Prerequisites: None

Description: This course will examine the ideas and values that have shaped the collective identity of the United States from colonial days to the present. We will study historical documents in order to better understand contemporary American attitudes and beliefs. We will also explore how people from different backgrounds have fashioned their own personal identities by deciding for themselves what it means to be an American. About half of the course will be devoted to the experiences of immigrants and the complex process of becoming an American.
