ICIC Health Literacy Medical Labeling Project Update

At the Health Literacy Research Team's January 9, 2007, meeting, the latest member, Heidi Hamilton, was introduced. Dr. Hamilton, an Associate Professor of Linguistics at Georgetown University, is an expert in Discourse and Medicine who has spent her life in linguistics exploring the interrelationships between language and a variety of health care issues and contexts.

The Research Team, formed in 2005, is currently following three lines of inquiry:

- 1) Contrastive analysis of Spanish and U.S. Patient Medical Information A corpus of 30 Patient Information Leaflets (generated by U.S. pharmacies) and 30 Patient Package Inserts (for the same medications in Spain) was gathered in spring of 2006 and analyzed. The findings, "Intercultural Study of Patient-directed Medicine Labeling: Text Differences between the United States and Spain" were presented at the Communication, Medicine & Ethics Conference (COMET) in Cardiff, Wales, on July 2, 2006, and were submitted on January 8, 2007 to the journal Communication & Medicine (manuscript abstract)
- 2) Identifying the process by which diabetes patients gain medical information from a range of potential sources (e.g., written information, doctors, nurses, family, friends, Internet) and how this interacts with adherence An Institutional Review Board at IUPUI approved the protocol for interviews on December 13, 2006. Board at IUPUI approved the protocol for interviews on December 13, 2006. Interviews of 20 patients has provided preliminary data for a larger, funded patient project. These interviews have identified information about medication adherence issues in relation to information access and comprehension among the interviewed subjects and collectively serve as a model protocol for such in-depth investigation of the communication processes in medicine. The preliminary findings and implications will be presented at COMET conference in Switzerland in June 2007 by Ulla Connor, Beth Goering, Heidi Hamilton, and Bob Mac Neill.

3) Text manipulation of medicine instructions – In collaboration with Michael Wolf's groundbreaking research at Northwestern University's Medical School on low comprehension of common medical dosage instructions, ICIC has a project to manipulate the text of medicine instructions to find the most comprehensible presentation of dosage instructions. The long term goal is to identify the best way to present written information for patients with low or marginal literacy.

The Health Literacy Research Team's next meeting is scheduled for April 16, 2007 at ICIC.

Immigration in Indiana

On November 17, ICIC hosted *Immigration in Indiana: Real Life Diversity* at IUPUI's University Library. Dr. William Plater, Director of the Workshop on International Community Development at IUPUI & former Executive Vice Chancellor and Dean of the Faculties of IUPUI, moderated the panel, which included presentations about fostering immigrant business ownership, by Charles Sim; the economic impact of immigrants in Indiana, by John Clark; language, culture and education issues in school and professional settings, by Thom Upton, Laurie Pylitt, and Ulla Connor; and immigration laws, by Angela Iza.

The panel concluded with several real life stories from Hoosier immigrants, including Tatiana Melnichak, co-owner of Slaviansky's Bazaar; Mehdi Tahsini, M.D., an IU Family Practice medical resident, Walle Mafolosire, the president of Conqar Solutions, LLC; and IUPUI student Javier Barrera.
