[B. Whipple] Hi, I'm Beth Whipple, your guest host for the November 19th edition of IUPUI's The Spot. Empty your cabinets and clean out your pantries. Jam the Jaguars Bus Food Drive is here. You can take canned goods, bread, rice, or pasta to designated boxes throughout campus now through Tuesday, November 25th. The Spot spoke with Maggie McFarlin for more details.

[M. McFarlin] Jam the Jaguars Bus is an IUPUI annual event to support the local food pantries around Indianapolis. For the month of November we collect donations throughout campus and donate the goods to about 18 different pantries in Indianapolis.

Jamming the bus will be Tuesday, November 25, when we deliver all of our canned goods between 1 and 4pm to 18 different shelters around town. Some of the centers receiving donations are Julian Center, Hawthorne Community Center, Christamore House and various churches around town with food pantries.

Jam the Bus collects donations of canned food items like canned vegetables, non–perishable items like personal hygiene, toothpaste, and diapers. You can also make checks payable to any of our donation sites. For more information check our web site: iupui.edu/jamthebus.

[Narrator] I am not an expert. Ok. I was raised in a household where my father was Irish, my mother was Indian, and in those two traditions I've heard stories.

While everybody was out playing, I was listening to the older people tell stories, because that's what they used to do. We don't do it anymore. Nobody sits around and tells stories anymore. And so, as an art form, it is dying. It is dying.
