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

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Stookey Receives Honorary Degree

IU Distinguished Professor Emeritus George Stookey addressed 216 IU dental school graduates during IU-PUI Commencement Exercises on May 11th. Before graduating students of the School of Dentistry crossed the stage one by one to accept their diplomas and take their place in the history of the Indiana University School of Dentistry, they listened to parting words from IU Distinguished Professor Emeritus **George K. Stookey**, one of the world's renowned leaders in the field of preventive dentistry. Long considered one of the IU School of Dentistry's living leg-



ends, George Stookey devoted his entire career as a scientist, academician, and administrator to Indiana University. He started his career in the mid-1950s as a young IU graduate in the lab of Joseph Muhler, whose research with IU chemistry professors Harry Day and William Nergall was on the verge of bringing world-wide acclaim to IU through development of the first successful stannous fluoride formula, which became the caries-preventing agent in Crest toothpaste. He quickly emerged as a pioneering dental researcher in his own right in such areas of study as fluoride and the early detection of dental caries, turning the IU School of Dentistry's Oral Health Research Institute

into a global leader in preventive dentistry research and product testing. His myriad roles at IU have also included service as the dental school's interim dean, executive associate dean, and associate dean for research. Holding three degrees from Indiana University including BA, 1957, MSD, 1962, PhD, 1971, Dr. Stookey received an honorary Doctor of Science degree from Indiana University this year. He was previously recognized in 1998 when IU awarded him the title of Distinguished Professor of Preventive and Community Dentistry. Dr. Stookey continues to contribute through his entrepreneurialism and research activities as President and CEO of Therametric Technologies.

AAL to Conduct Faculty Focus Groups

This April, Dr. Laura Romito, Department of Oral Biology, was inducted into FACET, Faculty Colloquium on Excellence in Teaching. FACET recognizes exceptional teachers who are dedicated to advancement of the craft of teaching through efforts in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning. Organizationally, FACET is a community of Indiana University faculty members who are committed to being and helping others to be outstanding teachers. Prospective FACET members are nominated by a fellow faculty member or administrator. Nominees must be full-time faculty members with a minimum of 4 years of service and be outstanding teachers with reflective and innovative teaching practice. Potential

inductees must submit an application with a dossier to the campus selection committee. If the candidate receives a recommendation from the campus committee and Executive Vice Chancellor, the materials are submitted to FACET's Statewide Selection Committee for review and possible selection. As one can determine, this is a highly selective and very competitive process. Another faculty member, Dr. Kelson Stewart, Department of Orthodontics and Oral Facial Genetics, has received a scholarship from the American Academy of Orthodontics with a matching scholarship from AAL to support attendance to the ADEA/AAL Institute for Teaching and Learning (ITL). This scholarship recognizes



Dr. Stewart's leadership potential and teaching excellence. The ITL programs will be held August 14th to 16th for Phase I and October 16th to 18th for Phase II, both in Atlanta at the Georgia Tech Hotel and Conference Center. The ADEA/AAL Institute for Teaching and Learning is a premier teacher training program for full and part-time dental and dental hygiene educators. Dr. Legan Presents Last Lecture

The *Last Lecture* is an opportunity to hear the reflections on life's lessons and meaning from a retiring faculty member. Dr. Joseph Legan, Department of Endodontics, delivered his *Last Lecture* to an overflowing, standing room only audience. Dr. Legan, Clinical Associate Professor of Endodontics and Director of Pre-doctoral Endodontics, shared his memories and reflections with students, staff and faculty alike. Dr. Legan received his DDS from Case Western Reserve University, Cleveland, Ohio and his Certificate in Endodontics and MS degree from the



United States Air Force, University of Texas, Houston, Texas. Dr. Legan is a Diplomate of the American Board of Endodontics and serves as a consultant to Riley Hospital for Children and the Richard L. Roudebush Veterans Administration Medical Center. Dr. Legan leaves behind a long legacy of teaching excellence as evidenced by his many teaching awards including the Teaching Excellence Recognition Award in 1997, 1999; Distinguished Faculty Award for Teaching in 2001; the IDA-IUSD Teacher of the Year Award in 2002; Trustees Teaching Award in 2002, 2003, 2006, 2007, 2010 and many other student-driven recognitions received throughout his academic career. Unlike most IUSD faculty, Dr. Legan started his academic career in his fifties after a stellar career in

the United States Air Force. During his presentation, Dr. Legan shared how the Air Force instilled organization, discipline, patience, flexibility, respect, a positive attitude and other attributes that have served him well in academia. Dr. Legan joined the IUSD faculty in 1990. From the inception of his directorship, he has continued to improve the coursework and student learning outcomes. Dr. Legan expressed that he has had his "dream job" for the last 25 years as a faculty member at IUSD. His goal has been to inspire and encourage students to do their best and reach their greatest potential. All in attendance believe he has done just that. Update on Evidence-based Dentistry

The Office of Faculty Affairs, several IUSD EBD Champions, and the EBD Task Force members participated in a joint conference call on April 8, 2014 with the ADA Center for Evidence-Based Dentistry. The purpose of the conference call was to begin discussions on the development of a customized EBD program for IUSD. The ADA EBD representatives included Dr. Julie Frantsve-Hawley, Senior Director of the EBD Center and Erica Vassilos, MPH, Senior Manager of EBD Education Programs. The conference call began

with introductions of the various parties present. Dr. Chris Guba, Chair of the IUSD EBD Task Force, provided an overview of IUSD EBD curricular activities followed by a trend summary from the outcomes of the faculty EBD surveys presented by David Zahl. EBD Champions gave their perspectives on the status of EBD at IUSD and their thoughts on how to effectively operationalize EBD in the clinical setting. An open conversation followed regarding program details, format and method of delivery, implementation

strategies, associated costs and potential dates. The broad outlines of a two-day program were generally agreed upon. The ADA sent a program proposal subsequent to the conference call. On May 13th, the EBD Task Force reconvened to review the ADA EBD proposal. Following discussion, adjustments were made to the program outline with the goal of providing objectives for each day of the program. A revised program outline will be returned to the ADA soon. OFAPD Faculty Vitality Survey

The Faculty Vitality Survey, distributed by the Indiana University School of Medicine (IUSM) Office of Faculty Affairs and Professional Development (OFAPD) is due on Monday, June 9th. What is faculty vitality? The concept of faculty vitality has been discussed in higher education literature since the mid-1980s. Despite multiple studies in the last 25 years using a variety of proxy indicators, the concept is still imprecise and lacks a predictive model. Given these gaps in the literature, IUSM OFAPD began to develop an expanded model of faculty vitality in academic medicine and investigate it through comprehensive surveys in 2006, 2009, and 2011. From OFAPD's perspective, faculty vitality is the synergy between high levels of satisfaction, productivity, and engagement that enables the faculty member to maximize professional success and achieve goals that align with institutional goals.

Who takes the Faculty Vitality Survey®? In 2011, over 2,000 faculty from nine schools of medicine, nursing, dentistry, and allied health participated in the survey, including, Indiana University School of Dentistry, Indiana University School of Health and Rehabilitation Sciences, Indiana University School of Medicine, Indiana University School of Nursing, Penn State University College of Medicine, University of Arkansas for Medical Sciences College of Medicine, University of Illinois at Chicago College of Medicine, University of Iowa College of Nursing, University of Kentucky College of Dentistry.

Where can the results of the Faculty Vitality Survey® be found? Results of the Faculty Vitality Survey® have been published in the [Journal of Faculty Development](#) and [Advances in Health Science Education](#). It has been presented at meetings of the American Association of Medical Colleges Group on Faculty Affairs, the Association for the Study of Higher Education and the Professional and Organizational Development Network in Higher

Education Conference. **What Types of Things Have Been Learned?** In 2011, nearly 40% of the IUSM faculty respondents strongly agreed that mentoring is highly important to academic vitality yet one in four of these faculty reported they do not have a mentor. In response to these findings, OFAPD convened a mentoring task force and developed two programs, the online Mentoring Portal and the Excellence in Faculty Mentoring Award. Thus, Faculty Vitality Survey® is not simply an isolated research project. It is an essential element of a systemic approach to faculty and organizational development that can be used by each institution for quality improvement. Results for the Vitality Survey provide rich data upon which change can be made. **How is the Faculty Vitality Survey® funded?** The survey is supported by a grant awarded to OFAPD, [President's Grant from the Josiah Macy Jr. Foundation](#). New Academic Calendar Begins Soon

Rationale behind this pivotal and strategic effort to better leverage strengths, resources, capacity and efficiency within the School, consists of establishing common start-up times to:

- increase planning and opportunity for off-site curriculum-
- focused activities for students,
- generate more breathing room for faculty and staff to accomplish scholarly activity,
- create more "down time" for faculty to prepare courses between semesters,
- foster more integration of curricular materials while reducing administrative functions associated with processing grades and managing transcripts, and to
- enhance earlier opportunities for integrating students into

the clinical setting and establishing Vertical Student Teams to facilitate learning, apply didactic knowledge to the clinical setting and integrate treatment planning.

The Academic Task Force Committee members include: Dr. Chris Guba, serving as Chair, Dr. William Babler, Dr. David Brown, Dr. Richard Jackson, Dr. Joan Kowolik, Dr. Geraldo Maupome, and Prof. Melinda Meadows. This effort would not have been possible without their leadership and the cooperation, constructive feedback from the IUSD faculty.
