





### IUPUI Enrollment Distribution of Sex within Ethnicity/Race - Fall 2010










#### Distribution of Residency Status within Degree Level



■ Resident ■ Non-Resident




## Graduation Rates of Bachelor's Seeking Students Receiving Bachelor's Degrees IUPUI






IUPUI Full-Time Beginner Retention Rates to Second Semester & Year Fall 2002 through Fall 2009

Fall 2002 through Fall 2009














### Average Age and Age Distribution IUPUI - Fall 2010


