

Joanne Trockman M.D.

Every issue of the Hackney-Norins Newsletter highlights an individual or a program in the Departmentthis issue highlights Dr. Glenna Joanne Trockman, Assistant Professor of Clinical Dermatology.

Dr. Joanne Trockman is an example of a special colleague whom has overcome considerable obstacles, and has done it with style, grace and a gritty determination.

Dr. Trockman was born in Danville, Illinois, the daughter of a butcher shop owner.

She spent the first four years of her life in Indianapolis and then moved back to Danville, where she graduated from Danville High School. She did her undergraduate degree in Zoology at Butler University as a General

Motors Scholar. She spent her summers doing research here at the medical center in the Department of Ophthalmology.

Called to medicine, she completed her first two years of medical school here at IU, then married and transferred to the University of Southern California for her last two years.

Though Dr. Trockman was planning to become a pediatrician, experiencing dermatology as her

last medical school rotation caused her to change her career plans. Under the guidance of famous Professor Norman Levin, she did her residency at LAC-USC Medical Center finishing in 1974 and becoming board-certified by American Board of Dermatology in 1975. She worked at Ross-Loos Medical Center in Los Angeles as Director of Dermatology for two years, and then was in private practice in LA for eight years and three years in Auburn-Opelika, Alabama until she moved to Indianapolis and started a successful practice in the Castleton area from 1988-2000. Unfortunately, Dr. Trockman retired from practice due to health problems, including systemic lupus erythematosus. Her story did not end there, however, as her improved

health allowed her to consider returning to active practice after eight years. Under the guidance of Dr. Alexander Zemtsov and Dr. Jeffrey Travers, a "mini-residency" of nine months was set up which included her successfully completing the Dermatology Recertification Examination. Dr. Trockman was successfully relicensed by the Indiana State Board in December, 2008. She has been working part-time with Dr. Zemtsov and with the Department and this summer decided to join the Department full-time.

Dr. Trockman loves being back seeing patients and feels that with her vast experience, she has much to contribute to the field especially interacting with all the "learners" at the University. "The teamwork and camaraderie is great, and the constant pursuit of knowledge and learning new things every day keeps me young!" Dr. Trockman is a consummate learner and teacher; in between patients in the clinic

she is either reading or teaching.

When not poring over medical texts, she enjoys pleasure reading, music, gardening, and gourmet cooking. She has two children, Joel Trockman, who is a computer software engineer and salesman in LA, and daughter Jennifer, who is enrolled in the Kelly School of Business. Dr. Trockman also enjoys spending time with her granddaughter, Mercedes Goodman. Though Dr. Trockman is very appreciative of a "second chance" to practice Dermatology, the truth is that we are the ones who are appreciative of having such a colleague in our midst!


