## **Transcript**

[A. Hart] Hi. I'm Amanda Hart, your host for the March 4th edition of IUPUI's The Spot.

IUPUI has recently received one gold award and two merit awards in the largest educational, advertising awards competition in the country. Additionally, IUPUI was one of 50 colleges and universities to be selected from over 2,000 entries to have their website featured in a book. The Spot has more information from Steve Hodges regarding the 24th Annual Admissions Advertising Awards.

[S. Hodges] IUPUI has been recognized for the last several years in a few major awards competitions that we submit websites and publications and all sorts of different things to. For the last three years we've actually won the most prestigious of the competitions, which is the Admissions Advertising Awards. We won the gold, so that meant we have the best university website for any university with 20,000 or more students. In fact, there is a book coming out this month that features, that talks about university websites, and our website is actually featured in the book.

The last two years we were actually recognized for the campus website, so <a href="www.iupui.edu">www.iupui.edu</a>. This year we won the gold for the new, events website, which is <a href="events.iupui.edu">events.iupui.edu</a>. In addition to those sites, we also won an award this year for our new video system — <a href="iupui.edu/podcasts">iupui.edu/podcasts</a>. One of the most innovative things about it is it has a closed captioning system built into it. This is something that most other universities have no idea how to do.

In addition to winning awards, it's actually been a little bit more flattering to get calls. We get phone calls and emails all the time from other universities. In fact I had one from a major metropolitan area from their city government recently, from nonprofits, and all these different groups that want to actually hire the people that develop the IUPUI website. These people want to know how IUPUI does it.

How do we have such a cutting edge website? A leading website? How do we keep it fresh and those sorts of things, so that's been pretty flattering.

Wade] Comics That Care is a very funny and exciting event that the Department of Communication Studies and the Communication Club are collaborating with the Salvation Army to raise money for homeless children. The most exciting part about Comics That Care is that one of our own professors here at IUPUI in the Department of Communication Studies, Mike Pilates, is one of the comedians. It's

going to be at Morty's Comedy Club on 96th Street on Monday, March 9th, kicking off communication week at 8pm.

If we get 70 people in there then we get all the proceeds at the door to donate to Salvation Army. The headliner of Comics That Care is Troy Davis, and he's been featured all over the nation. He travels around to all of the college campuses, so it's going to be a really, really exciting event.

The Rock Papers Scissors Tournament is a fundraiser that we're doing for Save Darfur. We're doing the traditional, not like the new Rock Paper Scissors with the earth and the wind and the fire. It's just the traditional rock, paper, and scissors. We are doing it in the UC College Courtyard, and that's on Wednesday, March 11th from 10am – 3pm. We are asking for everyone on campus to come and participate. It's \$5 to register.

[A. Hart] Ishmael Beah, author of *A Long Way Gone*, will be coming to IUPUI for a book signing, a question and answer session, and a lecture on Thursday, March 12th at 1:00pm in Campus Center Room 450.

It comes down to being able to make plays that we've just got to come to play everyday.
