Summary of Paper

I researched the effects of two chemicals found in many shampoos for a Geology course. The assignment was to evaluate peer- reviewed journals as well as toxicity and chemical information contained on government websites. Additionally, I looked at the variety of products the chemicals were found to evaluate the effect on human health and the environment. My research showed little impact to either humans or the environment, however I noticed little research had been done in these areas. Alternatives like natural products do exist, however any product can lay claim to being natural with little evidence.

Summary of Paper


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Being "green" is a relatively new concept. As a society, we have not fully evaluated the effects of chemicals in our lives. At the time of the paper, legislation was underway in Europe to substitute harmful chemicals with more benign chemicals. It is important to be aware of the impact chemicals may have and try to evaluate this impact and reduce it.

Skills learned

- This paper required information to be gathered from a variety of sources and reported in a fact sheet. I had never done a fact sheet or even heard of one when I took this class. I found fact sheets to be an informative and creative means of reporting information.
- This was the first paper I wrote where the results of the research were inconclusive. It was difficult to admit this, because as a student you always want to have the answer for everything. However, it is important to point out where research lacks.
- I learned to write in a condensed fashion, due to the page limit and amount of space available.
- I learned to evaluate hard data and statistics. There were not any papers available saying what certain statistics meant. I had to make that determination based off my knowledge from the course.

Instructions

Materials related to your professional development and career planning should be uploaded into this cell. These should include:

- One to three pieces of work that exemplify the key career-related skills and abilities you've developed in college and that are related to one of the IUPUI Principles of Undergraduate Learning and to one of the outcomes for your track within the English major. Your work examples may represent the very best work you've done or, if you include several examples, may show the development of your skills and abilities over a period of time.
- Your resume (if you plan to apply for a job) or c.v. (if you plan to apply to graduate school)
- Your career reflection, which will take the form of a letter to a prospective employer who has requested additional information about your knowledge and skills. (See detailed instructions below.)

Instructions for career reflection/letter:

Imagine that you've sent your resume and initial cover letter to a prospective employer and that you're now in the final pool of a few candidates being considered for the position. The employer has asked you for additional information about how your educational experiences (whether in or out of the formal classroom) have prepared you for your career. Alternatively, if you plan to apply to graduate or professional school, you might address the letter to the admissions committee for the program you're interested in. The employer/organization/academic program has also requested examples of your work (the examples you've uploaded to this matrix cell). As you write the letter, please focus your thinking on one of IUPUI's Principles of Undergraduate Learning and one of the outcomes for your track within the English major. You might consider some (but probably not all of the following questions:

- How has your increasing proficiency in your selected PUL and track outcome contributed to your development and qualifications as a professional?
- How do your work examples and your resume demonstrate your ability to apply your selected PUL and track outcomes to your professional work, especially in this field? (Or what relevant lessons did you learn from the experience of creating these materials?) Do they show a trajectory of professional development over time? If so, how?
- How does your choice of major and/or track specifically relate to the requirements of this profession? How have courses you've taken in other disciplines


