MRS. HELEN CAMPBELL, School of Dentistry Librarian, reports as follows on the remodeling of the Library:

As the students left the Library at 1 p.m. on Wednesday, May 5, to take their last examination for the Spring Semester of 1976, a crew of workmen began demolishing walls to remodel the Library. Between that time and August 13 service was never suspended, but no one will ever claim that it was normal. The elimination of the hall in the west end of the original building is the most startling change. We have designated Room 122 as the Audiovisual Room and the southwest corner has become our "quiet" study area. By opening up the areas on the Michigan Street side, we have gained over 1200 square feet of space, and the addition of carpeting, new drapes, acoustical ceilings, and airconditioning increases the comfort and attractiveness. Still to arrive are a circulation counter, the new stacks which will increase our shelving capabilities by 50%, and tables and chairs to add 40 study spaces.

The remodeling has eliminated the hallway in the original building from the west to the center hall and the west door to the Library is kept locked from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. We quickly found that this was necessary to keep patients from wandering through and to cut down on the non-library traffic.

For those studying in the Library, the Staff will continue to page any individual, but only if that person has signed the clipboard on Mrs. Peg Smith's desk, indicating in which area he/she plans to study.

For those of you who did not see the books from the Library lined up on the counters in Room 115 during the summer, the move to that classroom and back to the remodeled library was accomplished with the assistance of several students but a special "thank-you" is due First Year Student Tom Stokes and Third Year Students Bob Modrowski and John Pfefferle.

ABOUT 140 FACULTY MEMBERS, STUDENTS, AND GUESTS of the School of Dentistry attended the 12th Annual Teaching Conference at the Tamada Inn, Nashville, Indiana, Sept. 8-10. The Conference dealt with the theme of ethics as applied to dental practice, dental education, education in general, and professional relations with the public. Students from IUSD who attended were: Allan Estey, Student Representative on the Teaching Committee; John Knapp, President, Student Affairs Council; Dennis Ford, Fourth Year Student; John Pfefferle, Third Year Student; Philip Heller, Second Year Student; Barbara Dunn, Second Year Dental Hygiene Student.

OF THE FIVE POSTDOCTORAL TRAINEES selected for a federally sponsored multidisciplinary program in caries research at the University of Minnesota, two are from Indiana University: Dr. Ronald Billings, Assistant Professor of Preventive Dentistry; and Timothy Warner, Graduate Student in Microbiology. They will begin their three-year program in Minneapolis on October 4. The purpose of the program is to train investigators in all phases of caries research: chemical, physiological, immunological, epidemiological, and bacteriological.

DR. CHARLES W. GISH, Director of the Division of Dental Health in the Indiana State Board of Health and Associate Professor of Pedodontics, has been appointed to a National Advisory Committee which will oversee the operations of a new National Preventive Dentistry Demonstration Program. The program is designed to involve up to 20,000 elementary school children in selected communities and to demonstrate that comprehensive preventive dental services employing proven procedures can markedly reduce the two most common dental diseases -- tooth decay and gum disease. Several combinations of proven procedures will be evaluated in an effort to determine their cost and the relative degrees of protection afforded. The 5 1/2-year program will be conducted by the American Fund for Dental Health and supported by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation.

THE LIMITED RESOURCES OF THE SCHOLARSHIP and Loan Committee of the School of Dentistry were recently increased by generous gifts from two sources. The Sue Starkey Morris Memorial Fund is named for a 1964 graduate of the Dental Hygiene Program who died on June 18, 1975. She was the daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Dallas Starkey of Terre Haute, Indiana and was married to Joseph Morris of Terre Haute. She was the mother of a daughter, Leslie. Her classmates have solicited contributions among themselves and others to establish the loan fund in Sue's memory. Dental Hygiene students on the Indianapolis campus may apply for such help during the spring of their first year, for a loan to be issued the following fall. The fund, which now contains \$610, will be revolved every two years, helping one student each year.

On June 23, 1976, the Aurelia S. & Louis Y. Mazzini Loan Fund was established to make loans available to students who plan to pursue a career in dental education and research. The fund was established by a gift of \$1,000 from Mrs. Aurelia Mazzini, who also provided funds for the erection of a flag pole. The flag was given by Mrs. Mildred Redford in memory of her husband.

FORMER GRID STAR CHRIS GARTNER, who established an I.U. field goal distance record of 52 yards and later played with the Cleveland Browns as a kicking specialist, is presently employed as a laboratory technician in the Department of Orthodontics. A native of Gothenburg, Sweden, Chris was recruited by former I.U. coach John Pont when he was a high school student in Princeton, N.J. Chris set the distance record in the 35-34 win over Kentucky in 1972. He says that players hit harder in college but in the pros there is more striving for perfection and refinement of technique. In college a place kicker may take 50 or more practice kicks a day, but the pros tend to limit it to 10 a day to save the kicker's leg. He says one of the main qualities a kicking specialist must have is the ability to withstand pressure. Chris has been a full-time employe at the Dental School since last February and intends to apply for admission to the School next year.
