DR. MAYNARD K. HINE, IUPUI CHANCELLOR and former Dean of the Dental School, has been appointed to the National Advisory Dental Research Council for a four-year term. As a Council member, Dr. Hine will advise and make recommendations to the Director, National Institutes of Health, on dental and oral disease research and training projects to be awarded from funds appropriated to the National Institute of Dental Research.

Later this month Dr. Hine will receive the Alpha Omega Fraternity's Achievement Medal at the fraternity's convention in New Orleans.

A few statistics will indicate the tremendous size of this structure...Total project budget: \$14,871,000...Total gross area: 582,185 square feet...Total net area: 378,420 square feet...Shelving capacity of five-story Undergraduate wing: 100,000 volumes...Shelving capacity of eleven-story Research Tower: 2,500,000 volumes...Seating capacity: 5,544 individuals. The new Library building also houses the Graduate Library School and a Cafeteria which seats 389 and is open 14.5 hours each day. Authorization for the building was given in 1962, construction was started in 1966 and it was occupied in June, 1969.
