Many members of the Indianapolis District Dental Society are participating in the annual second-grade inspection program. The program which is presented in cooperation with the Division of Public Health Nursing of the Marion County Health and Hospital Corporation, is educational in nature, and provides referral cards with dental health messages for children and parents. Last year, 17,438 Marion County children were examined by 166 members of the IDDS.
