** Three Kiwanians were on a special committee to investigate the financial affairs of the city. After the committee made a report the club pledged to assist in improving the town's financial condition.
- Montevideo, Minn.** A local law and order league was organized. The club has been active in securing a water conservation project. We were responsible for removing snow in sections where the state and city commissioners had no authority to work.

IMPROVEMENT OF CIVIC CONDITIONS—Cont.

- New Rockford, N. D.** Assisted in providing an adequate liquor ordinance, which makes for a maximum of protection. Arranged for the completion of paving projects and the club is now active in securing a federal building.
- North Newark, N. J.** Open forums are conducted for discussions on taxation. All real estate, building and loan, and other groups, are represented at these meetings and all sides are allowed to present their arguments. The chairman of our Public Affairs Committee is responsible for conducting these meetings in a fair manner.
- Panama City, Fla.** The club had as its main objective a program of refinancing the total county and city bonded indebtedness on a basis of general reduction. The plan, in accordance with assessed valuation over a period of years, makes it possible for all taxes to be paid. We are also heading up a movement to re-name and re-number streets and number all houses.
- Santa Barbara, Calif.** Kiwanians were interested in forming a better government society whose objective it is to secure improved local conditions.
- Waukegan, Ill.** Every member was engaged in raising funds to procure a two-way radio system for the police department. The equipment cost \$10,000.00.
- Winfield, Ala.** Plans are under way to erect a community house and gymnasium.

Many other clubs were engaged in numerous activities of a civic nature such as: securing federal and community buildings, getting improved mail and train service, water and sewage systems, abolished gambling devices, developed parking and traffic regulations, worked for bond issues for bridges and highways, secured tax adjustments, R.F.C. loans and new zoning laws, sought reduction of government expenditures, conducted community forums, organized tax leagues, operated tourist camps, re-naming of streets and re-numbering of business offices and homes, improving telegraph and telephone service, sponsored building new bridges and post offices, entertaining city council members, crime prevention campaigns and campaigns against subversive literature and motion pictures.

- Bluefield, W. Va.** Kiwanis sponsored a meeting of good road enthusiasts from all surrounding towns and an attempt was made to improve important highways leading into the city. State officials have promised co-operation.
- Brooklyn, Cleveland, Ohio.** A meeting was arranged so state highway engineers and other officials might meet to overcome difficulties in getting necessary highway improvements.
- Coshocton, Ohio.** Sponsorship by the Kiwanis' club aided in securing the widening of two principal highways coming into the city.
- Crewe, Va.** The Committee on Public Affairs made several trips to Richmond to confer with state highway commissioners. Action was necessary to secure completion of a north and south highway.
- Daytona Beach, Fla.** After two years of work, a short cut road has been completed between the east coast and west Florida.
- Ford City, Pa.** Meetings were arranged with the county commissioners and state highway department officials so needed road improvement could be secured.
- Gordon, Neb.** A civic improvement fund was raised and the money used for community projects, especially road repair in the rural districts.
- Harrisonville, Mo.** Kiwanis leadership has made possible a \$1,000,000.00 contract for road improvements.
- Monroe, La.** The Committee on Public Affairs is taking an active part in road improvement connecting the farming districts with our local market.
- Monroe, Wash.** The county commissioners were urged to start highway improvements and the securing of county and state aid for overcoming dangerous traffic hazards.
- Opelika, Ala.** We made a visit to the governor of the state for additional paved roads for our county.
- Owosso, Mich.** The Committee on Public Affairs made a check-up of all dangerous crossings along main county roads. Eliminating these hazards means a less number of deaths and accidents.

- Shelby, N. C.** All civic clubs met with Kiwanis for a good roads campaign. Our objective is to improve old roads and construct new farm-to-market highways.

The club has been working on this objective for five years. There has been over 3,000 motor accidents and 125 deaths, but this will be eliminated in the future.

- East St. Louis, Ill.** Our club sponsored a picnic for blind persons and their families. Luncheon was served and ice cream and drinks were provided throughout the day. The program consisted of various speakers, music and games for the children. We have now been requested by the Blind Association to continue this activity.
- Fall River, Mass.** We raised \$80.00 to assist the widow of one of our past presidents to secure a position.
- Franklin Park, Ill.** The balance of \$104.50, our relief fund collected years ago but tied up in closed banks since 1933, was released. We turned this money over to our county nurse for supplies and medical attention for those in need.
- Greenfield, Mass.** We are cooperating in providing seed for community gardens and assisting in obtaining available ground for gardening purposes.
- Harrisonburg, Va.** We fostered a benefit movie at which the admission was some article of food. The food collected was turned over to the welfare league to be distributed to the needy families in our city.

ASSISTANCE TO THE NEEDY—Cont.

- Hoquiam, Wash.** Spent \$75.00 to purchase tools used by the city firemen in making and repairing toys for our Christmas toy project. A special Kiwanis Carnival was held to raise funds to further our toy activity. The hearts of 225 boys and girls were gladdened by these toys at Christmas time.
- Huntington Park, Calif.** We assisted a blind man by providing him with transportation to Berkeley, California, where a Kiwanian cared for him while he received training in handling a "Seeing Eye" dog. The total cost to our club is \$210.00.
- Jackson, Mich.** We have 52 acres of land at our disposal which is divided out in quarter acre plots and assigned to individuals on relief for gardening purposes.
- Little Rock, Ark.** Our Kiwanis first aid car attended two major fires in the county. Hot coffee and sandwiches were served to the firemen.
- Miami, Fla.** Approximately 3,000 children attended our Christmas party when gifts of candy, fruit and ice cream were distributed.
- Minot, N. D.** Our magazine committee collected and distributed over 30,000 used magazines for the needy.
- Morristown, Tenn.** A program of community singing was sponsored by our club at a theatre. This was a benefit occasion, the price of admission being clothing or food to be distributed among the needy people.
- New Bedford, Mass.** Men turned over to us by the court, are provided steady work and we endeavor to make useful citizens of them. We are also providing food, clothing and fuel to several needy families.
- Niagara Falls, Ont.** The first wheel chair we purchased has been put to such constant use that we are now providing three new chairs to be loaned to the needy families who are unable to provide this equipment for themselves. Toys were collected and turned over to a children's shelter.
- Northwest Town, Chicago.** We are cooperating with the Illinois Employment Bureau to secure positions for the needy of the city.
- Owen Sound, Ont.** We provided an outfit for a young Irish immigrant who had met with a most unfortunate accident in which he lost all he possessed. The municipality provided return transportation to his home land. Our Kiwanis club provided all the other needs.
- Paulsboro, N. J.** We have combined our efforts with the local W. P. A. Administrator in providing food, shelter, clothing and fuel to the many needy families. We have also supplied many temporary jobs as well as a few permanent ones for unemployed men.
- Quitman and Brooks County, Ga.** In order to swell our Christmas fund, jars were placed in all business houses throughout the county for voluntary contributions.
- Ravenswood, Chicago.** A survey was planned for the purpose of securing data on the number of families on relief, to find out who are citizens and whether or not they are deserving of public relief.
- St. Charles, Mo.** The secretary of our club has taken over the sponsorship of a parolee recently released from federal prison. This was in cooperation with a U. S. probation officer in assisting to rehabilitate this man. A special Christmas party was arranged for 2,000 youngsters. One of our Kiwanians who owns an airplane played the part of Santa Claus. Approximately 3,000 bags of candy were distributed.
- Seattle, Wash.** Appropriated \$436.00 toward our Pension Mothers' savings account bringing the total up to \$900.00. Plans are progressing for the purchase of one and possibly two more homes.
- Souderton-Telford, Pa.** Each member is having a blood test at a nearby hospital. The record is maintained at the hospital and when blood donors are needed Kiwanians are ready.
- South Side, St. Louis, Mo.** We secured employment for a man recently released from the penitentiary. Assisted him in locating his wife and children from whom he had not heard since being sent away. We assisted in the reuniting of the family.
- Spokane, Wash.** Twenty-six mothers and 120 children occupied the 26 Pensioned Mothers' homes during 1936. These homes have an appraised value of \$49,000.00 Mothers pay \$10.00 to \$15.00 a month rental. During the year \$3,178.80 was spent for maintenance and purchase of homes. Kiwanians were assigned to individual homes and many contributions of clothing, furniture, fuel, etc., were made by members. Medical work was supplied free by doctors and dentists. Twenty gallons of milk are sup-

plied daily for the children. The Pensioned Mothers' sewing group, for which the club buys material, made 200 garments and canned fruits and vegetables for winter use. A camp vacation was enjoyed by 37 of the Pensioned Mothers and daughters.

Tarentum, Pa. The secretary of our club was appointed assistant in charge of flood administration relief. Over 17,500 persons in our valley suffered severely as a result of the flood. The total estimated loss in our community was \$2,512,000.00.

Tuscon, Ariz. Twenty-two youngsters under the supervision of the county probation officer were invited to our Christmas meeting. The children were given a turkey dinner and gifts.

Warren, Pa. Our club furnished all the necessary materials, paints, etc., to the fire department for the reconditioning of over 650 toys that were distributed to needy youngsters in our community. At the county poor farm furnished turkey dinner for all the residents of the home. All were given gifts.

Wheeling, W. Va. All our members assisted in soliciting funds for the purchase of fifteen boats for flood emergency work. These boats are now used as life boats at the beaches. We contacted several industries and county officials in an attempt to secure places where some of our blind citizens might sell papers, magazines, cigars, candy, etc.

- Brooksville, Fla.** Assisted in raising funds to furnish a new hospital and one member was in charge of the landscaping for the surrounding grounds. Kiwanis also completely furnished one hospital room.
- Chattanooga, Tenn.** Co-operation was given to assure success of President Roosevelt's annual birthday ball.
- Coeur d'Alene, Idaho.** Active support was given for a bond issue, which assured residents a new county hospital.

HEALTH AND SANITATION

The following describes the ways in which Kiwanis clubs worked to improve health and sanitary conditions in their communities:

- Ada, Okla.** Strict enforcement of the milk and sanitation ordinance, the appointment of a doctor to give his full time to health work, food inspection and physical examinations of all people handling foods in the community was the 1936 health objective.
- Alton, Ill.** Representatives from every organization in the community attended a public health meeting to sponsor the organization of a health council. One of the best activities was to have an anti-diphtheria campaign in which all school children were immunized.
- Americus, Ga.** Co-operation was given to make successful a free clinic for the treatment of venereal diseases.
- Ashtabula, Ohio.** The club observes annual health day, at which time it invites all doctors and nurses of the county to discuss health subjects.
- Baxley, Ga.** Full co-operation was given a program for cutting weeds in vacant lots and the eradication of mosquitoes. Kiwanis also installed sanitary drinking fountains in the business section, and became active in an anti-diphtheria campaign.
- Belleville, Ont.** Kiwanians assist in safeguarding the health of children and the general public by a thorough check-up of water at the bathing beaches. A grant was made to the Victorian Order of Nurses, which is engaged in public health nursing.
- Clatskanie, Ore.** Kiwanis accepted the responsibility for a general sale of Christmas seals.
- Columbia, Tenn.** Entertainment was provided for all blue ribbon health children of the county. Over 3,000 youngsters were entertained at motion picture shows and with the distribution of candy and favors. Trophy cups were awarded the schools having the highest health rate percentages.

HEALTH AND SANITATION—Cont.

- Dothan, Ala.** The city schools are given a trophy which is used in a health campaign. The school which secures the largest percentage of physical defect corrections wins the trophy. The county health department is co-operating in this venture.
- Filer, Idaho.** Efforts are directed toward getting a physician and surgeon to locate permanently in this vicinity.
- Laurel, Miss.** Helped to secure a full-time health unit for the county.
- Pauls Valley, Okla.** A campaign to clean up all unsanitary conditions was started early in the year.
- Phoenix, Ariz.** Kiwanis is active in a campaign to have public eating places sell only pasteurized milk. The campaign is for the prevention of Malta fever. A special public health committee was appointed to secure the adoption of city ordinances which would take the health department out of politics.
- St. Joseph, Mo.** Kiwanis helped the National Tuberculosis Society in a county-wide survey to find those afflicted with tuberculosis.
- Smithfield, Utah.** The Committee on Public Affairs was instrumental in having the city council pass a meat inspection ordinance.
- Vincennes, Ind.** Organized a county health contest so all might avail themselves of physical examinations.
- Wabash, Ind.** A baby show was held in October and 71 youngsters were examined.

Other clubs were interested in general health clinics, sanitariums and camps, in selling health seals, guarding against epidemics, purchasing equipment for health organizations, community enforcement of measures to fight syphilis and venereal diseases, dog ordinances for control of rabies epidemic and giving assistance to community nurses and health officers; securing pure milk, good water supply, proper sewage disposal and cleaning up polluted streams.

- Albany, N. Y.** This club is sponsoring the Kiwanis Roosevelt band, consisting of 30 pieces. The band is used to participate in athletic day programs and field days. Public and private donations are contributed to assist in defraying band expenses. The community is very proud of this achievement.
- Alhambra, Calif.** Symphony orchestra concerts are featured during the summer. A great deal of enjoyment is derived from these free public entertainments.
- Alice, Tex.** Public concerts are held in the high school auditorium. Citizens had the privilege of hearing one of the best musical organizations, Mercado's Tipica Mexican orchestra, which had ever been brought to this city.
- Ames, Iowa.** Kiwanians with other business men sponsored the Kiwanis quartet which furnished special music at Christmas time for the entire community.
- Anderson, Ind.** Took the lead in promoting a fund of \$1,300.00 to pay transportation of the high school's choral club to New York City where a national music convention was held. A group of 60 took advantage of this offer. While in New York the choral group sang over the NBC network. They also received publicity by being filmed by Pathe News.
- Anderson, S. C.** Sponsoring a community sing. The largest part of the program was given over to the singing of old favorite sacred songs.
- Annapolis, Md.** Sponsoring a high school band. The members interested citizens in donating instruments. A special program of the band was given in a theater to raise funds to purchase the balance for the musical instruments needed.
- Arkansas City, Kan.** Music lessons for two students are paid by this club. These young people would otherwise be unable to receive lessons.
- Arlington, Va.** A boys' and girls' band is supported by this club. Its first public appearance was at the Washington, D. C., convention. They escorted several thousand Kiwanians from Constitution Hall to the south lawn of the White House, where they were received and addressed by President Roosevelt.
- Ashland, Va.** Kiwanis and the Community League supervised a program for the singing of Christmas carols. It is reported that practically every Kiwanian attended.
- Atchison, Kan.** We backed the production of a one-act play written by a Kiwanian. This was to raise funds for the high school band. A large crowd of 1,250 people attended, and tickets were sold at 25 cents apiece. The net receipt was \$175.00.
- Aurora, Ill.** Kiwanians are trying to get graduates from our various high schools, who are members of school bands, to join in forming a large community band organization.
- Baker, Ore.** Every Thursday evening band concerts are given in the city park by the band the club is supporting.
- Barberton, Ohio.** A combined minstrel and vaudeville show was held to raise funds for purchasing new instruments for the high school band.
- Beacon, N. Y.** A Junior Kiwanis Band composed of 38 boys between the ages of 10 and 18 is sponsored. Special programs were given by these young people in order to purchase uniforms. This band was used for the field day exercises.
- Beatrice, Neb.** The Kiwanis glee club visited surrounding towns to give concerts at various churches. The group traveled approximately 14,400 miles. We are constantly receiving requests to have the glee club appear at various community activities.
- Beckley, W. Va.** This club cooperates with other groups in raising funds to purchase new uniforms for the high school band.
- Berwick, Pa.** Held an indoor carnival to collect funds for transporting the high school band to a national band contest. Our band captured first prize in the second division and held eighth place in the finals for the United States. The band started off with a handicap of 18 points due to lack of instrumentation. The club will remedy this condition before next year's contest.
- Blackwell, Okla.** Our club with other service organizations held a morning breakfast meeting, then canvassed the business district to sell tickets for a recital, for defraying expenses for sending one of the town's young ladies to a New York summer school for voice training.

- Bluefield, W. Va.** A young man whom our club has been helping was sent to New York for an audition on Fred Allen's NBC program. He was awarded second place and given an opportunity to remain in New York to complete his musical education.
- Boonville, Mo.** Together with other civic organizations we are assisting in financing a municipal band to give public concerts.
- Brownsville, Tex.** We secured a list of 200 high school students who are musically inclined, and contacted the parents of these boys and girls. A signed statement by the parents was obtained stating that they would finance the purchasing of an instrument for their child. The band was organized and is making rapid progress.
- Camas-Washougal, Wash.** Basket socials and pot-luck dinners were given to raise funds for the organizing of a drum and bugle corps. Forty-four dollars was collected and about 30 children are now participating in this activity.
- Cambridge City, Ind.** The Kiwanis club quartet gave a program and raised \$165.00 for the benefit of the high school band.
- Canton, Ill.** We cooperated with the parents of the high school band students to raise funds for the purchase of new uniforms.

- East Cleveland, Ohio.** The grade school harmonica band consisting of 40 children gave a concert. This stimulated interest among the youngsters to further their musical education.
- Elizabeth City, N. C.** Our junior glee club broadcast over a national hook-up. We received many compliments on this program, and are now buying music for the club.
- Frankfort, Ind.** Took charge of transportation and supervised the cars used in entertaining the state high school band and orchestra contestants. A group of 2,200 children participated. The club's entire membership aided in transporting these children around the city. Impressed upon the visitors that hospitality is not lacking in Frankfort.
- Fredericksburg, Va.** We have again supplied several new instruments to the high school band. A sum of \$3,000.00 has already been used in equipping the band with instruments.

- Gas City, Ind.** Our music committee arranged with the high school band to give weekly summer concerts to raise funds to pay the director. This work has been carried on for the past six years. At the end of the season an opportunity to travel is given the students.
- Glendale, Calif.** We raised \$128.00 for the purchase of uniforms and a bass drum for our high school band consisting of 100 pieces. We sent the band to San Diego to participate in a parade.
- Greenwood, Miss.** Funds were raised to send the high school band to a national band contest, by operating a booth at our city carnival.
- Gulfport, Miss.** The high school orchestra was invited to dine with the club for the purpose of promoting fellowship. The club sold tickets on an automobile, and the net profit of \$300.00 was used for the high school band.
- Hominy, Okla.** Each year our club presents the high school student who has made the greatest progress during the year in music, with a very attractive medal.
- Huntsville, Ala.** To stimulate greater musical interest among high school students, our club sponsors each year a contest for young entertainers.
- Lake View, Chicago.** One evening each week is devoted to directing a group of children in forming a band which can be used at various Kiwanis functions.
- Lenoir, N. C.** Our club was successful in raising \$1,300.00 for new uniforms for our 80-piece high school band.
- Longview, Wash.** Support a boy band of 40 members with a high school girl as drum major. The band earns approximately \$110.00 a month by giving concerts.
- Milwaukee, Wis.** Thirty violins and saxettes were purchased at a cost of \$200.00. Under-privileged children of various schools are allowed to use these while taking musical instruction.
- Monmouth, Ill.** Our club has supported the erection of a band shell to be used in stimulating greater interest in music.
- Montreal, P. Q.** Promoting an interest in community singing by equipping a field with a loud-speaker system.
- Morganton, N. C.** The music committee is very active and turned \$400.00 over to our Kiwanis sponsored high school band. Funds are raised by giving dances and musicals.
- Morris, Minn.** Raised money to send the school band with the team to a basketball tournament.
- Moscow, Idaho.** We aided the county musical festival. Approximately 2,000 children, the majority of them from rural schools, took part.
- Nephi, Utah.** The cooperation of our theater was secured to furnish free tickets to each high school boy who attended band practice and the concert once a week. The desired result was obtained.

CONSERVATION

- Amarillo, Tex.** An Arbor Day program was observed and trees were planted in our Kiwanis grove. These were planted in memory of members. Trees were also planted at nine rural schools.
- Anniston, Ala.** We helped to organize a county game conservation council.
- Big Stone Gap, Va.** Our objective is to have a national forest reserve established in the mountains of Southwest Virginia.
- Cape May, N. J.** Trees were planted along city streets on Arbor Day.
- Charlevoix, Mich.** A special committee was sent to the state capital to petition the department of conservation to declare a tract of land, about 500 acres on Lake Michigan, as a state park.
- Coldwater, Mich.** The Committee on Public Affairs awarded prizes for the best posters presenting the subject of conservation.
- Dayton, Wash.** The club co-operates in a soil conservation campaign conducted throughout the county.
- Enderlin, N. D.** With heavy snow covering feeding grounds, the club contacted farmers and made arrangements to have them distribute feed for the pheasants and other wild game. Shelter had to be provided so that at least a foundation stock might not be killed in the severe storms. Twenty acres were added to a reforestry and nursery project.
- Fryeburg-Lovell, Me.** Kiwanians have sponsored a fish and game association for the purpose of restocking local waters and in this way business men would not lose tourist trade.
- La Crosse, Wis.** A bird shelter and game feeding program was got under way throughout the county in 1936. The work is carried on by the boys of the schools.
- Lanesboro, Minn.** We held a joint meeting with the Izaak Walton League to discuss plans for conservation of natural resources.
- La Porte, Ind.** Every pupil in all the county schools was given a tree to plant in a reforestation project.
- Las Vegas, N. M.** The club sold \$40.00 worth of trees from the Kiwanis nursery and also donated 1,650 trees to parks and schools.
- Leesburg, Fla.** Kiwanians in the state are urged to become members of their county conservation boards, which were organized during 1936. Letters were written to every Kiwanis club urging 100 per cent co-operation.
- Los Angeles, Calif.** A campaign, which distributed over 1,000,000 Save-Your-Forest windshield stickers, was held early in the year. This effort was to save mountain forests from fires and in this way prevent soil erosion.
- Michigan Kiwanis District.** The Michigan Kiwanis Forest, which is part of the Huron National Forest on the banks of the Au Sable River near East Tawas, was dedicated on September 21, 1928. This is a 10,000 acre Kiwanis forest. A monument was dedicated on August 2, 1936 in this forest as a memorial tribute to the late Kiwanian Harry B. Black, of Flint, and his co-workers who were instrumental in the replanting of this forest area.

CONSERVATION—Cont.

- Montreal, P. Q.** The Committee on Public Affairs urged the Provincial Government to study the matter of unjust practices carried on by game wardens and hotel keepers against American tourists. The club was responsible for having the bad practices stopped and fines imposed were returned.
- Quincy, Ill.** The club purchased 8,000 small Chinese elm trees and distributed them to school children for planting.
- Salem, Ore.** Arrangements were made to have the state fish and game commission take a more active part in restocking one of the lakes in the Cascade mountains.
- Sylvester, Ga.** Co-operation is given to the game and fish department in a large conservation program. The state sent some 45,000 fish, which were placed in a new hatchery and rearing pool recently secured for this vicinity.
- West Point, Va.** Five hundred trees were planted throughout the community in remembrance of deceased Kiwanians.
- Winter Park, Fla.** The club removes thousands of pounds of predatory fish from the lakes each year. An anglers' club was given Kiwanis assistance and some 20,000 bass fingerlings were placed in local waters. The club is active in promoting the Florida Conservation Council, which seeks protection for wild life.
- Wisconsin-Upper Michigan Kiwanis District.** In 1930 the Kiwanis Forest Nursery project was started with 2,000,000 sprouts planted. These were replanted in 1932. Reforestation work is encouraged with C. C. labor. On April 28, 1936 International President Harper Gatton dedicated and named the United States Forest Service tree nursery near Rhinelander, as the Hugo Sauer Nursery in memory of the Kiwanian who was chairman of the District Conservation and Reforestation Committee. This group secured funds to carry on the work. This Kiwanis nursery is now over 60 acres and produces white, Norway and jack pine and spruce seedlings at a capacity of approximately 30,000,000 trees a year. Such production makes it possible to replant 30,000 acres annually.
- Wrens, Ga.** A fish and game preserve was secured for the surrounding counties. Some 6,000 acres of land were pledged by Kiwanians and farmers who were present for establishing this preserve. Six large ponds will be used for rearing fish. Assistance for this large project will be secured from the state fish and game department.
- Yankton, S. D.** The club is sponsoring a local chapter of the Izaak Walton League.
