NURSING SCHOOL, WALTHER INSTITUTE JOIN CANCER RESEARCH EFFORT

The School of Nursing and Walther Cancer Institute (WCI) have joined a partnership with five cancer care centers, including Riley Hospital for Children, to develop a program of cancer care research. New faculty member Roberta Smith is the first director of the program and is the school's first Mary Margaret Walther Professor of Nursing. The program is named for the late wife of Dr. Joseph E. Walther, WCI's founder. It combines basic and laboratory research, clinical medical research to develop innovative cancer treatments and cancer care research to find ways of helping patients and families cope with the disease. Besides Riley, other centers involved include Methodist Hospital, Community Hospitals of Indianapolis, St. Elizabeth's Hospital in Lafayette and Fox Chase Cancer Center in Philadelphia. — Sandy Matthys Roob

LITLY FELLOWSHIP ENABLES LITTLE TO STUDY AFRICAN-AMERICAN LIFE IN INDIANAPOLIS

A fro-American Studies director Monroe H. Little Jr. will be busy the next few months as he coordinates the publication of the first annual "The State of Black Indianapolis." The report, supported by one of 10 Lilly Endowment Faculty Open Fellowships, will take an in-depth look at issues affecting the lives of Afro-Americans in the Hoosier state capital. It is modeled after the national "The State of Black America" report delivered annually by the national Urban League, and the 1993 release of Little's information will be timed to coincide with the national effort. Little will be working with groups both on and off the campus in gathering information about such topics as housing, education, the relationship between blacks and the criminal justice system, the relationship between philanthropic groups and African Americans, the cultural status of blacks in the arts, African-American art and culture, health care and politics.
