





My Dear Friends and Colleagues,

Dean's Message

As hard as it is to believe, we once again find ourselves in the midst of the IU School of Dentistry's self-study preparation in anticipation of the school's regular periodic reaccreditation site visit from the American Dental Association's Commission on Dental Accreditation (CODA).

As you know, this is an exercise all accredited dental education programs undergo as part of the process of continuing periodic reaccreditation. Not only will our dental education (DDS) program be evaluated, but also our dental hygiene and dental assisting programs; advanced education programs in endodontics, periodontics, pediatric dentistry, orthodontics, oral facial orthopedics, prosthodontics, and maxillofacial prosthodontics; and our general practice residency. (The advanced education program in oral and maxillofacial surgery is reaccredited on a different cycle, so it will not be included this time.)

Regular periodic accreditation site visits are very rigorous examinations to determine if a program meets the basic accreditation standards put forth by the CODA. For this reason they are very healthy institutional exercises that afford us the opportunity to ensure that, while we are pursuing our individual directions and opportunities for excellence, we also remain adherent to the minimum basic requirements for the entire program. Our IUSD family has been working hard on the self-study and on making whatever changes are necessary to ensure that we meet all standards.

In addition, as part of this preparation we asked two highly respected outside consultants to review our self-study draft and perform a mock site visit for our dental education program in January 2006. I am pleased to tell you that their report indicated our program is basically very sound and truly outstanding in many respects. Nevertheless, we have a number of tasks remaining to do before the actual site visit September 12-14, 2006.

I am also pleased to report that our campaign for renovation of our preclinical laboratory is proceeding well. With the first phase of renovation completed, we now have sufficient funds raised to have the architect draw up final plans for the remainder of the project. With the gracious support of so many of you individually combined with a generous matching program from the IDA Pursuit of Excellence Fund, the momentum to raise the remaining funds necessary for the renovation is accelerating. At the same time, the use of the laboratory is now being incorporated into many of our programs.

Campaigns are also under way for significant renovations of some of our clinics, including the graduate periodontic and endodontic clinics. Other major campaigns

are in the planning stages. All are most gratifying to our faculty and staff, because these campaigns indicate that you, our alumni and friends, are really stepping forward and taking me up on the challenge I issued in my last *Alumni Bulletin* column to contribute your time, treasure, or talents to our School of Dentistry as we leverage our core strengths for the future. The success of these campaigns will not only assure the quality of education and training of our current and future students; it will be a strong demonstration to the university and legislature of our alumni and friends' commitment to the future of our school as we begin to plan for an entirely new facility several years down the line.

I am pleased to tell you that their report indicated our program is basically very sound and truly outstanding in many respects.

As we look to that future we must take into account a number of other factors. One of the most important things we must ensure is that our School of Dentistry remains aligned to the mission, priorities, and directions of IU as a whole. As you may know, recent changes in the administrative structure of Indiana University have led our campus to urge the president and trustees to continue to recognize and support the strengths of IUPUI, including the health science programs. Moreover, the additional appointment for the dean of Medicine, D. Craig Brater, as vice president for Life Sciences, has given him the opportunity and responsibility to play a new role in planning and leading IU's Life Sciences program.


The initial IU Life Sciences Strategic Plan is truly an exciting document and one which promises to give all of the health science programs, including those in dental education, a prominent and recognized place in the economic growth of Indiana through our contribution to our educational, research, and patient care missions. We intend to be a prominent part of this plan as the details unfold over the next few years.

I want to take a brief moment to again express my thanks and appreciation for your continued support of Indiana University School of Dentistry.

I am very pleased to announce that in fiscal 2004-2005, for the second consecutive fiscal year, the IU dental school's donors achieved a new record of giving. And it's especially exciting to report that—for the first time in the school's history—IUSD garnered cash gifts exceeding \$1 million.

Furthermore, the Dean's Society (gifts of \$1,000 or more during the fiscal year) grew to 367 members. In comparison, there were 155 members just three years ago.

A record 170 individuals participated in the third annual Dean's Society dinner, held Oct. 21, 2005, in Indianapolis. One did not have to look too hard or long to see and feel the energy in the room at this event. It was an evening in which you could truly sense the sincere appreciation, respect, and friendship that the participants felt for one other, and for the IU School of Dentistry.

Perhaps the most noteworthy aspect of this significant growth in the development program is that it occurred

during the year following the end of the school's \$10 million capital campaign. Your generosity and loyalty show that the success of the capital campaign was the beginning of an awareness

of the school's need for ongoing support, and you have led by example. For that, I offer my heartfelt appreciation and congratulations.

I'm also delighted to report that the IU School of Dentistry/Indiana Dental Association Preclinical Laboratory Matching Gift Challenge, now in its second year, has been making great progress. As of November 2005, we have raised more than \$750,000 in dollars and pledges toward this critically important renovation project. Your dollars are making it possible for the school to transform lab SB05 into an ergonomically efficient, patient-focused learning environment that will be used by dental and allied dental students alike. The progress under way on the SB05 project illustrates our alumni's exceptional commitment to the next generation of dental professionals. Thank you for being a part of IUSD's future.

During the past fiscal year some unique giving opportunities have arisen, and one example is the Hutton Circle, an initiative that focuses on the residency program in oral and maxillofacial surgery.

The Hutton Circle was established during the 2004-2005 school year to honor Charles E. Hutton (DDS'52),

an IU professor emeritus of oral and maxillofacial surgery who served both as longtime chair of the oral surgery department and as director of the oral surgery residency. Dr. Hutton retired in 1990, and today he and his wife, Dr. Lucreda Hutton, reside in Winamac, Ind.

During a distinguished IU career that spanned 36 years—26 of them as a member of the full-time faculty—Dr. Hutton was a teacher, mentor, friend, and colleague to his many residents.

The Hutton Circle honors Dr. Hutton's dedicated service to those residents, and provides an avenue of financial support for the current residency program, which is directed by Dr. Jeffrey Bennett, chair of the Department of Oral Surgery and Hospital Dentistry.

The invitation to join the Hutton Circle resulted in a swift response from friends and graduates. Donors gave more than \$100,000 in gifts during the initial campaign. The names of the charter members of the Hutton Circle are listed here.

This is just one example of many new giving opportunities that have elicited a positive response.

Most importantly, an increase in the number of alumni who are engaged in philanthropic projects on behalf of IUSD sends a strong message to the school's current and future students about the importance of giving back to one's alma mater. Your unselfish giving not only sets an



Building Character with a Hammer and a Drill



Sports historian Dan O'Brien uncovers some nearly forgotten details about the remarkable life of Indiana Dental College graduate Theodore Cable, a scholar, humanitarian, and world-class athlete

● Ted Cable was one dentist who really knew how to throw his weight around. A few years before his graduation from the Indiana Dental College in 1919, Theodore “Ted” Cable was one of the leading hammer throwers in the world.

As an undergraduate at Harvard University, Cable won the 1912 national intercollegiate championship in the hammer throw, the first African American to accomplish that feat. He successfully defended his title in 1913 to further establish himself as a pioneer in track and field.

In Arthur Ashe’s 1980s anthology about African American athletes, *A Hard Road to Glory*, he cited Ted Cable as “black America’s first star in field events.”


A 1908 graduate of Indianapolis Shortridge High, Ted Cable entered Harvard University in 1909 with no plans to pursue athletics. However, when Harvard’s track coach asked for freshmen volunteers, Cable answered the call.

The 5-foot-9, 185-pound youngster quickly established his prowess in the hammer throw. He was the first African American to win the hammer at the prestigious Harvard-Yale dual meet.


He also displayed uncommon versatility in the sport. In addition to the hammer, Cable competed in the sprints, hurdles, and broad jump (now the long jump). He smashed school records in the hammer and long jump, earning invitations to the 1912 U.S. Olympic trials in both events.

At the 1912 Eastern Olympic trials Cable placed second in the hammer throw and third in the long jump. The selection process for the American Olympic track and field team was much different than today’s. Results from Olympic trials or “tryout” meets—held at three different sites—were only part of the equation.

When the selection committee announced the American team members a few days after the meet,

Cable, surprisingly, was not among the nine hammer throwers or 12 long jumpers selected for the U.S. team. (Nations weren't limited to three athletes per event, as they are now.)

The selection committee cited a clerical error: Harvard had not submitted the proper paperwork. The *Boston Globe* was not convinced.

"[H]e has performed in both the hammer and the broad jump with splendid consistency this Spring," the

Globe reported. "He was worthy of being selected more than some men who will sail."

Had Ted Cable competed at the Stockholm Olympics and matched his performances in the tryouts, he would have placed in the top five in both events.

"That's a testament to how athletic he was," says Brian Murer, who has thrown the hammer farther than any Indiana-born athlete. A native of Danville, Murer earned All-American honors at Southern Methodist University and was one of the top-ranked American hammer throwers from 1992 to 1997.

But, doubling in long jump was not in the picture.

"Never, ever," Murer said. "And, I've never heard of anyone else attempting that double, much less to be that successful on a national level."

Murer, now a chiropractor for Orthopedics of Southern Indiana, was previously unaware of Ted Cable. He welcomes this newfound knowledge for personal reasons: Brian's father, Robert, is an IU School of Dentistry graduate (DDS Class of 1969).

"I'm one up on my dad now," Brian chuckled. "Ted Cable might be the one famous Hoosier dentist he hasn't heard of. I don't know how many times he's told me about Greg Bell."

IU graduate Gregory Bell (DDS Class of 1961) is the dental school's most famous alumnus with a track and field pedigree. Bell was the long jump gold medalist at the 1956 Olympic Games. Like Murer, he never considered a Cable-like double.

"You expect a sprinter-long jumper combination but the hammer and long jump? Oh, my goodness. I can't get over that," Bell said from his Logansport, Ind., home.

Bell has more in common with Cable than teeth and track. As a sculptor and poet, Bell—like Cable before him—is a fervent advocate of a diverse education.

To suggest that education was important in the Cable household would be like saying a loss to Yale is only a minor irritant to a Harvard athlete.

Ted Cable's parents, George and Mary, were both public school teachers when Theodore was born in Topeka, Kansas, in 1891. When George moved his wife and son to Indianapolis in 1894, he accepted a position with the post office.

Mary Cable, though, remained in education, first as a teacher and later as a principal, in the Indianapolis Public Schools (IPS) system, a career that spanned 45 years. Mary was also the founder and first president of the Indianapolis chapter of the NAACP.

For years IPS School No. 4, located just a few blocks from the dental school, bore her name. After the school closed, the Mary E. Cable Building was acquired by IUPUI and used to house classes and other programs. The building closed in 2005, and was razed in January 2006.

George and Mary Cable instilled in their son an appreciation for a well-rounded education. An exemplary student, Ted Cable was also an accomplished violinist who frequently performed recitals in the Indianapolis area.

After graduating with honors from Harvard, Cable returned to Indianapolis. He taught elementary school for two years before entering dental school. He practiced dentistry for 30 years in Indianapolis.

In 1934, Cable became the first African American Democrat elected to the Indianapolis City Council. He later served two terms in the Indiana General Assembly.

Cable was appointed to the Indiana State Housing Board (1938-49), serving as its vice president in 1940. During World War II he was a medical officer in the Civil Air Patrol with the rank of captain.

A licensed pilot, Cable owned his own airplane and, according to *The Indianapolis Recorder*, "He had a short career (one day) as a U.S. mail pilot."

Ted Cable continually explored ways to give back to the community and honor his parents. In 1939 he established the George W. Cable Memorial Award for community service, presented annually to the African American citizen of Indianapolis who rendered "the most outstanding, unselfish service without pay."

From 1947 to 1948 he operated the Mary E. Cable Dental Clinic—free of charge—for underprivileged children.



IU alumnus Gregory Bell (DDS'61), left, the world's top long jumper in the 1950s and a 1956 Olympic gold medalist, attended a 2004 event at the Indiana State House honoring Indiana's Olympians. With him is another IU great: Sam Bell, the university's outstanding track and field coach from 1970 to 1998. During his tenure, IU won 27 Big Ten Titles, including four for the women's teams. Individually, he also coached many Olympians. Both men hold positions in the USA Track & Field Hall of Fame.


In 1949, Cable moved to New York City where he continued to practice dentistry.

Sports remained important to Ted Cable. He took up skiing at age 70. Up until his death—from an automobile accident in 1963—he played tennis at least twice a week.

“Hammer throwing may have been an early sign that he was nuts, and I mean that in a positive way,” Murer said. “Throwers tend to be an eclectic bunch. But this guy did everything. He should have a hall—SOME-THING—named after him.”

International Association for Dental Research/AADR annual sessions in Baltimore.


Research Day also included an awards program recognizing two outstanding faculty members and the best poster and table clinic presentations.

Dr. Zunt's wide-ranging experiences as an educator at IU have benefited her in her work over the years in such nationally respected positions as chair of the American Dental Education Association's Council of Faculties and the association's Pathology Section, and as director of education for the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Pathology, which awarded her diplomate status in 1982.

In her longtime role with the American Cancer Society, including a term as president of the Great Lakes Division, she has joined her colleagues in raising public awareness of oral cancer, its detection and prevention.

Dr. Margherita Fontana, associate professor of preventive and community dentistry and director, Microbial Caries Facility, received the IUSDAA's Distinguished Faculty Award for Research.

An IU teacher since 1997, Dr. Fontana chaired the 2005 Research Day Organizing Committee in her

capacity as president of the Indiana Section of the AADR. In addition to her extensive work as a research mentor, she teaches in numerous courses and directs the Undergraduate Caries Education Program.

As a principal investigator, Dr. Fontana has received more than \$1.1 million in research funds from industry, the National Institutes of Health, and private foundations. Her research on the effects of the sugar substitute xylitol on transmission from mother to infant of *Streptococcus mutans* and other cariogenic bacteria was one of the campus projects Indiana University chose to profile in the community during IU's widely publicized Life Sciences Week in 2005.

Dr. Fontana is a past recipient of the IADR's Basil G. Bibby Award in Cariology and the Indiana Dental Association Outstanding Teacher of the Year Award. She completed a two-year term as secretary of the IADR's Cariology Group in 2006.

ORCA COMES TO NORTH AMERICA

In the summer of 2005, the Hoosier capital was added to a distinguished list of European cities—and only one other American city—that have had the honor of serving as a host site for the annual global conference of the prestigious European Organisation for Caries Research (ORCA).

Dental scientists and scholars representing about 30 nations and all but one of the world's seven continents converged in Indianapolis July 6-9, bringing together the finest minds in the field of cariology. ORCA publishes the internationally respected *Caries Research* journal.

Dr. George Stookey, Indiana University's distinguished professor emeritus of preventive and community dentistry and head of Therametrics Inc. in IU's Emerging Technologies Center, presided over the 52nd annual congress as host scientist and ORCA co-president. ORCA president is Dr. Bente Nyvad, of Århus, Denmark.

The IU School of Dentistry and its Oral Health Research Institute also served as hosts of the congress, which was headquartered at the Indianapolis Marriott Downtown hotel.

More than three years in the making, the congress was produced by Dr. Stookey and an IU organizing committee that included current OHRI director and

IUSD research associate dean Dr. Domenick Zero; Susan Crum, Publications; John Gosney, Technology Services; Theresa Norris, Emerging Technologies Center; and Melissa Mau and Judith Wilkinson, both of the OHRI.

It was an exceptional honor for Indianapolis to serve as the host city for an organization that has moved its annual session beyond its European borders on only one other occasion in ORCA's 52-year history. In 1982, Annapolis, Md., was invited to host the congress in recognition of the 10th anniversary of the National Caries Program of the National Institute of Dental Research.

At the 2005 congress, ORCA participants presented and discussed the results of nearly 150 recent clinical investigations and studies pertaining to epidemiology, fluoride, diagnostics, remineralization/demineralization, erosion/hard tissues, and microbiology and dental plaque.

The use of new technologies to detect caries at the earliest stages of development is one of several specialty areas of dental research being advanced by scientists at IU's Oral Health Research Institute, which has been under Dr. Zero's direction since 1999.

A dozen researchers from the IUPUI campus were among the primary presenters, including Drs. Masatoshi Ando, Takashi Doi, Hafsteinn Eggertsson, Andréa Ferreira Zandoná, Margherita Fontana, Carlos González-Cabezas, Angeles Martinez-Mier, and Armando Soto-Rojas, all of the OHRI; Drs. Lorena Sá and Potjaman Totiam of Restorative Dentistry; and Drs. George Eckert and Barry Katz of the Department of Medicine. Many other IU scientists participated as co-researchers.

During opening ceremonies at the Hilbert Circle Theatre, the 2005 ORCA-Zsolnay Prize was awarded to Professor Nigel Pitts, director of the Centre for Clinical Innovations at the University of Dundee, Scotland. He then gave a lecture titled "Dental Caries: A Journey of Discovery from Diagnosis Via Detection and Assessment to Prognosis and Management."

Dr. Pitts' lecture was followed by a presentation by keynote speaker, Dr. Jacques Eduardo Nör, a professor at the University of Michigan, who discussed molecular biology in the bioengineering of teeth.

Dr. Stookey and his IU team made sure the ORCA scientists didn't return home without first enjoying a healthy dose of Hoosier Hospitality. Social events included dinner and dancing at the Indiana Roof Ballroom, a reception at the Indianapolis Artsgarden, supper at the Indiana State Museum, an IMAX Theatre presentation of the Lewis and Clark Exploration of Western America, tours of the Indianapolis Museum of Art and Indianapolis Motor Speedway, and a trip to Brown County and Nashville, Ind.

After serving for one year as a clinical assistant professor of dental assisting at IU, **Pamela Ford** was named new director of the program, effective January 2006.

She succeeds Prof. Patricia Capps, who has remained on the full-time faculty to continue her work in developing a distance-learning dental assisting program for IUSD.

Prof. Ford is a 1975 graduate of IU's dental assisting program. In 1978, she earned an associate degree in dental hygiene from Indiana State University, Evansville (now the University of Southern Indiana). She also earned a BS in dental hygiene education (1992) and a Master of Social Work (2003) from USI.

She brings to the directorship a background that is rich in both academics and organized dentistry.

Throughout her career, she has worked as a dental assistant or dental hygienist in private practices primarily in the Evansville area. She taught allied dental professional students at the University of Southern Indiana from 1989 to 2001.

Prof. Ford is a former chair of the Indiana Dental Assistants Association's publicity and by-laws committees, and a past vice president of the Evansville Dental Assistants Society. She has frequently presented continuing education courses, primarily on the topic of radiology for dental auxiliaries.

New Full-Time Faculty Appointments


Several new full-time professors joined the IU School of Dentistry faculty during the 2004-2005 fiscal year, or shortly thereafter.

One of these educators, Dr. **James Jones**, is already a well-known figure in IU's dental community.

After having served with distinction as dean of the School of Health Sciences and chair of Dental Education at Indiana University-Purdue University Fort Wayne (IPFW) since 1993, Dr. Jones re-joined the IU dental school faculty in September 2006 as professor of pediatric dentistry and director of the Division of Pediatric Dentistry in the Department of Oral Facial

Development. He was a full-time faculty member at Riley Hospital for Children from 1983 to 1989.

Dr. Jones holds a bachelor's degree and master's degree from the University of Kentucky, and he is a 1978 dental graduate of the University of Louisville. He also earned two degrees from IU (a master's in pediatric dentistry, 1983, and an EdD in higher education, 1993), and a PhD in biological sciences from Universidad Empresarial, Costa Rica (2003).



James Jones

Dr. Jones took an academic leave of absence from IUSD

in 1987-89 to serve as a Robert Wood Johnson Dental Services Research Fellow at Harvard University.

Before accepting his administrative positions at Fort Wayne, which included the directorship of the IPFW Health Science Research Institute, Dr. Jones chaired pediatric dentistry at the University of Tennessee for four years. In the early 1980s, he taught part time at the University of Louisville.

During his career, Dr. Jones has been the recipient or director of nearly \$6 million in grants for education, training, equipment, and research.

Dr. Jones is a former chair of the Pediatric Dentistry Section of the American Dental Education Association. He is a past recipient of a United Cerebral Palsy Clinical Fellowship, an American Fund for Dental Health Dental Faculty Fellowship, and a Congressional Fellowship.



Gerardo Maupomé

In August 2005, Dr. **Gerardo Maupomé** joined the faculty as a professor of preventive and community dentistry.

For the previous five years, he was an investigator in the Economic, Social, and Health Services Program at Kaiser Permanente Center for Health Research in Portland, Ore.

Dr. Maupomé earned his dental degree from Universidad Nacional Autónoma de México (UNAM), México City, in 1985, and a diploma in epidemiology (1993) from the university's medical school. He also holds a master's in experimental oral pathology (1986) and a PhD in public health (1991) from the University of London, London Hospital Medical College. Additionally, he has studied dental public health at the Royal College of Surgeons of England and pursued a public health residency at Baylor College of Dentistry.

Previous positions include stints on the dental faculties of the University of British Columbia, Universidad Tecnológica de México, and UNAM. He has also been affiliated with the teaching program at the University of California, San Francisco.

Over the past decade, Dr. Maupomé has acquired an extensive background in research funded by the National Institute of Dental and Craniofacial Research and other agencies. Dr. Maupomé's key research interests include caries epidemiology, geriatrics, international health, oral treatment needs in high-risk patients, and professional practice and decision-making analysis. His work is published in more than 80 peer-reviewed articles.



Burak Taskonak

On July 1, 2005, IUSD welcomed Dr. **Burak Taskonak** to the Division of Dental Materials as an assistant professor of dental biomaterials.

For the year prior to his appointment, Dr. Taskonak had been serving as a postdoctoral research associate in biomaterials science at Baylor College of Dentistry.

In 2004, he completed a PhD degree in materials science and engineering at the University of Florida, where he specialized in dental ceramics, biomimetics, and fracture mechanics.

As a research assistant at the University of Florida, Dr. Taskonak worked with noted researcher Dr. Kenneth Anusavice. A past president of the American Association for Dental Research, Dr. Anusavice assumed the editorship of Dr. Ralph Phillips' legendary textbook, *The Science of Dental Materials*, after Dr. Phillips' death in 1991. Dr. Anusavice retitled the text *Phillips' Science of Dental Materials*.

Dr. Taskonak is a 1998 dental graduate of Marmara University, Istanbul, Turkey. He also completed the university's master's degree in prosthodontics in 2000.

In 1999, he gained additional experience in research design and manuscript writing as a teaching and research assistant in New York University's Department of Dental Materials.

His research has recently appeared in *Dental Materials*, *Biomaterials*, and the *Journal of Oral Rehabilitation*, among other publications.

Dr. **Trevor Treasure** brings a diverse educational background to his new post at IUSD as an assistant professor of oral and maxillofacial surgery. He was appointed to the IU faculty in March 2005.

Dr. Treasure holds a dental degree (1986) and a bachelor's degree (1981) from the University of

Toronto; an MD degree (1993) from the University of Texas (UT) Southwestern Medical School in Dallas, which he earned in conjunction with his oral and maxillofacial surgery residency at UT Southwestern Medical Center/Parkland Memorial Hospital; and an MBA (2003) in medical practice management from the Rawls School of Business at Texas Tech University, Lubbock. He also completed a general surgery internship at Southwestern Medical School.

Dr. Treasure began his career as a practitioner of general dentistry in Toronto. Immediately before accepting his IU post, Dr. Treasure was practicing oral and maxillofacial surgery in McKinney, Texas, and serving on the oral surgery faculty at UT Southwestern Medical Center/Parkland Memorial Hospital. He was





previously a teacher of pharmacology in the allied health division at Amarillo (Texas) College, of surgery at Texas Tech University Health Sciences Center School of Medicine, Amarillo, and of oral and maxillofacial surgery at the University of California, San Francisco. He also was in private practice as an oral surgeon in

Amarillo and San Leandro, Calif.

Dr. Treasure is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and a fellow of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons.

Retirements



David Avery

In April 2005, Dr. **David Avery** ended his distinguished 35-year career on Indiana University's pediatric dentistry faculty.

Alumni Bulletin readers may recall that Dr. Avery was the subject of a cover story in 2002, along with Dean and Professor Emeritus Ralph McDonald, when David became IU's first Ralph E. McDonald Professor

of Pediatric Dentistry. "It has been a humbling experience," Dr. Avery said at the time. "I view it as the greatest honor for me in my professional career."

Dr. Avery has been a stand-out since his dental school days, when he graduated with high honors in 1966. After serving in the U.S. Navy for two years, he entered IU's pediatric dentistry residency. The research he undertook on composite resins for his graduate thesis garnered international attention. One of the letters

supporting Dr. Avery's appointment as the McDonald Professor described his work as setting "the foundation for what has become the standard of care in restorative dentistry for children." Dr. Avery was awarded his master's degree in 1971, and diplomate status in the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry in 1978.

He joined the faculty in 1970 and chaired Pediatric Dentistry from 1976 to 1993, when the department became a division of Oral Facial Development. He was serving as division director at the time of his retirement. He headed the residency program for 22 years, until 1998.

Dr. Avery is perhaps best known internationally for his co-editorship with Dr. McDonald on the long-running and highly regarded textbook *Dentistry for the Child and Adolescent*, which surpassed all other pediatric dentistry texts in the number of editions with publication of its 7th edition in 2000. Dr. Avery was added to the editorial staff for the 3rd edition in 1978; for their 8th edition in 2004, Drs. McDonald and Avery added a third editor: Oral Facial Development chair Dr. Jeffrey Dean.

Dr. Avery is a past president of the College of Diplomates of the American Board of Pediatric Dentistry and of its foundation, and a former chair of the American Dental Education Association's Council of Faculties.

During his long association with IU, he acquired more than \$3 million in training and research grants. In the 1990s, he served as a visiting professor at Thailand's Chulalongkorn University and Prince of Songkla University, and at Osaka Dental University in Japan. He received the Indiana Dental Association's Outstanding Faculty of the Year award in 2000.



Yoshiki Oshida

Internationally recognized metallurgist Dr. **Yoshiki Oshida**, professor of dental materials, retired in July 2005, after serving with excellence on the IU faculty since 1991.


Dr. Oshida came to IU after a decade of service on the faculty at Syracuse University in New York, where he was a research associate professor in the Department of Mechanical and Aerospace Engineering of the L.C. Smith College of Engineering. He holds a master's degree from Syracuse University's Department of Chemical Engineering and Materials Science (1967), and he also completed a post-doctoral fellowship there. He received his bachelor's degree (1965) in metallurgical engineering and PhD degree (1971) in materials science from Waseda University, Tokyo, Japan.

Dr. Oshida is a fellow in the International Academy of Shape Memory Materials for Medical Use, and a research fellow in the National Institute of Standards and Technology. He is widely published as an author

and co-author in refereed journals such as *Bio-Medical Materials and Engineering* and the *Journal of Prosthetic Dentistry*, and is a frequent contributor to the scientific sessions of the American Association for Dental Research/International Association for Dental Research. He is a co-recipient of several U.S. patents awarded for the invention of mirrors used in dental examinations and appliances used in orthodontic treatment. He also has been awarded many patents in Japan.

In 2001, the IU Alumni Association honored Dr. Oshida with the Distinguished Faculty Award for Research.

Two longtime research faculty and Oral Health Research Institute team members who helped develop and maintain the Institute's internationally renowned reputation retired in the fall of 2005: research associates Bruce Schemehorn and Gerald Wood.



Bruce Schemehorn

Bruce Schemehorn, director of Contract Research in the Department of Preventive and Community Dentistry, retired in September after 32 years of outstanding service.

He holds two IU degrees: a bachelor's in biological sciences (1972) and a master's in preventive dentistry (1985).

Starting out in 1973 as a laboratory technician at the Institute, Mr. Schemehorn soon began to acquire administrative appointments. By 1980, he was directing the Oral Health Research Institute's Laboratory Research, and in 1987 he assumed the duties of assistant director of Preclinical Trials. He had been serving as director of Contract Research since 1996.

He has served as a member of the subcommittee on abrasive materials for the American Dental Association's American National Standards Committee on Dental Materials. He has also been a longtime U.S. representative to the International Standards Organization (ISO) for dental products.

As manager of all sponsored contract research at one of the world's best known product-testing institutions, Mr. Schemehorn supervised a massive number of proposals and final reports during his career. In 2003 alone, he was responsible for contracts amounting to more than \$1.1 million.

He also managed all image analysis for studies involving hard tissues.

Mr. Schemehorn has presented papers at symposia in the U.S., Singapore, Thailand, Spain, and England, and he served as principal author on studies published in the *Journal of Clinical Dentistry* and the *American Journal of Dentistry*, among other scientific publications.



Gerald Wood

Gerald Wood retired in October, bringing to a close a 38-year career that has involved all five decades of the Institute's existence.

Mr. Wood was promoted to research associate in 1978, after beginning as a laboratory technician in 1967. He was a part of the Institute since its start, when it was known as the Preventive Dentistry Research Institute (and also as The House That Crest Built). The facility, dedicated in 1968, was built with royalties from Procter & Gamble's sale of Crest toothpaste, which contained the first successful caries-fighting formula developed by IU researchers Joseph Muhler, Harry Day, and William Nebergall. The Institute made it possible to house under one roof dental researchers who were scattered in Bloomington and at the medical sciences building, dental and medical schools, and Indiana State Board of Health in Indianapolis.

Mr. Wood's areas of research expertise included polish studies on dentifrices and prophylaxis pastes; fluoride stability studies on experimental dentifrices; fluoride analyses on drinking water samples from physicians, dentists, and Head Start programs; and fluoride analyses on remineralization/demineralization studies. He also conducted FDA procedures for fluoride uptake and enamel solubility studies on experimental dentifrices. He has co-written articles with Mr. Schemehorn for the *Journal of Clinical Dentistry*, and with Dr. George Stookey for the *Journal of Dental Research*.

Several IU School of Dentistry staff members also retired during the past academic year, or shortly afterward.

LaVerne Henderson

LaVerne Henderson, a secretary/receptionist in Clinical Affairs, retired in July 2005 after 20 years of service to the dental school.

A graduate of Ben Davis High School and former employee of *The Trader* newspaper, Ms. Henderson was first appointed as a clinic clerk in the Dental Hygiene division. She transferred to Clinical Affairs in 1992.

As the dental school's main lobby receptionist, Ms. Henderson managed one of the busiest spots in the school. Although changes in recent years, including relocation of emergency dentistry services to Regentrief and creation of the Comprehensive Care Clinics,

where students now receive most of their calls and phone messages, brought relative calm to the lobby, there are still plenty of times when lobby receptionists need to skillfully juggle at least a dozen tasks at once.

The publications director is indebted to Ms. Henderson in particular for her outstanding assistance over the years in facilitating visits to the school from newspaper and television news teams.

Carol Hurst-Dudek, a dental hygienist at the Grassy Creek dental clinic, retired in December 2004.

She graduated with honors from IU's dental hygiene program in 1961, and she also holds a bachelor's degree (1994) in health sciences education from the School of Health and Rehabilitative Sciences.

Ms. Hurst-Dudek worked in private practice for 27 years before joining the dental school staff in 1990. She originally worked in the Dental Faculty Private Practice division, and transferred to Grassy Creek in 2000.

In 2004, Ms. Hurst-Dudek received the IUSD Staff Council's Staff Excellence Award in part for her exceptional care of patients as well as her dedication to educating patients about good oral hygiene and valuable health initiatives such as smoking cessation.

Ms. Hurst-Dudek is the mother of IUSD alumnus Dr. Charles Hurst, a 1992 dental graduate and 1994 graduate of the orthodontic program.

Margaret "Peggy" Waryas, the Dental Faculty Private Practice's longtime clinic administrator, retired in July 2005. She was a dedicated member of the DFPP team who served with excellence and professionalism for 19 years.

Ms. Waryas was the outstanding graduate of her dental hygiene class at the University of Vermont.


In addition to Post-Commencement, the dental school held a celebration luncheon at University Place Hotel on May 4 to honor the graduation award recipients for 2005.



Dr. **David Bixler**, a widely respected geneticist, 34-year member of the IU School of Dentistry faculty, and creator of IU's Department of Oral Facial Genetics, died Nov. 15, 2005.

He moved to Florida in 1994, and was residing in North Fort Myers at the time of his death.

Dr. Bixler was the IU dental school's first "double doc," and one of just a handful of scientists who held both PhD and DDS degrees in the U.S. in the 1950s. He earned a PhD in zoology from IU in 1956, and then graduated with honors from IUSD in 1959.

Dr. Bixler also served as a postdoctoral fellow with the U.S. Public Health Service in the 1950s.

He was a veteran of the U.S. Army Air Force.

He joined the dental faculty in the basic sciences department immediately after earning his DDS. By

1964 he had established the Dental Genetics Clinic, where information was compiled on families with inherited oral facial defects for use in staff and graduate student research.

"...dentistry and the other allied health sciences are finding themselves increasingly involved in this fascinating area of human genetics," Dr. Bixler wrote in the *Alumni Bulletin* in 1968. "Clearly, organized dentistry and its administrative leaders are cognizant of the forthcoming development of human genetics as it relates to the oral facial complex, and

wish to foster this development. Indiana alumni can be proud that their School of Dentistry is a leader in this achievement."

Dr. Bixler received the U.S. Public Health Service's prestigious Career Development Award, which was funded from 1967 to 1972.

By 1971, he was able to expand the Dental Genetics Clinic into a full-fledged department. Dr. Bixler said in 1990 that it was the first of its kind in the U.S. He served as department chair until his retirement in 1993. (Today, oral facial genetics, along with pediatric dentistry and orthodontics, are under the umbrella of the Department of Oral Facial Development.)

Dr. Bixler also held a joint appointment at the IU School of Medicine, where he was a professor of medical and molecular genetics.

This soft-spoken, easy-going scientist was nicknamed "Dr. B." by his graduate students and postdoctoral fellows, many of whom considered him the quintessential mentor.

Studies focusing on clefts of the lip and palate were the cornerstone of Dr. Bixler's research. Much of the research undertaken in his department was made possible with four consecutive five-year Institutional Training Grants awarded to Dr. Bixler by the National Institute of Dental Research.

He spent a year in the 1960s as a visiting professor at the Institute of Medical Genetics in Copenhagen, Denmark, where he recorded data for Dr. Poul Fogh-Andersen, author of the 1940s landmark thesis on clefts. Dr. Bixler recorded data on 5,500 persons with clefts who had been born in Denmark since 1941. "These data represented virtually a complete ascertainment of everybody in the country with a cleft—a total data sample," Dr. Bixler explained in 1991. The work led to a series of IU papers advancing Dr. Fogh-Andersen's theory that a single gene influenced the occurrence of clefts.

Dr. Bixler also wrote about two sisters who exhibited an association of facial defects unique to the scientific literature at that time. Hypertelorism-microtia-clefting became known as HMC, or Bixler syndrome.

Professor Emeritus Bixler was a diplomate of the American Board of Medical Genetics and the first president of the Society of Craniofacial Genetics. He was a prolific contributor to the scientific literature, serving for seven years as editor of the oral diseases section of the *Birth Defects Encyclopedia*.

Dr. Bixler is survived by his wife, Dr. Gloria Bixler; sons, David, R. Scott, and Brian Bixler; daughters, Katherine Bedwell, Laurie Bixler, and Michelle Harris; eight grandchildren; and three great-grandchildren.

Dr. Bixler was the 1990 recipient of the IUSD Alumni Association's Distinguished Faculty Award for Research.

"In receiving this award I feel that I have accomplished one of the goals I set for myself as a dental student in 1956—to promote the research effort in the dental school and, specifically, to help bring the IUSD program to the attention of researchers all over the world," Dr. Bixler said in accepting the award. "With significant contributions from my graduate students and postdoctoral fellows over the last 19 years, I feel this goal has been realized."

Dr. **Roland W. Dykema**, an accomplished prosthodontist and scholar who devoted 40 years of his life to the education of students of Indiana University School of Dentistry, died November 20, 2005. He resided in Monrovia, Ind.

Dr. Dykema was appointed to the faculty shortly after he earned his dental degree here in 1947. Before enrolling at IU, he attended Wheaton (Ill.) College and Tufts University. Dr. Dykema also earned a master's degree in dentistry from IU in 1961.

In 1965, Dr. Dykema succeeded Dr. John F. Johnston as chair of the Department of Fixed and Removable Partial Prosthodontics, a position he maintained for two decades.

"The department is indeed in good hands," Dean Maynard Hine reported in his *Alumni Bulletin* announcement of Dr. Dykema's promotion, referring to the content of Dr. Dykema's lectures and his theories on occlusion as unique. "The standards of excellence which he sets for himself he tries to maintain in the student clinic."

Dr. Dykema was part of a cadre of faculty hired by Dr. Hine during the 1940s and 1950s who together developed standards of excellence in clinical education for IUSD that became recognized and admired worldwide. The graduate prosthodontics program has since its inception attracted students from around the globe. "If (students) can learn to do a three-unit bridge the way we want them to, they are skillful enough to handle the more extensive cases," Dr. Dykema said in 1987.

Many alumni may remember how difficult it was to get a seal of approval on their work from Dr. Dykema in their dental school days, but his insistence on perfection was the product of his own make-you-or-break-you IU education.

When Dr. Dykema was in graduate school he was also a full-time professor. He sandwiched his grueling study schedule between a heavy teaching load and the writing he was doing on a textbook with his boss, Dr. Johnston.

"I can remember Dr. Johnston yelling at me for not getting things done for the textbook because I was working on the graduate program," Dr. Dykema recalled in 1987, "and then he bawled me out for getting behind in my graduate program because of the work on (the book). But it all worked out."

Dr. Dykema also remembered when an intimidating surprise guest showed up unannounced for his orals and writtens: Dr. Joe Muhler, one of the foremost dental researchers in the country and head of IUSD's graduate program at that time. "He asked lots of questions pertaining to *his* field of preventive dentistry on subjects like fluoride chemistry," Dr. Dykema said. "He also submitted a

question for the written part. I'm not sure to this day how I passed!"

That book Dr. Dykema was working on with Dr. Johnston, by the way, was the first edition of *Modern Practice in Crown and Bridge Prosthodontics*, published in 1960. It quickly became the most widely used textbook on fixed prosthodontics in the world, and remained so for many years.

Dr. Dykema also wrote textbooks on dental ceramics (with Drs. Johnston and George Mumford) and on removable partial prosthodontics (with Drs. Johnston and Donald Cunningham).

His books, and the many clinics he presented throughout North and South America and Japan, earned Dr. Dykema a respected place in the international arena of prosthodontics.


He stepped down from the chairmanship in 1986, and served until his retirement in 1988 as director of graduate prosthodontics in the new Department of Prosthodontics, a combination of fixed and removable partial prosthodontics, complete denture, and maxillofacial prosthetics. Dr. Dykema's friend and colleague, Dr. Charles Goodacre, now dean of dentistry at Loma Linda University, served as first chair.

Professor Emeritus Dykema was a fellow of the American College of Dentists, a past president of the American Academy of Crown and Bridge Prosthodontics, and a diplomate and past president of the American Board of Prosthodontics.

He was a veteran of the U.S. Naval Air Force.

In 1987, the John F. Johnston Society and the IU dental school honored Dr. Dykema by dedicating the newly remodeled graduate prosthodontics laboratory in his name. "No one has done more to promote graduate prosthodontics than Dr. Dykema," Dr. Goodacre said during the dedication ceremonies.

Dr. Dykema was preceded in death by his son, John. He is survived by his wife, Dorothy Dykema; daughters, Susan Dykema and Julie Winter; sons, Richard and William Dykema; and six grandchildren.

Diane K. Rohlfing Scott, a prominent figure in Indiana's dental community and a former IU teacher of dental hygiene, died May 14, 2005. She resided in Columbus, Ind.

A 1968 graduate of IU's dental hygiene program, Ms. Scott also held IU degrees in public health dental hygiene (BS'69, graduating with highest distinction) and educational psychology (MS'73).

She joined the faculty as a full-time dental hygiene instructor in 1971 and taught until the mid-1970s.

Prior to this appointment, she served for two years as a public health hygienist at the Preventive Dentistry Research Institute (now the Oral Health Research Institute), where she coordinated the Indiana Fluoride Mouth Rinse Program and taught in the dental caries etiology program for dental hygiene students on the South Bend, Fort Wayne, and Indianapolis campuses.

Ms. Scott practiced dental hygiene in the Columbus office of Dick Newton (DDS'56) and Richard Newton II (DDS'84) for more than two decades.

In the early 1980s, Indiana Governor Robert Orr appointed Ms. Scott to the Indiana State Board of Dental Examiners. She was the first dental hygienist and the first woman to serve as a full voting member of the board.

"She was an outstanding professional and person," said Gail Williamson (ASDH'74, BS'79, MS'82), an IU professor of dental diagnostic sciences and a former student of Ms. Scott.

Ms. Scott was a Sagamore of the Wabash, a past president of Theta Chapter of Sigma Phi Alpha honor society, and a recipient of the Indiana Dental Hygienists' Association's Dental Hygienist of the Year award. She played a significant role in the establishment of the Driftwood Valley Dental Hygienists' Association.

Ms. Scott is survived by her two sons, Gregory and John Scott, both of Colorado Springs, Colo.

Mr. Nealy is survived by his wife, Betty; daughters, Angela Nealy and Jacqueline Finch; and three grandchildren.

Isabell V. Poor, an IU employee who dedicated nearly three decades of her life to the dental school, died Nov. 13, 2005, in Indianapolis.


Mrs. Poor—better known to everyone as Izzy—was hired in 1961 to work in radiology by Dr. James Beck, then chair of the department. Sixteen years later, she transferred to the oral diagnosis/oral medicine department. Officially retiring in 1988, she continued to work part time in the newly formed Department of Dental Diagnostic Sciences for another two years.

When asked near the close of her career what she liked best about her role as a radiographic technician at the dental school, Izzy responded: "Student contact is one of the best things about this job. They keep you young."

We suspect that Izzy's spunky, fleet-footed approach to her work also had a lot to do with her perpetual youthfulness. Clad in a white clinical pantsuit and boasting a beautiful crop of silver hair, this petite woman could dart about the building like no other—a streak of lightning in nurses moccasins.

Izzy's exceptional dedication to her work earned her an IUPUI Glenn W. Irwin, Jr., M.D., Experience Excellence Award in 1987. His death came just two days after the death of Rosa Parks, whose refusal to give up her bus seat to a white passenger in Montgomery, Ala., in 1955 led to the emergence of the national civil rights movement. Dr. Stuart so vigorously supported.

The news of Dr. Stuart's death shocked and saddened many persons associated with the IU dental school, since only a month before his death he was in Indianapolis celebrating his 50-year reunion with other members of the DDS Class of 1955 during the IUSD Alumni Association's Fall Dental Alumni Conference.

"He was a good person," said IUSD Community Dentistry director Dr. Karen Yoder, a Fort Wayne resident. "He was a

strong supporter of the Matthew 25 Dental Clinic and actively participated in many worthwhile endeavors."

As reported in the Fort Wayne *Journal Gazette*, the fire, which broke out in the middle of the night, was attributed to an electrical failure in Dr. Stuart's second-floor bedroom. He had retired from private practice after suffering a stroke a few years ago.

Dr. Stuart was cited by the *Journal Gazette* as a leader who "persisted in moving the community conscience."

He was a past president of the Fort Wayne chapter of the NAACP, former Fort Wayne Community Schools board member, and participant in the Fort Wayne Urban League. He was a 2003 recipient of a Lion award, given in recognition of his service to the city. He had written his family history and submitted it to the Allen County Historical Society shortly before his death.

"He was always trying to make the community a better place and always looking out for the needs of other people," Fort Wayne Community Schools Superintendent Wendy Robinson told the *Journal Gazette*. "I am obviously grateful to him being on the school board and the decisions and directions he set for this district."

A longtime supporter of the IUSDAA, Dr. Hunt in the fall of 2005 completed two consecutive terms as a board director for a total of six years of outstanding service.

In addition to his dental degree, Dr. Hunt also earned an IU bachelor's degree in 1960.

He served for two years as a dentist in the U.S. Navy and was stationed at the Naval War College in Newport, R.I., before serving overseas in Newfoundland and then Cuba.

After five years in practice in Muskegon, Dr. Hunt and a physician built the Norton Medical Center in Muskegon, where he moved his practice. Today, the center is home to many medical and dental practices.

His first dental patient, Sharon Veltman, wound up working with Dr. Hunt as his office manager for four decades. He had recently retired from practice.

Dr. Hunt is described by his family as a man whose "greatest passion was for helping others. He was an uncommonly compassionate and honest man, who always looked out for the 'little guy'."

Dr. Hunt and his wife, Pat, were active in the Port City Playhouse. Ron chaired the judges panel for the Miss Michigan Pageant, and he had a long history of appreciating such pageantry: A year after Patsy Newhouse was crowned Miss Indiana University in 1959, she married dental student Ron Hunt.

In addition to Pat Hunt, Dr. Hunt is survived by the couple's three sons, Greg, Todd, and Scott; and eight grandchildren. Dr. Todd Hunt, also of Muskegon, is a 1990 dental graduate of IU and a 1992 graduate of IU's orthodontic master's degree program.

Dental Hygiene Students
Protect Athletes' Special Smiles



At the invitation of the national Special Olympics Healthy Athletes Program, the IU School of Dentistry launched its “Special Smiles in Indiana” dental clinic in 2000, with IU student, faculty, and alumni volunteers providing screenings, education, and mouth guards to the young athletes during the state’s annual Summer Games in Terre Haute.

IU’s dental hygiene students have taken a leadership role at the Special Smiles events by fitting the Olympians with “dip and shape” mouth guards on board the SEAL INDIANA mobile unit. The protective gear is in high demand, and long lines of athletes wait patiently for their fittings.

During the daylong clinic in 2005, the dentists screened 134 athletes, and the dental hygiene students fitted more than a hundred participants with mouth guards.

“This is a program in which IU’s students learn a great deal about the many assets intellectually disabled persons possess, as well as the challenges they face,” said Dr. Karen Yoder, IU’s director of Community Dentistry.

And, as it turns out, the “Special Smiles” aren’t limited to the faces of the Olympians at the end of the clinic each year. “Invariably, the volunteer students and dentists leave the Indiana state games with smiles on their own faces,” said Dr. Yoder, “and with a new resolve to emulate the positive, enthusiastic attitude they see among the athletes.”

Seal Mobile Rolls into Living Rooms Across America

The IU School of Dentistry's SEAL INDIANA program figured prominently in a nationally aired, hour-long PBS television documentary about service learning in higher education.

Titled "Education for What? Learning Social Responsibility," the televised documentary originally airing in November 2004 took an in-depth look at service-learning activities at six urban campuses in the U.S., including IUPUI.

While in Indianapolis, a television production crew led by independent producer and San Jose (Calif.) State University sociology professor Bob Gliner taped a diverse group of service-learning projects and spoke to administrators, faculty, and students in IUPUI's School of Public and Environmental Affairs, Center for Service and Learning, Geology department, and School of Dentistry.

Dentistry was represented in the documentary's interviews by Dr. Lawrence Goldblatt, dean; Dr. Karen Yoder, director of Community Dentistry; and Reve Chaston (DDS'03), who was serving on board the Seal Mobile as a fourth-year dental student at the time. Elvia Reyes-Martinez, a dental assistant in the Department of Oral

Facial Development, also appeared on the program, as did former IU President Thomas Ehrlich, who is the author of the book *Civic Responsibility and Higher Education* and a national leader in efforts to broaden service-learning opportunities for college students.

The documentary offered a fascinating view of several unique community/university partnerships that are thriving thanks to efforts of faculty, staff, and students at IUPUI, Portland (Ore.) and San Jose state universities, and the universities of Wisconsin, Maryland, and Massachusetts.

In describing SEAL INDIANA to this national audience, Dr. Yoder talked about how the program was helping the state strive toward the national health objective of having dental sealants placed on the teeth of 50 percent of children by 2010. SEAL INDIANA, she said, is fulfilling an unmet need in the community and is providing student participants with experiences that will help them better understand the needs within their own communities when they are practitioners.

Ecuador Added to Spring Break Service-Learning Sites


Through Indiana University School of Dentistry's Alternative Spring Break program, which was created in 2001 as a service-learning elective module in the Clinical Sciences IV course, students are reaching out as healthcare providers to populations far beyond the city of Indianapolis, and in doing so are finding that wide-ranging and personally enriching experiences await them in the global community of dentistry.

In 2004, Ecuador was added to the international sites where IU dental and dental hygiene student volunteers team up with IU faculty mentors and others to provide treatment and education to underserved populations for a week each spring. Students also treat patients in rural Mexico annually, and they formerly volunteered in Haiti.

For the trip to Ecuador in 2005, eight students, two faculty, and a faculty spouse joined an 18-member medical team assembled by Medical Ministries International. Using makeshift clinics set up in schools in fishing villages along the west coast of the country, the dental group treated 327 patients from Ecuador's mestizo and Amerindian populations.

Preparation for service-learning trips begins long before Spring Break, says restorative dentistry faculty mentor Dr. Timothy Carlson, who leads the Ecuador dental volunteers. "Through a mandatory eight-class orientation, students learn about the country's history, politics, geography, culture, economics, and health-care," he said. "It's important for the students to understand what a field clinic environment is like in a developing country." Students must also learn how to fundraise and solicit dental supplies to help support the program, and those who are fluent in Spanish conduct study sessions at noon to help other volunteers master dental phrases in Spanish.

The Alternative Spring Break experience affects students in ways that no other part of the curriculum can, says Dr. Carlson, citing the new sense of teamwork students often develop after working and solving problems together under difficult conditions. Students typically return from the trips with eyes newly open to the extreme needs of developing nations, and with a deeper appreciation of their own lives.

"In Ecuador, students treat dental conditions that are much more severe, and concentrated within the population, than what they routinely encounter in Indianapolis, even among underserved patients here," Dr. Carlson said.

The Ecuadorian patients expressed an unusual degree of gratitude that the volunteers are likely to remember long after they've established their own practices. "I have a greater appreciation for all the things I have in my life and usually take for granted..." one student reported after returning from Ecuador. "It made some of the things I normally stress over, not seem so 'life or death.' It made me appreciate the fact that if you want to make a difference, you can make a big difference for others."

IU Dental School Joins National Collaborative

The IU School of Dentistry and nine other health professions schools around the nation have received funding collectively from the U.S. Department of Education to work on developing methods for recognizing and rewarding community engagement as central to the role of faculty members at their own institutions and nationally.

In January 2005, the national organization Community-Campus Partnerships for Health (CCPH) announced a three-year, \$563,842 grant to fund the Community-Engaged Scholarship for Health Collaborative. The grant was awarded by the Education department's Fund for the Improvement of Postsecondary Education (FIPSE).

The FIPSE Collaborative met for the first time in February 2005 at the Vanderbilt Center for Better Health in Nashville, Tenn. Indianapolis participants are Dean Lawrence Goldblatt; Dr. E. Brady Hancock, chair of Periodontics and Allied Dental Programs; Dr. Robert Bringle, IUPUI Center for Service and Learning; Dr. Karen Yoder, director of Community Dentistry; Prof. Nancy Young, director of Dental Hygiene; Dr. Bruce Matis, professor of operative dentistry; and two of IUSD's community partners, Dawne Lyon and Becky Markley of Goodwill Industries.

"We were invited to participate through the CCPH, which is the lead organization promoting civic engagement in the health professions schools," said Dr. Yoder. "The grant is intended to bring together representatives of health professions schools to lay the groundwork for increasing the rewards for community-engaged scholarship in the promotion and tenure process."

The Collaborative is working in part to implement recommendations set forth in 2005 by the Commission on Community-Engaged Scholarship in the Health Professions. The Commission recommends, for example, that national associations of health professions schools adopt and promote a definition of scholarship within the profession that explicitly includes community-engaged scholarship, and that a national board be established to facilitate the peer review process related to educators' efforts in community settings.

"The challenges of demonstrating the validity and relevance of community-engaged scholarship as well as supporting and rewarding those faculty who are committed to advancing it are indeed daunting," said Dr. Goldblatt. "That is why the findings and recommendations of the Commission are so important."

One other dental school, at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, is participating in the three-year project. Other members of the Collaborative include Auburn University Harrison School of Pharmacy, Case Western Reserve University School of Nursing, Loma Linda University School of Public Health, University of Cincinnati College of Allied Health Sciences, University of Colorado School of Pharmacy, University of Massachusetts Worcester Graduate School of Nursing, University of Minnesota Academic Health Center, and Vanderbilt University School of Medicine.

New Scholarships Benefit Allied Dental Students

For the first time in its six-year history, the annual IUSD Scholarship Luncheon, held in November 2004, included new awards that have been created exclusively for students in IUSD's Dental Assisting program.

The Delta Dental Fund Scholarship in Dental Assisting was awarded to Betheny Parson and Holly Robinson. This is the first time that Delta Dental Fund, an affiliate of Delta Dental Plan of Indiana, has sponsored a dental assisting program scholarship in the states of Michigan, Ohio, and Indiana. The scholarships are intended in part for in-state dental assisting students who have demonstrated outstanding leadership qualities and who uphold high professional and ethical standards. Ms. Parson and Ms. Robinson completed the certificate program in 2005.

Pauline Spencer, who served with excellence as director of IUSD's Dental Assisting program from 1981 until her retirement in 2001, has generously donated the funds

In the case of Charlene Childers, a dedicated IUSD employee for 11 years, it was the dental students' voices that came through loud and clear during the award nomination process. Their descriptions of her add up to a dream candidate for any dental practice team: helpful, pleasant, caring, knowledgeable, resourceful, and the type of staffer whose talents reach well beyond the

confines of a job description. From a student perspective, there is perhaps no greater praise than these straightforward remarks from a third-year student. Charlene "treats you with respect," he said simply, and she makes sure that "our experience in clinic is a good one."

As coordinator of one of the school's seven Comprehensive Care Clinics, Charlene routinely worked with about 30 third- and fourth-year students who were assigned to Clinic B each year. When she retired from IU at the close of 2004, she made it clear that she admired and respected the students as much as they appreciated her.

A graduate of the former dental assisting program that Harry Wood High School had in collaboration with IUSD, Charlene worked as an assistant for 22 years at Central State Hospital before joining the IU staff. (She took a 12-year break in the middle of those years to raise two daughters.) The hospital closed in 1994.

"I loved my job and the students, watching them grow professionally and seeing where they go in their careers," she said. "I never wanted to act like a mom, but I often felt like one. I still keep in touch with some students. I enjoyed being able to help them in any way I could, especially when they were troubled over something or feeling frustrated. It isn't easy getting through dental school."



Dr. Gardner is a member of the Academy of Operative Dentistry and a community-minded health-care professional. He is the Isaac Knapp District Dental Society's Peer Review chair and a board member of the IKDDS Foundation. He has served since 1978 on the board of directors for Dukes Day, a charitable scholarship program for students pursuing health-related majors. He is the dentist for the local Police K-9 Unit, and he is also a Mason.

Phil and Suzy Gardner have two grown children: Grant, who resides in Charleston, S.C.; and Alison, who lives in Lombard, Ill., with her husband, Jason Russell.

The Honorees

Distinguished Alumnus

Joseph Francis Karpinski (DDS'48), Auburn, N.Y.

Dr. Karpinski is an oral and maxillofacial surgeon who has traveled the world, but his roots are planted deep in his hometown of Auburn. There he built his dental practice from the ground up, staying open late to accommodate his patients and building rapport that would last through generations. "I always wanted to give my patients the finest treatment," he told a reporter for the local newspaper. "They say if you love your work, you have never worked a day in your life. And I never worked a day in my life."

An article in the Auburn *Citizen* further acknowledges Dr. Karpinski's generosity to the community, his eclectic collections, positive attitude, and great storytelling ability.

During his long and distinguished career, Dr. Karpinski served in many leadership roles for professional organizations, including the presidency of the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgeons (1975). For many years he was on the faculty of Loyola University School of Dentistry, routinely traveling from New York to Chicago to fulfill his teaching duties.

The Polish government knighted Dr. Karpinski in 1993 for his humanitarian work providing medical supplies to hospitals in Poland; this marked only the second time Poland bestowed the Knight of the Black Madonna on an American citizen.

Dr. Karpinski retired from practice in 1997 to travel, work on his foundation, and serve on other projects. In 2004, he was elected to the board of trustees of the University of New England.

He attended Boston College and Cornell University for his undergraduate degree and dental school at Creighton University through the Army's Specialized Training Program before earning a DDS degree from Indiana University. He is also an alumnus of the University of Pennsylvania Graduate School of Medicine's oral and maxillofacial surgery residency. He is a life member of the IU Alumni Association.

Of three sons and three daughters born to Dr. Karpinski and his wife, Honey, four are dentists, one is a physician, and one is an attorney.

Dr. Karpinski accepted the award in memory of his brother, IUSD alumnus Arthur Karpinski (DDS'55), also of Auburn. Many of Arthur's classmates were in the banquet audience as members of the 50-year reunion class. Arthur Karpinski died just three months before the 2005 Fall Dental Alumni Conference, on June 4.

Dr. Mark E. Wohlford, Evansville

Dr. Mark Wohlford has spent much of his career as an oral and maxillofacial surgeon in association with the Indiana University School of Dentistry as a faculty member and administrator.

During his dedicated service as a full-time assistant professor of oral and maxillofacial surgery from 1992 to 2000, he wore many other hats as well. He spent several years directing the school's oral and maxillofacial surgery residency, and was named chief of dentistry at Wishard Memorial Hospital in 1994. He also accepted an additional appointment as acting chair of the Department of Surgery and Hospital Dentistry (now Oral Surgery and Hospital Dentistry). In 1998 he accepted another responsibility, as co-chief of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and Dentistry for Clarian Health Partners.

Dr. Wohlford resigned from his full-time position at IU in 2000 to enter private practice in Evansville, where he is an associate/partner with the Oral Surgery Group. He continues to contribute to the IU faculty as a volunteer clinical assistant professor.

Dr. Wohlford has been a consultant to the Cleft Palate and Craniofacial Clinic at Riley Hospital for Children and to the Division of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery at the Roudebush Department of Veterans Affairs Medical Center.

Dr. Wohlford holds an undergraduate degree and a dental degree from the University of Iowa. He is also a graduate of Ohio State University's oral and maxillofacial surgery residency and OSU medical school's PhD program in pathology. While at OSU, he held a Dental Scientist Fellowship. He is a diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery.

Dr. Wohlford has given professional presentations locally, nationally, and abroad.

His Honorary Alumnus Award was presented to him in Evansville in October 2005 during a CE program and "Dinner with the Dean" event sponsored by the First District Dental Society and the IUSD Alumni Association.
