FFA Global introduces Leadership Scenarios. FFA Global Leadership Scenarios is an online global curriculum for use by FFA advisors in all classrooms. This web-based program is designed to stimulate students' interest in international agriculture by infusing global agriculture and travel in one virtual tour. The program mirrors the lives of "realworld" people in "true to life" situations. Students are invited to join two of their virtual peers, Carmen and Eric, as they travel overseas and discover the "how-tos" of international travel. Students can learn about an area's culture and language and even

CDE Student Waiver: Each member participating in a National FFA CDE must submit the proper "Waiver, Release of Liability and Consent to Medical Treatment" form. The National FFA CDE coordinator must receive the form by Sept. 30, 2002. If a team does not qualify for participation in the national event until after this deadline, the waiver form must be submitted with the certification form. Certification payment for 2002 CDEs: Page 2 of the introduction section of the CDE handbook, Selection and Certification of State Teams, item number 4 states, "Each entry in team or individual career development events will be charged an entry-processing fee, payable at certification (Fee is \$25.00 per entry)." All certification-processing fees for CDE teams must be paid at the time the certification form is submitted. Dairy Handlers and demonstration events do not have a processing fee. Downloading from <u>ffa.org <http://www.ffa.org/> will become easier.</u> Over the next two months, the National FFA will standardize the use of universally accessible .zip and .pdf files on the website. This should ensure that users can safely, accurately and easily download files from <u>ffa.org <http://www.ffa.org/></u>.

Currently, it is possible for embedded scripts called "macros" in some Excel files to trigger virus warnings on receiving PCs. Virus software can mistakenly interpret the macros as executable files and block completion of the download. ZIP software puts a protective shell around the original file, reducing its file size and cloaking the macros so virus software won't interpret them as a threat.

Directions for downloading and using free ZIP software are already available on <u>ffa.org</u> ≤http://www.ffa.org/≥ at ≤http://www.ffa.org/html/download.html≥. By Mar. 15, the new file standards will be in place, eliminating many potential download difficulties.

National FFA Membership Update: Four states--Illinois, Ohio, Washington and Wisconsin--are participating in an Online Membership pilot program as part of Project AIM (Accessing Information Management), the National FFA Organization's information technology initiative.

National FFA staff will demonstrate the online membership system at the Agricultural Education Inservice meeting in February. Attendees will be able to "test drive" the program during several breakout sessions and get a real taste of its features and benefits.

As of Jan. 25, 2002, the National FFA Organization has received rosters from 282,180 members.
