Dr. Hendrie Named to HHS National Advisory Council on Aging

IU Center for Aging Research Scientist **Hugh C. Hendrie, MB, ChB, DSc**, has been named to the [National Advisory Council on Aging](#). His appointment came from Kathleen Sebelius, secretary of the US Department of Health and Human Services and extends through December 2013.

Dr. Hendrie, an internationally respected geriatric psychiatrist and health services researcher, has spent 40 years studying the psychiatric issues of aging, focusing on Alzheimer's disease and depression in older adults. He served for a quarter of a century as chairman of the IU School of Medicine Department of Psychiatry and is now professor emeritus.

"I am honored and thrilled to be named to the Council," states Dr. Hendrie.




The National Advisory Council on Aging advises the HHS secretary, assistant secretary for health, the director of the National Institutes of Health, and the director of National Institute on Aging in its mission to lead a broad scientific effort to understand the nature of aging and to extend the healthy, active years of life.

Dr. Hendrie spent more than 20 years conducting a large ongoing cross-cultural study of various

aspects of Alzheimer's disease in African-Americans in Indianapolis and Africans in Ibadan, Nigeria. During his distinguished career, he has written more than 400 peer reviewed articles, book chapters and abstracts.

The National Advisory Council meets three times a year to consider

applications for research and training and to recommend funding for those applications that show promise of making valuable contributions in the field of aging research. It also makes recommendations to the director of NIA regarding research conducted at the institute.

Dr. Nazir Leads Education Efforts with The Waters of Indiana

IU Geriatrics is partnering with The Waters of Indiana to provide their leadership with Indiana-specific educational resources for its Medical Directors. Indiana University Geriatrician **Arif Nazir, MD, CMD**, is leading the collaboration.

The Waters is an affiliated group of 23 skilled rehab centers and nursing homes located throughout Indiana. Dr. Nazir serves as Senior Vice President of Medical Education for the organization and will conduct activities consistent with their mission of providing their Medical Directors with the knowledge and tools to continue providing excellent care to their residents.

The Waters leadership envisions that this relationship will help create open dialogues across their facilities and provide direct access to the latest trends in geriatrics and skilled care while dealing with the

evolving complex regulations that guide the nursing and rehabilitation industry.

The new educational efforts began with a survey to ensure the medical directors' ideas and concerns are included in planning activities. Dr. Nazir will facilitate a spring icebreaker and a subsequent retreat with the directors and will learn about their clinical and administrative needs in face-to-face meetings.

Dr. Nazir has worked extensively in the nursing home environment. As a Certified Medical Director, the current president of the Indiana Medical Directors Association, and medical director of IU Geriatrics' Extended Care Program, he attests to the value of available resources to keep medical directors at par with recent advances in long-term care and regulations.



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


Greg Sachs, MD, is a co-editor and co-author of chapters in [Supportive Care for the Person with Dementia](#).
